### Birth Control Pill Approved By U.S. Group

WASHINGTON, May 10.—The federal government for the first time has approved a safe pill for birth control.

D. D. Scriver and company, Chicago, the maker of the contraceptive pill, said it was 100 per cent effective in preventing pregnancy in 1,500 women in Puerto Rico, Los Angeles, San Antonio, Texas, Boston and Japan.

To avoid pregnancy a woman must take 20 pills a month. The cost would be between \$10 and \$11 a month. It can be sold only on a doctor's prescription.

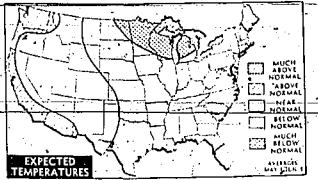
The pill, called Enovid, was approved yesterday by the food and drug administration.

Commissioner John L. Harvey said: "We had no choice but to the morality that might be involved. When the data convinced our experts that the drug meets the requirements of the new drug provisions of our laws of morality had nothing to do with the case."

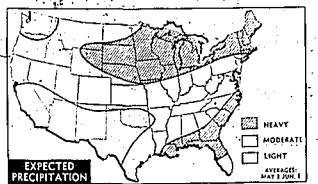
The drug has been on the market for several years, but previous clearance was for its use in the treatment of female disorders.

### Stockpile in U.S. Valued At 15 Billion

WASHINGTON, May 10.—The total value of stocks in various government stockpiles was \$15,000,000 on May 31, Sen. Harry F. Byrd, D. Va., reported today.

Byrd, chairman of the senate-house committee on reduction of government expenditures, said the figure is a breakdown on the figure in a statement issued without comment last night.

It showed that the general services administration has the largest stockpile worth \$4,402,218,000, consisting mostly of strategic products that would be used in case of an emergency.

The agriculture department had a \$2,925,545,000 stockpile, made up almost entirely of surplus food taken over under the price support program.

The remaining \$11,672,000 in stockpiled goods consisted of civil defense equipment.

Byrd's report showed that the value of the federal stockpiles dropped by \$25,157,000 in March due to acquisition, disposal and adjustments.

### Exemption of \$1,200 Asked

COEUR D'ALENE, May 10.—A \$1,200 income tax exemption for dependents is advocated by Joseph Garry, Democratic candidate for the U.S. senate.

"A \$1,200 exemption" is realistic in the light of current family living costs," Garry pointed out. "The average family of four represents the minimum cost to feed and clothe a woman and a child for a year."

Garry pointed out that it costs about \$1,200 a year to feed and clothe an older son or daughter to college, yet the parent is allowed only \$1,200 for a college student's support in his income tax return.

"The bare necessities of life for a family of four in Idaho—shelter, food and clothing—average close to \$1,000 a year; yet the federal government allows only a \$1,200 deduction," Garry said.

### Demo-Interest in East Said Notes

WASHINGTON, May 10.—Gov. Cecil Underwood said last night the concern Sen. John Kennedy, D. Mass., and Hubert Humphrey, D. Minn., have been showing for hungry people in West Virginia was defined only in terms of today's presidential primary.

"They only began showing an interest in our state a few weeks ago," the West Virginia Republican said. "It wasn't until they began looking for votes all over the state that we began to be of any interest to them. They are having a political feast on our poverty."

Underwood's remarks came in a discussion with Sen. Thurston Morton, Kentucky, Republican national chairman, taped for broadcast on the Mutual Broadcasting system.

### Newsmen Held in Cuba Are Freed

HAVANA, May 10.—Richard Valerius and Tony Oliver, correspondent and photographer for the Associated Press, were freed yesterday by Cuban military authorities after being held incommunicado for 40 hours. Valerius is a U. S. citizen, Oliver is Cuban.

"They told me it could go," Valerius said immediately after his release. "They would give me no indication why we had been held nor would they tell me anything more."

Valerius, 37, is from Washington, N. J. He and Oliver were picked up Saturday night after they had covered a riot between communists and anti-communists at Havana International airport. A number of other newsmen and photographers were freed a few hours later.

# Ike Is Still Planning to Visit in East

WASHINGTON, May 10 — President Eisenhower will visit Japan and Korea next month as scheduled regardless of whether he cancels plans to go to the Soviet Union, the White House said today.

"That's firm," the associate press secretary, Anne Whitely, said in making public a preliminary schedule of the President's activities in Tokyo June 10-23.

State Dept. officials are preparing to meet the President's advance party for 10-12 days in Tokyo, the White House said in reply to newsmen's questions.

The schedule also indicates that Mrs. Eisenhower will accompany the president to Japan and Korea, as well as to the Soviet Union, that visit remains in the future.

Schedule Four: The White House said, for example, that Eisenhower and his wife will be in Seoul in October and Kansas City in November.

Eisenhower will return to Tokyo after a four-day tour. He will be met at Haneda airport by the emperor and his wife, and then will fly with them to the Imperial Palace. After a brief visit to the Imperial Palace, he will fly to U. S. embassy residence, his headquarters during the Tokyo visit.

The next day Eisenhower will receive the prime minister and also visit Japanese cities (schedule). If he follows his usual custom, the President also will address the diet members. On June 22 the President will fly to Seoul, capital of Korea, for a one-day visit. Details will be announced later.
