UNIVERSITY OF IDAHO, Moscow, May 30—Anyone who sincerely wants an education can get it, say a University of Idaho husband and wife who will be halfway to their goal when they receive bachelor degrees next Sunday.

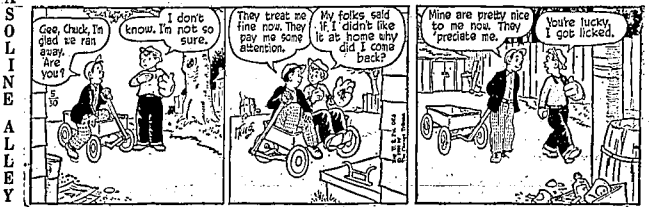

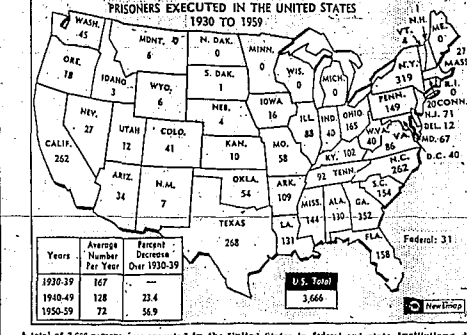
