He Didn't Pay Taxes in 1943, Refuses Again
MOUNT VERNON, Ia., April 15.—A Iowa resident who has refused to pay income tax since 1943, did it again today.

Walter Gumpert, a Mount Vernon engineer, said the internal revenue service in an "open letter" that he would not pay the 1943 tax because he was a "public officer" of the government.

The news was taken today, however, by the state tax collector who has managed to get 17 years of back taxes, his car and other debts owed him.

Gumpert charged the internal revenue service had "disregarded human welfare in collecting tax money for war purposes."

He said he has received letters from tax collectors that he "must obey" the law and pay his income tax.

"Yes, your tax men do not obey laws," Gumpert said.

"I am not a public officer," he said, "and I am not in the class of the bill of rights."

He said that he "picked out of the air a figure of \$4000" as his income "in a year in which I was ill for about five months" and had only worked at the end of the year.

### Mill Levy at Area School Is Approved

**RICHFIELD, April 15** — The proposed three-mill tax levy was approved after a hearing Tuesday afternoon. No protests were made to the school district tax levy which increased district taxes from 10 to 13 mills for the coming 1960-61 season.

Thirty mills are levied for maintenance and operation of the two schools; two mills, capital outlay and reserve fund; and two one-half mills, bonded interest and redemption fund. Total revenue for the district is \$298,674. Assessed valuation of the district is \$1,632,562.60.

The 1960-61 budget was approved at the April school board meeting which followed the hearing. Charles Shaw, school district assessor, discussed the school-grantee contract and the financial area with the board members.

May 10 was set for election of two from zones one and two and four. A two-year vacancy exists in zone two to fill the unexpired term of Thomas Vandenberg, district clerk who moved from the zone.

A trustee will be elected in zone four for a three-year term. Clifford Carter is presently serving as trustee there by appointment in March.

Max Hiler, board chairman, is trustee from zone four and has served on the board the past two years. Holdover members of the board are Mrs. Thelma Hansen, zone one; L. T. Sanderson, zone three; and Jack Taylor, zone three.

The resignation of Harry Holt as bus driver was accepted and Lester McClintock, extra bus driver, hired to replace Holt.

One application was received for superintendent. Gary Yoncosky in the teaching staff will be announced this month.

### Ideas Differ On Nike-Zeus Effectiveness

**WASHINGTON, April 15** — The many still says its Nike-Zeus missile could protect the United States against intercontinental attack. But the defense department said the missile is not.

The long debate over the Nike-Zeus, which is being developed, would combine radar to spot an enemy intercontinental missile and a killer weapon to engage it with a nuclear blast high in the air.

Lt. Gen. Arthur G. Trudeau, the army's chief of research, told the subcommittee he is confident the Zeus "can and will be successfully developed to meet and master the ballistic missile threat of the Soviet Union."

But Herbert F. York, research director for the defense department, which has the last word, told the same group "I think follow studies are a more effective way of saving lives in a ballistic missile attack than Zeus."

Two testifies at different hearings. Told of York's expressed opinion, Trudeau said it would be "completely wrong" to consider shunting the only answer.

"You need a passive defense in this country and you need an active defense," Trudeau said. "Nike-Zeus is the only thing that has got a chance of doing it before 1970."

### Kennedy Support Denied by Brown

**SACRAMENTO, Calif., April 15** — Gov. Edmund G. Brown yesterday declared "unwisely and unwise" reports that he has decided to support Sen. John F. Kennedy, D., Mass., for the Democratic presidential nomination.

"I have not committed myself in Sen. Kennedy in any way whatsoever, or to anyone else," the California governor said.

The New York Herald Tribune in a dispatch from Washington said Earl Mazo said Brown telephoned Kennedy two days after the Wisconsin primary and said he would support him for the nomination.

The Herald Tribune said Mazo reported that despite Brown's denial that he had done so, Mazo had confirmed his story beyond any question of a doubt.

### Anger and Blood Pressure Linked

**CHICAGO, April 15** — When mad, the thing to do is lower your blood pressure. It may keep down your blood pressure.

A study reported in an American Medical Association Journal indicated that people who inhibit anger will have higher blood pressure than those who freely express it.

Dr. Donald Olsen, a clinical psychologist, disclosed the findings in the current issue of the AMA's journal of general psychiatry.

Olsen said his study of 10 psychiatric patients showed a definite link-up between repressed anger and high blood pressure.

"Hypertension (high blood pressure) may be the result of chronically inhibited angry feelings," he said.

However, Olsen emphasized that his findings were far from proof that anger and high blood pressure are linked but they do underline the importance of anger and the need for further study.

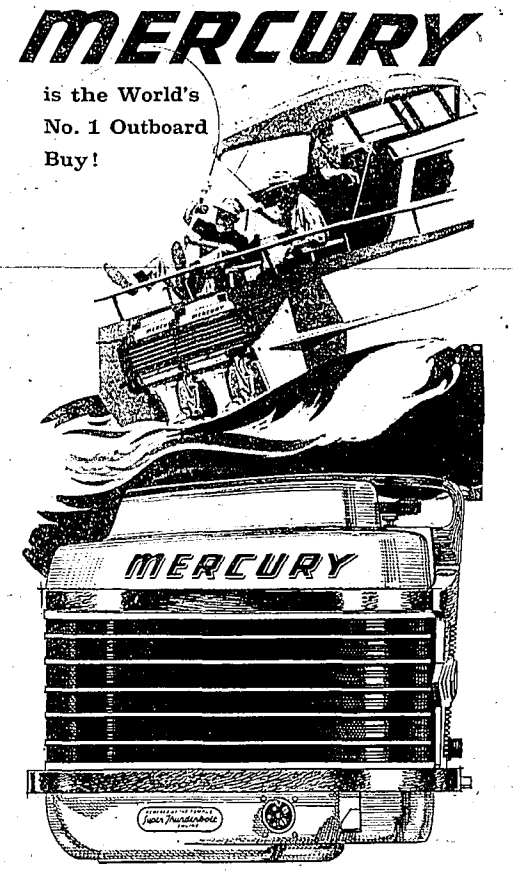

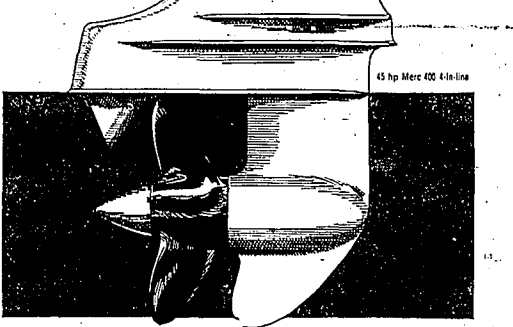

### U. S. Agency Tangles With Orange Field

WASHINGTON, April 15 (AP)—The food and drug administration (FDA) which in the past year has floundered in enacting legislation to control orange juice, is in the midst of a cold war with the frozen orange juice industry.

The bulk of the new legislation is that:

**U. S. Plan Unsettled**

Some of the nation's largest producers of frozen orange juice concentrate are holding a conference from which would force them to specify on their labels whether their product contains a water extract of orange pulp.

The processing companies insist that use of water extract instead of pulp extracted from oranges is a higher-quality orange juice concentrate than an older process for producing orange juice. They contend that mandatory mention of the water extract on labels will give consumers the misleading impression they are getting a lower-quality product.

The dispute arose after the FDA published March 1 a list of standards for several orange juice products including frozen concentrate.

**Order Frozen**

The FDA standards identify products that a water extract made from orange "pulp" may be added to the juice before concentration but, the FDA ruled "the label shall bear the statement prominently in part that water extract of orange pulp."

The standards are not now in effect. The March standards provided that the standards would take effect in 90 days unless objected to. Several objections have been filed, the food and drug administration is expected to hold public hearings before deciding whether to put the standards into effect.

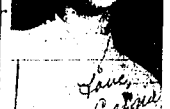

### Chamber of Commerce Drive Next Week Eyes Goal of 100 New Members in T. F.

Twin Falls Chamber of Commerce will start its annual membership drive Monday to coincide with the national Chamber of Commerce week to run from April 17 through 22. According to William Grange, secretary-manager of the chamber, the organization hopes to raise its membership by 100 new members during the drive. At present there are approximately 40 members.

Drive structure for the chamber ranges from \$36 to \$500, depending upon the type of organization. Four teams have been assigned to compete against each other in the drive.

Money raised by the chamber from drive is used to promote the welfare of the community. Grange says that the chamber has been in existence since 1909, the local group spent \$15,579.50 for this purpose.

### Promoting of Drugs Boosts Prices Higher

WASHINGTON, April 15—A drug manufacturer's advertisement promoting their wares boasts the price of medicines 10 per cent lower.

Dr. Hovey, a physician who teaches at University of Utah, testified before the state anti-trust and monopoly committee. It is investigating drug manufacturers' advertising programs.

Dr. Hovey testified that the drug manufacturers' advertising programs don't save the doctor. He said they tend to know about a medicine. He stated that they seek to control information about new drug preparation.

He stated that a great deal of the promotional operation is abandoned.

Dr. Hovey stated, however, that he gets through the mind a volume of medicine, free samples and sales material from the manufacturers which represents a "fontaine" from which millions of dollars are estimated would receive the same.

It would take two railroad mail cars, 110 large mail trucks, and 800 postmen to deliver the monthly load of drug brochures and samples to doctors if mailed to one single doctor.

### Weed Bureau Aides Speak To Grangers

Harold Lancaster and Warren Lowery, of the Twin Falls county weed bureau, were featured speakers at the Twin Falls county Pomona Grange meeting at the Knoll Grange hall.

Lancaster spoke on the duties of the newly formed advisory board, pointing out they meet once a month at the courthouse. He stated all farmers using weed sprays should read directions before mixing and cautioned people about mixing chemicals in packages which have been broken.

He also spoke on the ragweed, mentioned in Oregon and the difficulty of trying to get rid of this type weed.

Lowery spoke on improvements made last year on equipment used in weed spraying. He pointed out 15 per cent more seeds were sprayed in the past year and that aerial is the best chemical if properly used. He urged farmers to spray their wheat while it is still in "boot" stage.

He urged farmers to contact the weed bureau on any problems they confront concerning the spray.

T. Creed, a member of the Idaho-Historical society, asked members to aid the society in finding anything of historical value such as pictures or documents. He pointed out that the society will have building available in town at the fair grounds this year, but it would be up to the society to finance the structure and erecting the building.

Following his talk it was decided the Grange will contribute to the Historical society for this cleanup project.
