WARSAW, Poland, June 2 (AP)—Religious rioting caused an undeclared riot Tuesday night in the Polish capital in the former German city of Zolna Gora (Grunberg), according to reports from Poland.

Information reaching here said that the riot occurred in Zolna Gora, which had been placed under Polish rule after World War II.

The rioting is reported to have broken out in a Catholic church when a group of people tried to force entry into the church. Rioters threw stones and bricks, and set fire to a church building.

Herter Warns SEATO Reds Might Act up

WASHINGTON, June 2—Secretary of State Christian A. Herter said yesterday the communist bloc likely will launch new probing action, especially in the Far East.

Herter outlined his views at a closed-door strategy meeting of representatives of the eight South-east Asia Treaty organization allies.

A spokesman reported the gist of Herter's remarks after the conference expanded to include the wake of the blowup of the summit meeting.

The eight allies agreed they can expect trouble from the Chinese reds unless they stand firm.

Although predicting little trouble, Herter said he does expect any Soviet action against divided Berlin.

BOISE, June 2 (AP)—Voting in Tuesday's primary election is going to be much lighter than in past years if absentee ballots cast to date are any indication of turnout later at the polls.

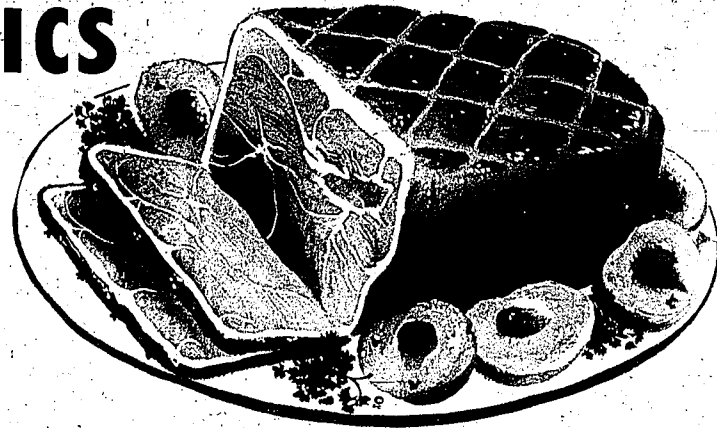

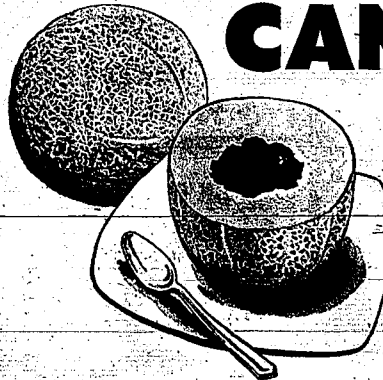

Space Agency Leader Says Unit Didn't Know U2's Role

WASHINGTON, June 2.—The civilian space agency's second in command denied yesterday that his agency knew the U2 spy plane was being used for espionage. A senior investigator was openly skeptical of this.

Testifying before the senate foreign relations committee, Dr. Hugh L. Dryden said the national aeronautics and space administration has "no intelligence activities either in the development of rockets, methods, instruments or operations."

Dryden, NASA's deputy administrator, who told the committee the high-altitude U2s have made more than 200 weather research flights since 1956 but that the

agency was being used as a cover for aerial spying.

But of Dryden, Fulbright said, "This witness has had long experience—I think he knew a good deal about what was going on."

Fulbright said it was "a rather dangerous undertaking" to use the space agency as a cover for espionage.

However, he said Dryden's testimony showed the bulk of U2 flights were actually for study of upper-air turbulence and other weather data, as charged.

In addition to the U2s, which he said he believed are all owned by the U.S., Dryden told of NASA installing research instruments in both commercial and military planes, and of working with foreign governments.

Critics of the administration's actions in the U2 spy plane have said they believe the Soviet Union has voiced concern that the space

2 Runaway Brothers Die In Air Crash

POHONA, Calif. June 2 (AP)—Two runaway brothers aged 12 and 14 were killed early today when a light plane they apparently stole crashed and burned in a shrub-covered area.

The single-engine plane, its engine going full-blast, smashed into the ground at Emerson Junior high school in the heart of a thickly populated residential area near Los Angeles suburb.

The victims were identified by their parents as Thomas 12, and James 14, McDonald. Both boys had run away from their home Monday.

Both of the brothers were in love with flying, friends said. They had attempted to steal a plane several weeks ago but were caught, police said.

Found in the charred wreckage of the Tri-Pacer four-seat craft was the body of the brothers' pet dog, a small brown female.

"Fire before it hit the ground," said Police Officer Joe de Moss. "It landed just between the school and about 100 yards from home."

De Moss said the plane hit water and crashed. The engine crumpled like an accordion. The wings were part of the craft's fuselage and tail were left standing straight up.

2 U. S. Bureaus Hit by Harriman

WASHINGTON, June 2 (AP)—Former ambassador, cabinet officer and foreign aid boss, W. Averell Harriman, testified today that the treasury and health bureaus have too much say in national security and foreign policy.

"I would suggest that their wings be clipped," Harriman said in prepared testimony before a senate subcommittee studying the formulation of national security policy.

Harriman said the budget bureau and the treasury were "essentially too aggressive" on the side of "no slower and no less" because of their fiscal responsibilities.

He proposed that views of the council of economic advisors "be given greater weight" in judging the financial impact on security programs.

Way Said Paved To Work at Dam

SEATTLE, June 2 (AP)—Action by the senate public works committee in approving the huge river and harbor authorization bill this week paves the way for an appropriation to start work on Lower Monumental dam, Sen. Warren G. Magnuson and Henry M. Jackson, both Washington, said yesterday.

"The rivers and harbors bill, which now goes before the full senate for action, authorizes project through fiscal year 1965 for more than a billion and a half dollars."

In addition to clearing the way for a start on Lower Monumental, on the Snake river north of Walla Walla, Magnuson said he would hold the Associated Press, Seattle, a telegram from Washington, D. C., the bill will also make possible the appropriation of additional funds to keep construction at John Day dam and Ice Harbor dam on schedule.

Connection Cut

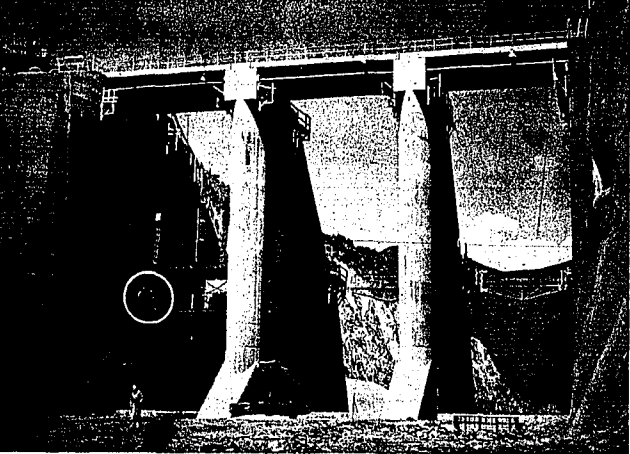

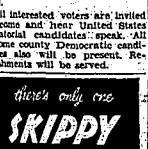

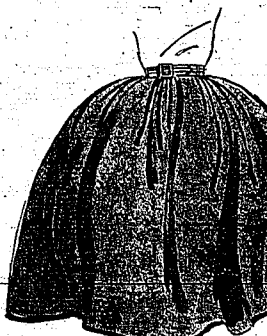

Ike's New Trip Is Compared To U. S. Military Inspection

TOKYO, June 2 (AP)—Less than six months ago President Eisenhower made a triumphant "peace tour" with Justice Earl Warren and American men of materials—some of them—helped against the threat of communism.

Hoover said yesterday that a preliminary crime report for the January-March period showed an overall seven per cent increase in the number of serious crimes reported by cities with populations over 25,000.

The FBI chief appealed to the public for closer cooperation with enforcement agencies to check the trend.

Murders increased 11 per cent, robberies seven per cent and burglaries 10 per cent over the first three months of last year.

During Eisenhower's visit to Japan last week, the Chinese red cities in the 25,000 to 50,000 population group reported the largest increase in 1960 during the first quarter of 1959 to 1960 during the same period of 1950.

Soviets Have Parts to Put Man in Space

WASHINGTON, June 2 (AP)—A Soviet satellite says Russia has all the special equipment it requires to maintain a man in space and needs only the parts and crew to complete the job.

The satellite says the Soviet Embassy here yesterday, the clerk said the first such trial flight was made with Sputnik IV, the 10-ton satellite launched May 15. The article described the satellite as the first of a series intended for manned flight.

The United States has developed a one-ton capsule for its Mercury manned satellite program. But it does not expect to test the capsule in orbit without an escort, before October. It does not expect to send a man around the Earth in it before late next year.

The Russian article was signed by E. Podoyev, corresponding member of the Soviet Academy of Sciences. It catalogued equipment and instruments needed to put a man in orbit and bring him back alive.

"They are all ready now," the article said. It added that the parts must, however, "be most carefully checked and tested in actual flight conditions before a man goes up."

Systems Differ Podoyev's article was dated May 18, the day after Sputnik IV was launched and three days before the Russians failed in an attempt to bring the 21-ton pressurized cabin down out of orbit.

The U. S. and Soviet approaches to the atmospheric reentry problem are entirely different. But both depend for success on "ballistic control" and the use of braking rockets to cut the satellite speed.

Sputnik's attitude controls, aimed to keep the satellite in the desired position relative to Earth, apparently did not function properly. 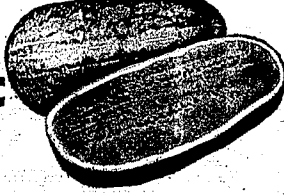

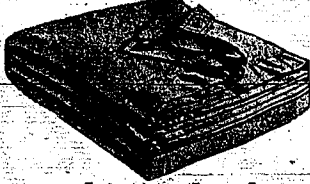

Smylie Urges Idahoans to Cast Ballots

BOISE, June 2 (AP)—Idahoans have been urged to cast their ballots in the primary election Tuesday—and to be sure they vote in the nonpartisan election for supreme court justices.

"The nonpartisan judiciary law," said Gov. Robert E. Smylie in his weekly news column, "is a measure that if a candidate receives a majority of the vote in the primary election he is deemed elected.

"This year there are only two candidates for each of the two justiceships and so the winner will be elected in the primary. There are four judges to sit for six years. The importance of a good choice in this so-called nonpartisan election is thus abundantly apparent.

Political Interest Needed

"Smylie said, "The most interesting aspect of the development of the state is the tremendous growth of interest in the political life of Idaho. Not less than 50 schools of practical politics have been held in districts over the state by various groups."

"It has always seemed to me," he went on, "that Idaho is a vast reservoir of people who are waiting for the means of making an effective force out of their own ideas of how this jointly owned body should be run. The fact that so many young citizens are willing to learn how to do this citizenship chore is proof of the vitality of our free institutions of government."

Restored Pastors Wanted

"Many of you think politics involves name calling and mud-slinging. Sometimes it does. Now this is the exception and not the rule. I am hopeful that some of the passions that will be aroused in this campaign can be restrained."

"For one, hope that the tremendously important issues that confront Idaho can be debated with intelligence and vigor, and that without venom and dirt."

"The Democrats point out that the law requires that no more than six of the 11 members of the ICC shall belong to the same political party. At present six of the places are held by Republicans."

Remains of 2 Lost Bomber Fliers Found

HEIDELBERG, Germany, June 2 (AP)—The remains of two crew members of the U. S. World War II bomber "Lady Be Good" have been found in the Libyan desert, the U. S. Army said yesterday.

One body was discovered early in May by geologists of a British oil company. The other was found by members of a 19-man U. S. Army search team which hunted the area for several weeks in April and May.

Names Not Released
The Army said experts have identified the bodies but names will not be released until final determination has been made by a board of officers. This procedure is necessary to establish an identification admissible in court, the Army said.

The bodies are believed to be those of Tech. Sgt. Harold G. Pugh, 34, and Sgt. James E. Kelly, 27, both of the 44th Bombardment Group, based at Davis-Monthan Air Force Base, Memphis, Tenn.

Bombers Found Earlier
The B-24 bomber was discovered almost intact last year 1,000 miles from the Mediterranean coast. It had made a pirouette belly landing after the crew parachuted while returning from a bombing raid on Naples, Italy, April 4, 1942.

The Army made two unsuccessful searches last summer. Last February a British oil exploration team found the remains of five men 85 miles north of the plane. All five have been identified.

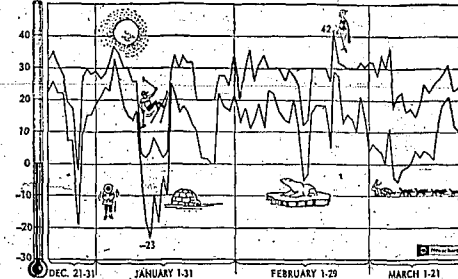
