JOHANNESBURG, South Africa, March 28 (UPI)—Native Negro workers stayed away from work today in mourning for their dead of last week's race riots. Public services and manufacturing were disrupted and hospitals were crippled. Heavily armed police stood guard in native townships throughout the union and only one outbreak of violence was reported today. In Port Elizabeth one man was killed and several were injured in a clash between Negro railway workers and Negro hoodlums.

FAVORITE SONS

In presidential politics the idea of the favorite son was originally a simple and innocent one. It was a way of giving a brief moment of national glory to some relatively unheralded state hero.
 In 1952, the idea was raised in the convention hall, and his name bandied about for a ballot or two, that goal could be accomplished. Certainly no harm was done.
 It was an instance of prolonged convention deliberations and party deadlock, such a man might even be turned to as a compromise prospect for the nomination.
 But today the favorite son idea is no longer what it was. In an atmosphere of...
 It does not serve to advance legitimately the cause of an unsung hero. It is resigned to give state party leaders a tight grip on their convention delegates, for bargaining purposes. The device is to ward off aspirant national candidates who would like to win and a state's delegates. In practice most presidential candidates have learned to go behind the clouds of the quest. But often they do so at their peril.
 Those who use the favorite son technique like to suggest that going behind it represents a kind of sneaking. In fact it is merely a way of loosening a leader's tight grasp of his delegation.
 Probably it would be a good thing for presidential politics if the favorite son idea is now used would fall into disrepute. Many people are getting the notion that it is just a way of thwarting proper consideration of the real candidates.
 In 1960 the worst distortion of this idea has been seen in Oregon.
 The entry by petition of Oregon's Sen. Wayne Morse could entirely defeat the purpose of that state's primary.
 The Oregon primary law was specifically altered in recent years to give the widest possible choice among the legitimate candidates for president. A so-called favorite son has no place in the election at all.
 Let those states with genuine favorite sons continue to put them forward. Let others stop using the device as a "no trespass" sign to bar the path of the real presidential aspirants.
