## Barlow, Walters Trading Insults Over Land Sales

BOISE, April 28 (AP)—State Land Commissioner John G. Walters, the Democratic state chairman, and Republican State Sen. C. Barlow, Burley, exchanged insults yesterday over the sale of state land. Tuesday Barlow said the Democratic-controlled state land board was acting in "blindness" by selling mountain meadow grazing land. Yesterday Walters said that Barlow's criticism was "like the pot calling the kettle black." He said Barlow was "doing the same thing that he is condemning others for doing—plowing up the land!" He said Barlow was exploiting state land for his own profit. At his home in Burley Barlow told Walters that Walters was noted for half-truths. Walters said Barlow purchased 2500 acres of state-owned land in 1957. He said Barlow also has 2500 acres of state-owned land leased at four cents an acre. Barlow replied that he had never in his life "entered into a direct lease or direct purchase of land from the state of Idaho."

## Bookie Joints Are Invaded In 50 Cities

WASHINGTON, April 28 (AP)—With a single stroke, 112 federal agents invaded bookie joints and numbers rooms in nearly 50 cities across the country yesterday. Mopping up today, they counted 120 separate locations, and seized 100,000 dollars in cash and 50 other items. The 7-men, after weeks and months of careful investigation, sprang their traps at more than 100 separate locations—hacquerons of candy stores, taverns, private suburban homes, hotels, rooming houses and other places where bookies operate the net.

Seven men jumped into the water and pulled out the freed Robert. He was hospitalized later with a broken shoulder.

## Korean Vice President, His Wife and Two Sons Found Dead in Suicide

SEOUL, South Korea, April 28 (AP)—The Seoul martial law command announced today that Vice President-elect Lee Ki-poong and his wife and two sons committed suicide in a building on the grounds of the presidential mansion about 5:30 a.m. today. The family had disappeared from public view this week at the height of the bloody uprising against the now-fallen government of Syngman Rhee. Home Minister Lee Ho was quoted by a Korean news source as saying: "Lee's sons, who are in the adopted son of Rhee, shot and killed his father, his mother, and a younger brother, and then turned the gun on himself. Lee Ki-poong, controversial and disavowed vice president-elect, was a chief target of antigovernment demonstrations that brought the downfall of the Rhee government."

BOISE, April 28 (AP)—An assistant state land commissioner today said he was sure of what he is talking about in a speech before the Idaho legislature. He said Smylie recently told an Oroville resident that \$1,500 was available for a springer system for a tract on the Oroville park near Oroville on the Clearwater river. ## Turkey Is Under Martial Law for Student Rioting

ISTANBUL, Turkey, April 28 (AP)—The government proclaimed martial law today following an outbreak of student rioting against Premier Adnan Menderes. At least 400 persons were reported killed as thousands of students broke through police lines and snarled through the city demanding Menderes' resignation. The demonstrations were sparked when the Menderes government ordered a three-month ban on all political activities. The rioting spread through the university and headed for the center of the city. Forty students and 100 citizens were injured in three fights. Witnesses said they saw three students and one policeman killed in the crush in front of the university. Police said they could not confirm these reports. In view of the dangerous situation Menderes earlier had called for a flight to Iran to attend a meeting of the Central Treaty Organization.

## Rhee Quits Korea Government Mansion; Crowds Cheer Wildly

SEOUL, April 28 (AP)—Ex-President Syngman Rhee left South Korea's "white house" today for what may be the last time and rode through wildy cheering crowds to his own home to begin life as a private citizen. The 62-year-old Korean leader announced that he would walk the two-mile distance to disprove foreign press reports that he dared not venture into the streets but rode with his wife in a black limousine. The car was surrounded almost to a walking pace by the dense crowd that lined the route, cheering, crying or waving banners bearing such slogans as "We love you, president!" In the words of U.S. Ambassador Walter P. Connehy, Rhee left the kyung mu-dae presidential mansion "as a great man should."

## New Dyna Soar Space Craft Won't Leave Time for Cigar

WASHINGTON, April 28 (AP)—Even on long trips in the air force's Dyna Soar spaceplane, there won't be time to light a good cigar. Including landing operations, the projected flight could travel from Los Angeles to New York in about 20 minutes, or from New York to Moscow in a little more than a half an hour. If the ship decided to pass up a stop, or was unable to get up an airport, the pilot could orbit twice around the world and still land during the same forenoon. The Dyna Soar is a rocket-boosted glider capable of gliding back to Earth. In orbit, its speed will be the speed of sound, or about 1,000 miles an hour, and the average speed may be out to 8,000 miles an hour. The glide will be the principal flying factor. On a trip from Los Angeles to New York, the ship would be letting down most of the way. The air force said the Dyna Soar would have more maneuverability than any other projected spaceplane. ### Probers Dig Up Story of Record Deal

WASHINGTON, April 28 (AP)—House payola investigators are probing a story of TV disc jockey Dick Clark getting \$31,575 for advising a Philadelphia record firm on what tunes would sell well.

Furthermore, it was testified that Clark was allowed to buy a one-fourth interest in the firm for \$125—an interest he was able to sell last year for about \$15,000.

Investigators figured his profit was 11,500 per cent.

The testimony came from Harry Finfer, manager of Universal Record Distributing company, and part owner of the Jamie Record company, a manufacturing firm, of Philadelphia.

Clark in Testify  
Finfer was before the house legislative oversight subcommittee in its inquiry into payola, the passing of secret payments to get certain records plugged on TV and radio shows.

Clark, who conducts the "American Bandstand" show for the American Broadcasting company from station WFFB in Philadelphia, is scheduled to testify tomorrow.

Finfer said Clark was allowed to buy into Jamie in 1957 so the firm could have the benefit of his professional advice on records.

A year later, he said, the firm put Clark on the payroll at \$500 a week "just to listen to records and advise us." Clark later got a pay raise from Jamie, Finfer testified.

Ray Fleured  
The subcommittee, putting together the salary items and Clark's share of company profits over two years, figured he had been paid \$31,575 from Universal.

After hearing Finfer's testimony, Rep. John E. Moss, D., Calif., announced he will ask the justice department and federal tax agents to look into the affairs of the Jamie company.

Counsel Robert W. Lichman of the committee submitted records purporting to show that Finfer's Universal firm dispersed \$35,000 to various disc jockeys and other station personnel in eastern Pennsylvania.

### Moroccans to Die for Deeds

RABAT, Morocco, April 28 (AP)—Five Moroccan merchants had their names mentioned to death for making and selling adulterated cooking oil that paralyzed 10,832 persons.

The sentences were handed down by the high court after 5 1/2 hours of deliberation.

The action brought to an end one of this country's most sensational trials.

The prosecution Monday had asked the death penalty for five of 24 merchants charged with selling adulterated oil.

The prosecutor, Moulay Ali Athman, declared the five wholesale merchants "sold their souls for money" by mixing U. S. air force jet engine cleaning oil, which they knew to be poisonous, with cooking oil in order to increase profits.

### Nike Zeus Fired From New Site

WASHINGTON, April 28 (AP)—An army Nike Zeus antimissile missile test model was fired today from an underground launching site at the White Sands missile range, New Mexico.

An army announcement said this was the first disclosure that the Nike Zeus, intended to destroy enemy intercontinental ballistic missiles in flight, might be launched from protected underground positions when it is ready for operational use.

### Writer Tells Why Cost of Living Jumps

By SAM DAWSON  
 NEW YORK, April 28 (AP)—One of the best ways to keep the cost of living from jumping is to keep the cost of living from jumping. The cost of living is rising and probably will keep on going up all summer.

This comes at a time that average take-home pay for the nation's factory workers is falling.

It is a curious situation, explains one economist, because the cost of living is rising because of higher prices, but that higher competition and some competition from passing along all and sometimes not even part, of this cost to higher prices.

Profit Margins Squeezed

Higher profit margins are being squeezed out and this year's earnings are over last year's will be similar to the year's gain increase over the previous period.

The stock market already had advanced and prospect and adjusted prices accordingly.

There are explanations for this cost-of-living rise in the cost of raw materials and manufacturers say they can't raise their prices as desired. If the houses of the same budget judge they have the patience for the explanations, here they are:

**Food Prices Blamed**

The cost of living is rising chiefly because food prices are going up in the spring. Since this is the biggest single item in most budgets, the rise has been particularly felt by those factory workers whose work-week has been shortened, or who have had to bid off for short or long periods while output is being limited by line with sales.

Prices on the new spring line of clothing tend a bit higher than predicted — because some scale had been adjusted upward.

Prices on new houses and furnishings strengthened, partly because of higher interest rates for mortgages, partly because of higher material and labor costs.

**Medical Care Cost Up More**

Medical care just keeps on rising, following a long-term trend. And people find many of their favorite forms of recreation, such as such personal care-items as laundry, haircuts and beauty treatments.

These were predicted and the rise of the creeping rather than the galloping kind.

The latter didn't come along as once feared by many. That is why economists say that there is another big round of inflation has been laid.

The fear was based on the earlier expectations that the settlement of the steel labor dispute would off a big boost in prices. In such an atmosphere industry could more easily pass along its higher prices and lower operating costs.

**Business Doesn't Come**

Business was expected to build inventories at a brisk rate for a period, but in a counter-trend which would have favored prices of manufactured goods.

The boom didn't materialize. Inventories were rebuilt to regular levels but beyond. Competition became keener if anything.

And so the rise in the cost of food and services, but very little in industrial products. Stock market bulls have been disappointed but the money managers in Washington are breathing easier.

Now if only the family budget keeper could too.

Mrs. Franklin D. Roosevelt in an ivory gown of lace, sitting in the corner.

Next to her on one side was Dr. Leo Sillard, the man who shared the patent with the late Enrico Fermi for developing the first atomic nuclear chain reaction.

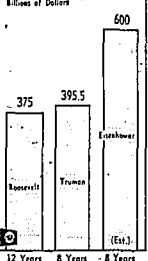
Sillard, who has cancer and had been told he has not long to live, was given special permission to leave a hospital to attend.

"If I should live, I would like to drop back into complete anonymity. This life 'in a goldfish bowl' is not pleasant."

Chessman was convicted in 1948 as the Los Angeles "red light bandit" who forced sexual abuses on two women victims.

He has steadfastly denied the charges. He has refused to "finger" or identify a man he says was the bandit, although all of his judicial appeals also exhausted.

### X-Ray Photo Is Taken of Sun by Navy

WASHINGTON, April 23 (AP)—Using "telescope camera" techniques in a space rocket, the navy has obtained the first picture of the sun by its own available X-ray light.

Dr. Herbert Friedman of the naval research laboratory reported the development today in a paper presented for the annual meeting of the Academy of Sciences.

**Problem Solved**  
X-rays from the sun help aid in understanding the earth and communications on the earth. And the new experiment, considerably aid help in the effort to control them, the report indicated.

Friedman said the picture of the sun was taken last week from a rocket soaring 130 miles above New Mexico. The experiment used a camera based on the photo tube method familiar to a lot of television amateur photographers.

**Method Explained**  
This is a method in which a pinhole is placed into one end of a shoebox to admit light. While a lens is placed at the other end of the box and covered with tissue paper to serve as a focusing piece. The tissue paper picture appears inverted and its size is proportional to the length of the box. The longer the pinhole, the sharper the image.

In the navy's rocket camera, Friedman said, the pinhole was only five thousandths of an inch in diameter and the camera was only six inches long. The X-ray light was blocked but X-rays from the sun got through.

### Man's Action To Net Loss Of U.S. Right

MILAMI, Fla., April 23 (AP)—Frank Piantini, an American born in Norfolk, Va., was stripped of his citizenship yesterday and ordered to leave the country for aiding former Minister Fidel Castro's Cuban rebels.

Piantini, a pilot, first became disenchanted with Castro and joined counterrevolutionary plotters.

Piantini's attorney, Arthur B. Spector, described as amazing the action announced by Edward P. Ahrens, district director of immigration and naturalization.

The question of legal liability in the use of school children, to patrol street crossings used by other youngsters going to and from schools was raised again this week in Pocatello.

Resigning School Superintendent Robert K. Marchel told the Pocatello school board he felt the responsibility for patrolling the crossings rested with law enforcement agencies—not the schools.

He suggested that the school patrols, abandoned in Pocatello last year, might be reinstated—but only if there were adult supervision at each crossing. Some cities, he said, employ retired police officers to do this and others obtain volunteers.

Pocatello Police Chief John Perkins, however, says school safety patrols are a school function and not one for the police.

He said it is up to the schools to organize them rather than law enforcement officers, although officers are glad to help in training when possible.

McCall said the legal aspects of the situation have been explored from the state level and that he
