### Nixon Group Wins Jobs at National Meet

WASHINGTON, June 10 (AP)—Staunch backers of Vice President Richard M. Nixon won key positions yesterday for the Republican national convention starting in Chicago July 25.

Chosen as permanent chairman was Rep. Charles A. Halleck, Indiana. The keynote will be by Walter J. Jude, Minnesota, and the temporary chairman Gov. Cecil H. Underwood, West Virginia.

The arrangements group named Elizabeth E. Heflinger of Minnesota as convention secretary and also named the entire selection of Charles H. Percy, 40, Chicago, as chairman of the Finance Committee and Rep. Melvin R. Laird, 38, Wisconsin, as vice chairman.

The 69-year-old Halleck is currently leader of the House and has served his 13th term in congress. He ousted Rep. Joseph W. Martin of Massachusetts as GOP House leader in January, 1959, and succeeded to the chairmanship held by Martin at the last GOP convention.

While reportedly a neutral as far as a bid for a presidential nomination is concerned, Halleck has been a Nixon supporter and had the backing of Nixon's house forces in his successful fight to oust Martin.

Halleck long has been "available" as a vice presidential candidate.

Jude is of and is serving his ninth term in congress. A former medical missionary in China, he is considered a specialist on Far Eastern matters and has a wide reputation as a speaker. He has been a Nixon backer and has described Nixon as "captain of the new team."

The 77-year-old Underwood is a comparative newcomer to national politics. His selection as temporary chairman was expected to give a boost to his campaign for the senate seat now held by Jennings Randolph, a Democrat.

Nixon will address an open session of the national Saturday morning.

### Pilot Escapes After Dusting Plane Crashes

COLTON, Wash., June 10 (AP)—A Lewiston pilot dusted and escaped death yesterday afternoon when his light plane crashed near his southeastern Washington community, sheriff's officers said.

Ward Devlin received a broken collarbone and bruises when his plane apparently was caught in a gustwind and tossed into a hillside as he sprayed a pea field, officers said.

# Officials of Schools in Skyline, Border Loops, Northwest Eye Conference

SALT LAKE CITY, June 10 (AP)—Officials of several schools acknowledged Thursday they will attend a meeting in San Francisco next week to discuss a possible new athletic conference made up of some members of the present Skyline and Border conferences and recently orphaned powers from the Pacific Northwest. The meeting will be June 16-17. The schools invited include Utah, Brigham Young and New Mexico State. Skyline conference, Arizona and Arizona State Temple of the Border conference, and Oregon State, Oregon and Washington State, former members of the now disbanded Pacific Coast conference. The Pacific conference will be the third gathering of the eight schools in an attempt to form a new circuit.

# Robinson Named Favorite for Regaining Title

BOSTON, June 10 (AP)—Paul Pender will try to prove his Jun. 22 victory over Ray Robinson was no fluke when he defends his New York-Massachusetts version of the world middleweight title Friday night against 40-year-old Sugar Ray. Despite the split decision in favor of Pender in their mid-winter bout, Robinson is a 2-1 favorite to win this 16-round rematch at the Boston garden.

Since 1951 Robinson has been winning, losing, retiring and winning back the middleweight crown. If he evens the score with Pender, it will be the sixth time he has had the title.

As each fighter receives 30 percent of the net take, Robinson's total purse, with his TV share, could be over \$125,000 and Pender over \$50,000.

Only the New York and Massachusetts version of the title will be at stake because Robinson was stripped of his National Boxing Association championship May 1959 for not defending within the time limit. The NBA subsequently recognized Gene Tunney after his best Cotton Sattler last fall.

If Robinson wins he will be suspended champ in New York where the commission went along with Maryland in setting Sugar Ray for falling to appeal for a May 16 bout in Baltimore. The New York commission, however, agreed to recognize this bout as a title fight.

# Sooners Study Puerto Rican Boxer Association With Big 8 Dies of Ring Injury

He never regained consciousness since he was knocked out with just 11 seconds left of the tenth and final round of his feather bout with Benny Gato, 24, New York at St. Nicholas arena Monday night.

Pacheco was the sixth fighter to die of a ring injury since 1930 without the protection of the rings of the world this year, according to Ring magazine.
