Cancer Linked With Smoking in Lawsuit

PITTSBURGH, April 7 (UPI)—A cancer specialist filed suit in a St. Louis court Tuesday against the cigarette firm today that virtually every patient he treated for cell-type cancer had a history of heavy smoking. Dr. David Kremer, who seven years ago treated the plaintiff in the case, Otto Pritchard, and he attended between 15 and 20 patients a year who had contracted what is termed epidemic testis. He added that his patients admitted smoking a pack or more of cigarettes a day. Kremer's precedent-setting testimony under oath came as attorneys for Pritchard, a 61-year-old cabinet maker, attempted to prove the plaintiff contracted cancer after smoking one of the (Liggett and Myers) tobacco company's brands (Chesterfield) for more than 25 years. The attorney James P. McCordie, representing the plaintiff, planned to call at least two other physicians to testify as to the possible link between heavy smoking and lung cancer.

Report Says Some Cancer Is Inherited

CLEVELAND, O., April 7 (AP)—Some forms of cancer are inherited, according to a report released Tuesday by the American Cancer Society. The report, based on research by Dr. Madge T. MacKinnon, formerly of the Ohio state health center, described the genetic factors in some of the most common forms of cancer. MacKinnon's work indicated that close female relatives of women with breast cancer are more likely to develop the disease. The report also indicated that the risk of breast cancer is two to three times greater for women in the general population whose susceptibility to cancer is transmitted by the patient's father's genes, as judged by the frequency of breast cancer among the paternal grandmothers and aunts of patients, as well as the mother.

French Chief Urges World Disarmament

LONDON, April 7 (AP)—President Charles de Gaulle told the combined houses of British parliament today France would be "happily" to accept a world nuclear disarmament as the other world powers destroy their nuclear weapons. "Peace can only be attained if the great fear of nuclear annihilation is first removed," the visiting French leader told a rare joint session of the British House of Commons and United Nations assembly on Tuesday. A fanfare of trumpets greeted de Gaulle as he strode into the assembly hall flanked by two aides. The French leader's visit to London is the first since he was elected in 1959. Blast at GOP Aged Policies Called Insane

WASHINGTON, April 7 (AP)—"Sinking...insane...insane." In those terms, senate Republican Leader Everett M. Dirksen, Illinois, blasted yesterday at a union committee's charge that the Eisenhower administration shamefully surrendered to medical and insurance interests and betrayed the health needs of the aged.

"The AHA-CIO James B. Carey flared back at Dirksen. 'I know of your lack of concern with the problems of the aged in this connection.'"

"As the raw wared latter before a senate subcommittee, Sen. Joseph S. Clark, D. Pa., came to Carey's defense and deplored Dirksen's conduct as 'unfounded and uncalled for.'"

"The GOP leader—who had hauled the exploit 'attending' at another labor official's testimony last Monday—stopped from the hearing room."

A bystander to all this was Secretary of Welfare Arthur S. Flemming, who testified he expected within two weeks to begin fashioning a specific proposal for a program of government-subsidized medical care for the aged.

In general, this would be a voluntary plan based on privately written medical insurance, with federal-state subsidies earmarked to help retired persons to meet the cost of their policies.

Pressed closely by Democratic members of the subcommittee studying problems of the elderly, Flemming acknowledged that in its more than seven years, the Eisenhower administration never had come up with a specific recommendation in this field.

He told Clark he was unable to say for certain whether he could get a health care program to congress before it adjourns, probably in early July.

African Whites Suppressing Nonwhites Needed for Labor

By JAMES MARLOW
WASHINGTON, April 7 (U)—The whites of South Africa want it both ways.

1. They suppress the nonwhites, who outnumber them at least three to one, by rigid segregation and other indignities.

2. But they depend so much on the cheap, nonwhite labor that they beat, shoot, whip or jail those

who stay away from work or encourage others to do so.

Thus the pot under which the Afrikaners started a fire is boiling. The Afrikaners are the white descendants of the early Dutch settlers. The fire began in 1948, in that year the Afrikaners' Nationalist party came to power and has remained in control of the government since.

More recently the Nationalist government of Prime Minister Hendrik P. Verwoerd required Negroes to carry passes which they would have to produce on demand if they wished to move around.

Essentially two Negro organizations began to stir in protest—the Pan Africanist congress and the African National congress.

Last month the former called on Negroes to demonstrate against the pass system by going without passes and letting themselves be arrested and thus, by being in jail, damage the whites' economy.

The first arrestation of Negroes came last week when between 10 and 20 of them were shot, and perhaps 200 wounded, by police while demonstrating outside a jail at Sharpeville where many Negroes were locked up for not having passes.

That word—Sharpeville—will probably become famous or infamous in African history.

Then the two Negro organizations, as a protest against the massacre, urged Negroes to stay away from their jobs. The South African economy, already hurt by the anti-pass demonstrations, was now truly crippled.

The white Nationalist government, armed with all the power it needed through special laws for handling emergencies, hit back by jailing several hundred Negro leaders and, reportedly, whites who were sympathetic to them.

White many Negroes finally returned to their jobs, many didn't. Police moved in with guns, clubs

and whips to smash those who still stayed home and away from work or encouraged others to stay away.

In this moment of crisis the South African white opposition party in the government joined up with Verwoerd's white Afrikaners by voting with them for swift action to outlaw the two Negro organizations.

The United Nations security council passed a resolution last Friday calling on the South African government to abandon its segregation policy. The United States was among the nations which voted for it.

But yesterday the South African government said it is reviving the hated passes for nonwhites.

But segregation of Negroes in this country is a sensitive problem when this government deals with other countries, particularly non-white ones.

South Africa's foreign minister promptly reacted to the security council vote by calling it hypocrisy.

He said: "One marvels at the blatant hypocrisy of the many countries that lodge complaints against South Africa."
