Move by Rhee Has Approval

SEOUL, May 3 (UPI)—The Republic of Korea's national assembly today formally accepted President Syngman Rhee's resignation and continued its government clean-up under the threat of new violence by more than 10,000 student demonstrators.

The students demonstrated in three cities for an immediate dissolution of parliament. They looted and burned government buildings and no bloody clashes since last week that have resulted in the death of a troop and 130 students in a riot, but they were unable to disperse.

Student crowds in Pusan grew to more than 10,000. It was Pusan's third straight day of demonstrations. Another 500 demonstrated in Taegu.

Damages Are Sought Here

In Civil Case

A suit of \$115,000 is sought in a civil action filed in district court by Hubert Allen and Louise Allen, owners of the property, against Ann Hoffmaster, Fidelity National bank and Kaseberg Coal and Transfer company.

The complaint states that the Allens entered an agreement with the Hoffmasters for the purchase of real property for \$15,500 with \$1,500 to be paid at the time. It further claims the contract, acknowledging receipt of the \$1,500 and that the Allens agreed to the terms of the contract, including placement of \$152 in escrow which was accepted by the bank as escrow holder.

It further is alleged that prior to the escrow holder accepting the Hoffmasters delivered a notice to vacate the contract and on March 23 the Hoffmasters and the bank, acting as escrow holder, terminated the contract.

On April 6, 1950, the Allens state that their personal property was moved from the real property by the Hoffmasters and the transfer company and converted to their own use.

The Allens ask that the Hoffmasters be required to perform the agreement of sale or otherwise pay \$115,000 in damages. Damages in the sum of \$1,500 are sought from the Hoffmasters and the bank. They further ask that the Hoffmasters be required to return the personal property in the same condition as when taken and pay \$1,500 as damages, or pay \$7,500 if the property cannot be returned.

Tension Less As Methodists Change Rules

DENVER, May 3 (AP)—Northwest Methodists here today approved an amendment to the church's constitution. The amendment, approved last night by a vote of 723 to 57, makes several slight modifications in the denomination's jurisdictional system.

The jurisdictional system was revised 21 years ago when northern and southern branches of Methodism reunited after a century of division. It divides the denomination into six administrative jurisdictions, each with a large degree of autonomy in electing its own bishops and governing its affairs.

Five of the jurisdictions are based on geography and are composed predominantly of white churches. The sixth, called the central jurisdiction, is mission-oriented and is composed entirely of black churches.

The new constitutional amendment, which will require ratification by three-fourths of the churches, 119 annual conferences, does not affect the racial partitioning of the church for doctrinal or jurisdictional purposes of any of its present powers.

The main effects are (1) to permit the transfer of bishops across jurisdictional lines by mutual consent; and (2) to encourage the jurisdictions to hold their quadrennial meetings at the same time and place as the national general conference.

C. of C. Told Inflation Is Still Danger

WASHINGTON, May 3 (AP)—The United States Chamber of Commerce was told today that the threat of inflation is "as potent and dangerous as ever."

William A. McDonnell, St. Louis, board chairman of the chamber, urged that business leaders take a more active part in government to do something about it.

Despite the temporary relaxation of inflationary pressures the threat is still there," McDonnell said in an address prepared for the chamber's 49th annual meeting.

"Even a cold war cannot be won without sacrifice," he said. "We cannot win with shorter hours of work, with long, costly strikes, with price controls, leather-judging, unbalanced budgets, fiscal practices which discourage savings and stifle initiative and self-reliance."

He urged more direct action by businessmen.

Warm May Is Forecast for Area in West

WASHINGTON, May 3 (AP)—The weather bureau says the outlook for May calls for temperatures to average below seasonal normals over the eastern two-thirds of the nation.

This cooler weather will be in the upper Mississippi valley.

The bureau added:

"Above normal temperatures are predicted along the West coast and near normal in the remainder of the country."

"Rainfall is expected to be greater than normal in the northern part of the nation east of the continental divide, and also along the Gulf and south Atlantic coasts."

"Subnormal amounts are indicated in both the Southwest and Pacific Northwest. In areas not specified, near normal amounts are in prospect."

4 Union Leaders Support Kennedy

WASHINGTON, May 3 (AP)—Four union leaders have called Sen. John F. Kennedy, D. Mass., one of labor's staunchest friends and a proven friend of the railroad worker.
