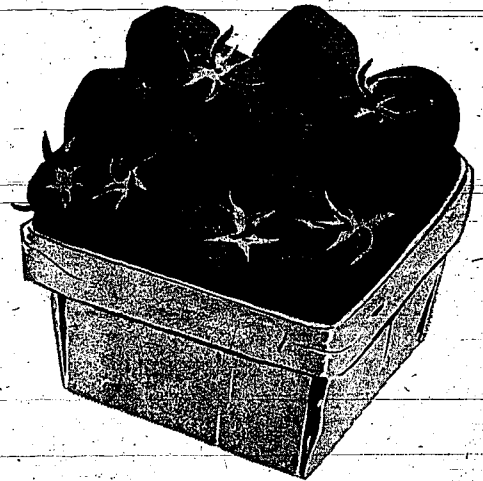

The plan is unusual in that it purports to tax the people who benefit by the subsidy, but it actually would take taxes they already pay and divert them. This would amount to relieving commuters of other taxes.

It is likely that taxes would have to rise in some states to cover the loss. So, everyone will be taxed to keep the commuters, who are usually pretty well heeled, from paying what their transportation really costs.

Of course, in turn the commuters are to be subsidized other people. In fact, we are all being taxed today to subsidize each other, and the taxes must include the enormous cost of state and federal bureaucracies engaged in taking away our money with one hand and giving it back to us with the other.

We'd all be better off if we paid out of pocket the real cost of the things we need, but we insist on trying to shore our coffers off on the other fellow and he is trying to get us to shoulder his.

FOREIGN AID AGAIN
The \$4,125,600,000 estimate authorized for foreign aid does not, of course, tell the full story on the 1960 aid program.

These people, part of any tiny group of defense, are, though, are members of the Southeast Asia treaty organization. We would seem to have most to gain not by assisting them to field armies of "volunteer" soldiers, but by aiding them to live better in freedom.

If the Eisenhower administration were to develop a solid, understandable economic policy, it would be a great step toward liberty and in time creating good new markets for American goods, congress and the whole citizenry might adopt a far more progressive attitude toward this effort than they now.

Report Given To Board for Library Here

At the monthly meeting of Twin Falls public library trustees Tuesday, reports were read by Librarian Arthur DeVolder on circulation, new equipment and repairs and meetings of the Idaho State Library association.

The librarian reported that books added for the month totaled 172. Of these 30 adult titles were purchased and 29 donated, 22 juvenile titles were purchased and 19 youth room titles were purchased and two donated.

Books worn out and withdrawn for the month were 189 adult, 151 juvenile and one youth room title. Magazines bound totaled 46. New books and magazines repaired in the library amounted to 169.

Photograph records added were three adult and four juvenile, while three adult and nine juvenile records were withdrawn.

New readers registered for the month were 121 adults and youth and 64 juvenile for a total of 185; while 113 adult and 110 juvenile readers were withdrawn for a total of 223.

Books issued for the month totaled 2,212 fiction, 1,560 non-fiction, 215 magazines and 106 pamphlets. Juveniles borrowed 2,626 books of fiction, 761 non-fiction, 22 magazines and four pamphlets, and the young adult department books loaned were 23 fiction, 529 non-fiction, 165 magazines and 18 pamphlets.

The library was open 26 days with an average daily circulation of 558 books. The highest daily circulation was 557 and the lowest 256. Percentage of non-fiction circulation was 29.

Photograph records circulated were 80 adult and 183 juvenile for a total of 263. Overdue book delinquencies were 380 adult, 178 juvenile and 89 youth for a total of 647. The library's total circulation for the month totaled 12,100; fines on overdue books, 416.50; lost books, \$1.41, and cards to non-residents, \$1.41. Expenditures for the month total \$4,021.83.

Other activities during the month include four story hours with an attendance of 161. Story hours have been terminated until June.

Two elementary classes attended a library orientation session. No further classes will be taught in library orientation until next fall. In other reports, DeVolder announced the employment of Mrs. Karoline Thomas as reference-circulation library assistant and Nancy McFarlane as general library assistant on a part-time basis. He reported completion of the lighting project in the office and basement of the library and painting of the library basement art corridor and several walls in the children's department.

The board authorized additional purchases of new equipment including card catalog cases, filing cabinets and book supplies. Orders have been placed with Office Appliances company, Running's Office Supply company and Cies Book store.

Interviews were held for the position of library secretary and a decision will be announced soon. Final reports included information on the meeting of the Idaho State Library association attended by Mr. and Mrs. DeVolder. Mrs. DeVolder was acting secretary of the public libraries division and attended meetings on library education.

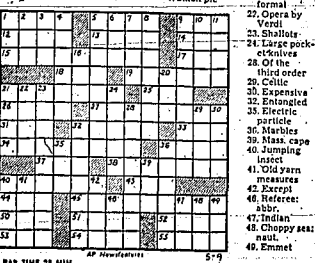

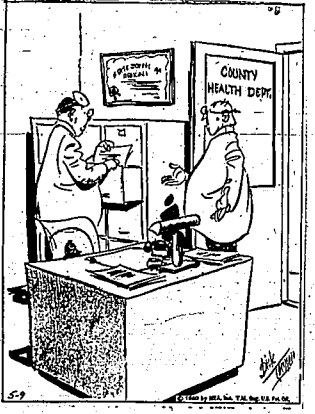

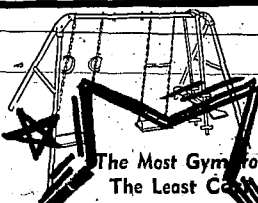
