

Solon Wants To Find What U2 Was After

WASHINGTON, June 6 (AP)—A Republican senator says the senate foreign relations committee should ask President Eisenhower what the spy plane, downed in Russia, was trying to photograph.

Sen. George D. Aiken, R. Vt., a member of the senate committee, said last night that it would be difficult to reach a conclusion on the spy plane's mission without information on its purpose.

Trouble Expected on Report The senate group completed yesterday hearings last week on the U2 incident and other events surrounding the summit conference collapse. Some members have indicated it might have trouble writing a final report.

Central Intelligence Director Allen W. Dulles and other witnesses declined to disclose the U2 spy plane's mission. They said only that the May 1 flight was an espionage mission that had to be carried out that day.

Other related developments:

Khrushchev Said Scared—Aiken said Soviet Premier Nikita S. Khrushchev's tirade against Eisenhower indicated the Russian leader was scared and publicly. He said he thought Khrushchev was "under severe pressure from his own military and from red China to take a tougher stand against the West."

Sen. Jacob K. Javits, R. N. Y., predicted that a top government official, perhaps the secretary of state, eventually will be given the job of coordinating U. S. espionage activities. He said lack of coordination contributed to difficulties surrounding the U2 incident.

Sen. Henry M. Jackson, D. Wash., also said that "official misdirection" following the downing of the spy plane showed a lack of coordination in the command. Jackson said Eisenhower erred in the handling of the U2 plane.

Sen. Gale McGee, D. Wyo., said that "no one was minding the store" when the U2 situation developed.

Russ Chief Said Dangerous—Aiken said that the free world should not underestimate Khrushchev's threats because "when a man is fighting for his political life and perhaps his physical life, he is dangerous."

While the administration declined to divulge the specific mission of the downed spy plane, Aiken said, it provided the senate committee with "beautiful pictures" of Soviet missile bases and naval yards taken on other U2 flights.

He described these photographs as about as clear as the one President Eisenhower showed the nation on television of a San Diego naval base taken from 15 miles altitude.

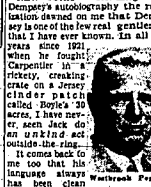

Three States Scheduled to Vote Tuesday

WASHINGTON, June 6.—The last three presidential primaries of the 1960 pre-convention campaign will take place tomorrow in New York, California and South Dakota.

None of the candidates for the Democratic presidential nomination will pick up any pledged delegates in the final primaries. But Sen. John F. Kennedy, Massachusetts, is now leading in the unofficial total of 346 convention votes. He conceded heavy reverse strength in New York and California. Nomination requires 767 votes.

Kennedy Gains
In week-end developments Kennedy picked up another 41 votes in a poll of Nebraska's delegates expected to add to the totals of both Kennedy and Sen. Lyndon B. Johnson, Texas, but the decision has not been determined. Vice President Richard M. Nixon gained full delegations in New York, Colorado and Washington to boost his unofficial delegate total beyond the 800 mark, with only 666 required for the GOP presidential nomination.

Israel Killing Of Nazi May Be First One

JERUSALEM, Israel, June 6 (AP)—Adolf Eichmann may be the first man executed in the new state of Israel.

He will stand trial as an alleged war criminal under a 1958 Israeli law for dealing with former Nazis and Nazi collaborators.

The law provides the death penalty for committing during the peace time a crime in an enemy country which can be considered a crime against the Jewish people.

Under the 1958 law, a crime against the Jewish people might be one committed with the intention of destroying them, of killing Jews, or of persecuting them physically, mentally, or expelling Jews to conditions which can cause their deaths.

It also includes creating conditions which are prejudicial to Jews; forcibly transferring Jewish children to other national or religious groups; or persecuting, or preventing of Jews of Jewish or Arab origin from practicing their religion to avoid hatred of Jews.

Charges of murder, rape, kidnapping, expulsion of civilians population or any other inhuman act carried out against a civilian population were also prohibited.

Russ Spying On U.S. Said Not Possible

WASHINGTON, June 6 (AP)—A top army officer says there is no possibility of Soviet spy flights over the United States because U.S. planes can shoot down anything that flies more than 20 miles up.

Gen. Omar Arthur Trudeau, chief of army research and development, said yesterday that the Nike-Hercules anti-aircraft missile now defending most major American cities "is so accurate that it flies today and almost anything we know that is in the stratosphere."

Missile Success Noted
Trudeau said the Nike-Hercules in tests had shot down "objects" at distances of more than 100,000 feet, flying at altitudes of about 7,100 miles an hour.

The army announced in December 1958 that a Nike-Hercules destroyed a supersonic target flying at more than 1,000 miles an hour and above 60,000 feet in a test at the White Sands, N.M., proving missile success.

Trudeau said he doubted the Russians had a similar weapon. He said the Nike-Hercules is the only high-altitude Russian rocket shot down by the United States in the missile. He called for stepped-up development of the missile weapon, now under development.

He said the Nike-Zeus program, expected to make the missile operational by the mid-1960's, is being held up by scientific doubts of its effectiveness.

But he said the army was convinced the weapon would be effective.

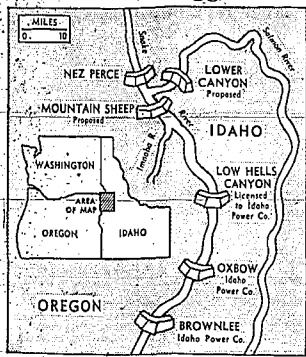

Next winter will find me on a different beach, and I had them to myself. Then I wouldn't care what I looked like. The sea gulls, pelicans and minnows could laugh their heads off for all I would care.

It takes a lot of courage for a man in the shape I am in to present to walk along a beach. More courage than I have. I'd say that the moment I reach the beach I feel like the surf as though I were being blown away. I had a wife and a life guard and he had a drowning. And I don't stop until I get wet-up. From there on up I look fairly presentable, having a somewhat, grateful neck and a head that is standard at least.

And I don't come out until I'm ready to come out for good. By the end of the day I'm as shriveled as a prune, and usually that freezing, but that's better than having people stare at me, wondering where I come from.

I write about this only because it helps to get it off my mind—manage chest, even in the hope that other men who suffer the same way may gain consolation. Also in the hope that some day there will be a beach, or beaches, restocked to just our kind.

There will be no bronzed and handsome men. Admittance will be by hat window and back of tan. Miles away from athletic, tanned fellows we would be able to stroll the beach, heads up, double chin erect, and not holding our breath for all we were worth.
