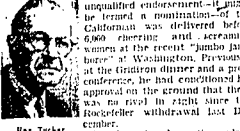

Texas Crash Fatal to 7 of 8 Passengers

LUBBOCK, Tex., April 11 (AP)—Seven fatal accidents of two cars died last night in the worst Texas highway accident of the year at an intersection five miles south of here.

The eighth — 6-year-old Carl Robert Milliken — underwent brain surgery later and was in critical condition at Methodist hospital.

One of the demolished cars was driven by 18-year-old Walter Taylor, Wolfforth, Tex. He and the driver of the other car, David Dent Tucker, 27, Lubbock, were listed among the dead.

The other victims were Tucker's wife, Shirley, 22, and sons, Darrell, 4; John Clinton Milliken, 2; Slaton, Tex., and Mr. and Mrs. J. C. Milliken, 43 and 48, Slaton.

The Millikens were riding in the car driven by Taylor. The Tucker family was in the other car. M. K. Woerner of the Texas department of public safety said the accident was the worst of the year in the state. Other officials said there was a yield-right-of-way warning sign on the road on which Tucker was driving.

When the cars collided, they tumbled into a utility pole and caught it off near the southeast. The vehicles ended up as battered wreckage in a ditch.
