CHICAGO, May 13—Former President Harry S. Truman today endorsed Sen. Stuart Symington of Missouri for the Democratic presidential nomination.

"I expect to support the honorable Stuart Symington," Truman told a news conference here today.

"Truman said, 'I am sure we can be of the Democrats' nominee here, he will have no difficulty in carrying a tremendous majority of the electoral votes in the election in November."

"I shall do everything I possibly can to contribute what help I can to his nomination."

Truman, who came here today to address the Executive Club of Chicago, then continued repeated reports that he eventually would come out openly for Symington in an effort to stop the growing power of the move toward nomination of Sen. John F. Kennedy of Massachusetts.
