Administration Unveils \$1.2 Billion Dollar Medical Care Program for Aged

WASHINGTON, May 4 (UPI)—The administration today unveiled a sweeping medical care program for the elderly. It called for \$1.2 billion dollars in federal-state subsidies to help most people over 65 cope with major illness. The long-range price placed on the program would make it the most costly new federal subsidy project recommended by the administration since President Eisenhower took office. It would cost more than \$1 billion to operate, 355 days of hospitalization, 355 days of home nursing care, up to \$550 worth of prescription drugs, and certain medical and dental services.

Pupils With Best Grades To Get Jobs

NOTE: May 4 is the "dumb" day for graduates with the best grade point average (GPA). It may not necessarily be the most about-campus, will come up with the best job offers in Idaho, this year.

As an engineer, business major or education major, he'll get the most offers among the members of his class. Still, the key is scholarship. The student who does a matter what field he has studied.

A United Press International survey shows the GPA probably is even more important than it was a year ago. From Harlow Campbell and H. M. Savage, placement directors at the University of Idaho and Idaho State colleges, the report was identical: Recruitment teams are becoming more selective.

"A degree no longer is an open sesame to industry," Savage said. "They're looking more carefully at applicants now than they used to be. Demand is high generally for persons with training in the technical fields—mathematics, engineering, the sciences, accounting, education and jobs with the government."

There are more different businesses on campus than ever before," said Savage. Campbell said graduates in the class of 1969 have "been contacted" by representatives from "just about every field."

What kind of salary can the 1969 graduates expect? "Better than it was in 1965," he said. The average salary will be \$5,000 to \$5,500 per month. The technical fields vary from \$400 per month to \$525. Business jobs range from \$300 to much higher.

Teachers, if they are employed in Idaho, average \$3,500 to \$4,500 a year in a few places. But out-of-state education offers are being lured by salaries in the \$5,000 to \$5,500 range. Savage said a substantial number of 1969 students are looking out-of-state.

Salaries over all are up \$100 to \$200 per month over 1965. The usual fringe benefits and automatic salary increases are being offered in most cases.

Campbell said there seems to be a "strong" demand for graduates material this year, but that it is not serious. He said teaching, engineering, and mining, there seems to have minor shortages.

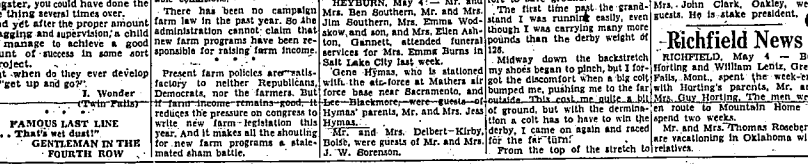

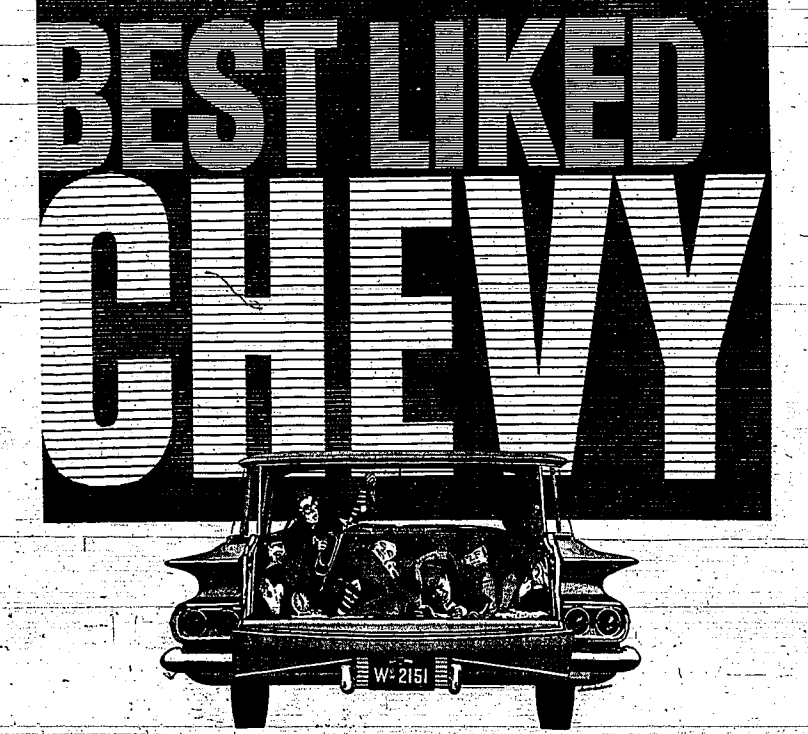

Backs West's Summit Plans Asked at Meet

LONDON, May 4 (AP)—British moved today to blend varying degrees of commonwealth cooperation with firm support for the western bloc there when they met at the summit May 4.

Foreign Secretary Selwyn Lloyd flew back to London last night from the NATO council session in Istanbul to address the 11-nation Commonwealth Prime Ministers conference, which opened here yesterday.

Debate starts. British Prime Minister Harold Macmillan launched the meeting yesterday into a broad two-day debate. Informed observers said that so far it had reflected a feeling of "reasonable optimism" about the outlook for reducing East-West tensions.

Macmillan gave a general review of problems likely to come up at the summit. Indian Prime Minister Jawaharlal Nehru was reported to have warned of the threat to peace in Asia posed by communist "red" eyes on the territory of its neighbors.

Pakistani President Mohammed Ayub Khan spoke mainly of the Soviet threat to the West. However, conference sources said neither expressed any deep pessimism about the cold war outlook.

Segregation Mentioned. As expected, Malaysia's Premier Tunku Abdul Rahman raised the problem of apartheid—racial segregation—in the opening session. He said it was having a bad effect on relations between South Africa and other commonwealth members and expressed the hope it would be discussed here.

Eric Swales, South African external affairs minister substituting for the absent Prime Minister Hendrik Verwoerd, replied that apartheid is an internal South African question and that the use of bounds against it for a commonwealth conference.

The Reeder service bid \$233 on the contract, with spraying costs ranging from 66¢ to 92 cents an acre.

Spraying will depend on "favorable readings" of aircraft, with operations scheduled to start in the last half of May and end before the start of the season.

A Salt Lake City firm bid \$4,706 to spray nearly 8,000 acres in Utah, Idaho and Wyoming with costs of 74 to 89 cents an acre.

Spray is furnished by the government. Last year, about 20,000 acres were sprayed in the Interior mountain region and about 10,000 acres were planted to grass.

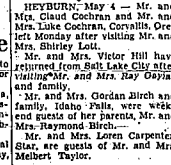

Missile Tests? On Railroad To Be Made

LOS ANGELES, May 4.—The Air Force has announced plans to test a system of launching intercontinental missiles around the country on railroad cars.

The ultimate goal is to keep ready-to-use missiles in the hands of the Air Force, and to be able to move them to the launch sites as needed.

The tests will be conducted by the Air Force's Strategic Air Command, which is currently testing the Minuteman missile. The tests will start June 20 from Hill Air Force Base, Ogden, Utah. A test train will move at random over all lines in the Ogden area for 30 days.

Before November, two similar tests will be made in the western and northwestern parts of the United States and in the Midwest.

The solid-propellant Minuteman, designed for quick firing and for a range of more than 2,000 miles, is not expected to enter the air force inventory until 1962 at the earliest.

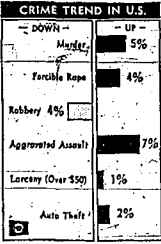

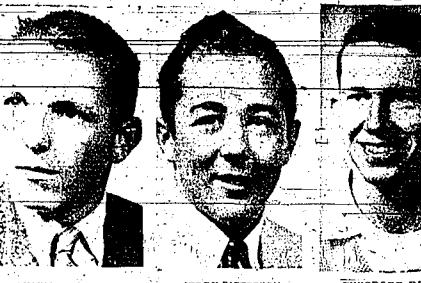

MOSCOW, May 4 (AP)—The Soviet Union announced last night the award of a Lenin peace prize to Cleveland industrialist Cyrus Eaton, who long has been a proponent of U.S.-Soviet understanding. Eaton, now in Canada, said he was deeply appreciative.

The Tass news agency quoted the award committee as saying the Canadian-born Eaton has never lost the ability of taking a realistic view of the prospects for the course of international developments in the atmosphere poisoned by the cold war.

In recent years, Eaton has given the Soviet Union 100 short-horn cattle and has received a Russian troika (buggy) and white horses to pull it.

At last—recognition—the prize was valued officially at \$5,000. They formerly were called Stalin prizes.
