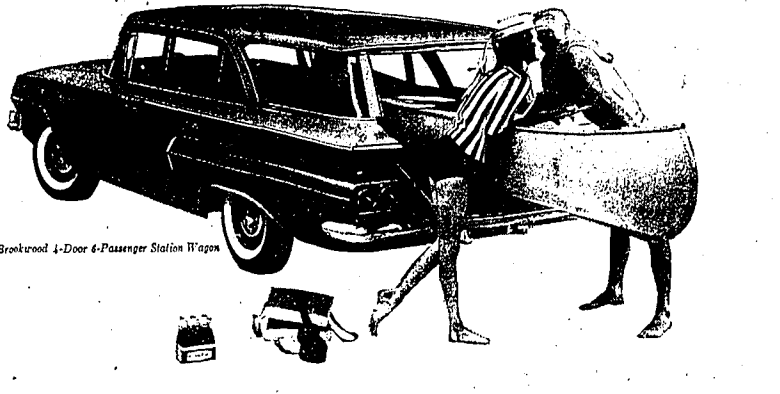

### Group Backs Castro, Slaps At U. S. Press

NEW YORK, April 6 (AP) — A newly-formed fair play for Cuba committee charged today that a powerful section of the U. S. press is distorting news from Cuba to attack the regime of Premier Fidel Castro.

In a large advertisement in the New York Times, the group offered to send "the truth about revolutionary Cuba" to anyone who writes asking information.

The committee is headed by Author Walter Frank. Sponsors of the ad included Truman Capote, Simone de Beauvoir, Norman Mailer, Kenneth Tynan and Jean Paul Sartre, the committee said.

The ad challenged statements it quoted from a syndicated columnist (George Sokolsky) and two news magazines (U. S. News and World Report and Newsweek) that Cuba's government is pro-communist, that Castro is "treasoning" American property, and that a reign of terror will begin against Castro's opponents as soon as he sits the word.

"Cuba's Communist party is a tiny minority, with about 16,000 members," the ad said. It said Cuba's recent trade pact with Russia represented an effort to open new markets for Cuban sugar and to obtain agricultural implements, not arms.

"Only those who equate communism with all forces that threaten the status quo of property interests will find the Cuban revolution 'communist,'" it said.

WASHINGTON, April 6 (AP) — Daylight savings time begins again April 24 — bringing with it some confusion over transportation schedules, protests from farmers and approval from lovers of the outdoors.

Many communities in 27 states will set their clocks an hour ahead to get an extra hour of sunlight during the summer months. Daylight saving time starts officially at 12:01 a.m. Sunday, April 24.

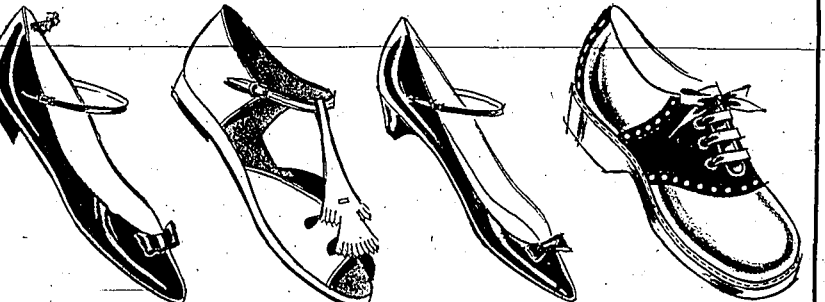

HST is the big gun behind the candidacy of Sen. Stuart Symington, D. Mo. Mrs. C. is on record several times in Wisconsin. She is not to be president. Her boy probably is John E. Stevenson, or, even, Humphrey.

Kennedy Moves Grows  
It is hard to see how Kennedy picked up powerful momentum in Wisconsin. He is the front runner now on better evidence than mere polls or the judgment of political observers. Mr. Sam, HST and Mrs. C. face the question: What happens if Kennedy is not stopped?

What happens? This happens: Kennedy will go on to the White House. So the old pros must gang up now and stop him if there is to be a chance for the rest of the country. Symington, Johnson or Stevenson. They will try and that should make it a wonderfully round and tough pre-convention season.

### Trailer Home Parking Gets More Protests

### Board Okays Addition for T. F. Library

Members of the Twin Falls public library board met Monday afternoon to discuss reports on library activities in study reports for library expansion and to pass approval on the employment of two additional assistants.

Arlene L. DeVolder, city librarian, announced lighting fixtures had arrived and should be installed this month. He also reported painting bids will be requested upon completion of lighting installation.

The board approved the employment of Mrs. Karoline Thomas, called "Katie," as library assistant in the circulation department and Nancy McFarlane, Twin Falls, as general library assistant. They will be assigned to duty April 12.

The board also approved the purchase of new equipment for the library including legal size filing cabinets for the adult and young adult departments, a catalog case for the adult department and additional display cabinets and book supports for the catalog department.

Attendance at the Idaho state library association was approved for Mr. and Mrs. DeVolder, who will appear on the program. Librarians and trustees throughout the state are expected to attend the meeting at McCall April 28, 29 and 30.

DeVolder announced sale of surplus materials including old folding chairs and shelving brought an income to the library of \$21.60. It was reported that 63 new books were purchased, including 49 adult, three juvenile and 12 young adult titles, and 65 new titles were added by donation, with 55 adult and 10 young adult books worn out and withdrawn totaling 247, and books and magazines repaired in the library were 123.

Books issued during the month totaled 11,022 of which 2,775 were adult fiction, 1,232 non-fiction, 216 magazines and 70 pamphlets. The juvenile fiction totaled 3,538 fiction, 922 non-fiction, 26 pamphlets and 11 magazines, while the young adult department circulated 646 youth fiction, 269 non-fiction, 123 magazines and six pamphlets.

In the photograph department 33 new adult records were added, while four adult and seven juvenile titles were withdrawn. Photograph records circulated were 85 adult and 200 juvenile.

New readers registered were 162 adult and young adult and 129 juvenile. Of the readers withdrawn 84 were adult cards and 22 juvenile, for a total of 116.

The library was open 27 days for the loaning of books with an average daily circulation of 408. The largest daily circulation totaled 606 with the smallest being 293. Non-fiction circulated was 37 per cent.

Overdue notifications totaled 420 for the month with notices being sent to adult, 101 to juveniles and 81 to young adults. Income for the month included \$3,600 from the city appropriation; \$207.27 from fines on overdue books, \$51 from the postoffice and \$99.89 from out-of-town registration.

The 21st hour attendance for the month totaled 16, while the library orientation of 20 classes from Harrison school totaled 389 students. For each of the classes, a book talk and library instruction was given. Parents and teachers accompanied the classes.

A tentative budget was submitted to the library board by the librarians. It will be studied and final reading of the items involved will take place at the board meeting May 4. The overall budget reflects a general 10 per cent increase in operational cost over the preceding year.

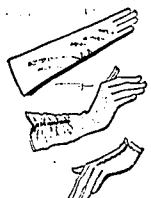

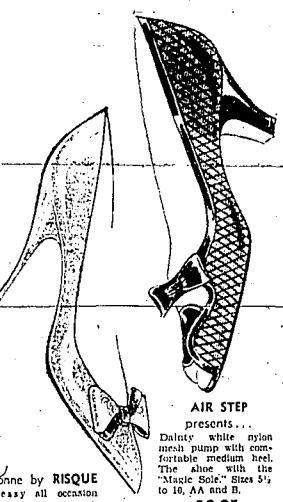

### Fatty Meals Said Cause For Strokes

SAN FRANCISCO, April 6 (AP)—The American College of Physicians has been given evidence that meals heavy with animal fat can cause strokes and heart attacks.

Most doctors have long believed fats contribute to such attacks by hardening or plugging arteries over long periods.

But the college's annual meeting was told yesterday that eating of large quantities of fat might be a direct and almost immediate cause.

Dr. Roy L. Swank, University of Oregon neurologist, said he reached this conclusion from experiments with hamsters and other laboratory animals.

When the animals were forced with much cream, he said, their red blood cells became sticky and clumped together. As a result, circulation was slowed. Moreover, Swank reasoned that oxygen levels in the cells would drop.

He said he found some confirmation for this belief in tests of brain tissue in which oxygen content is comparatively easy to measure.

Oxygen shortage, Swank said, it can be surmised that similar shortages of oxygen would occur in the heart and other cells, he said.

Dr. Swank speculated, therefore, that a person whose arteries are already stiff and clogged might be pushed over the brink by a fat heavy meal, which would cause the heart attack or stroke.
