

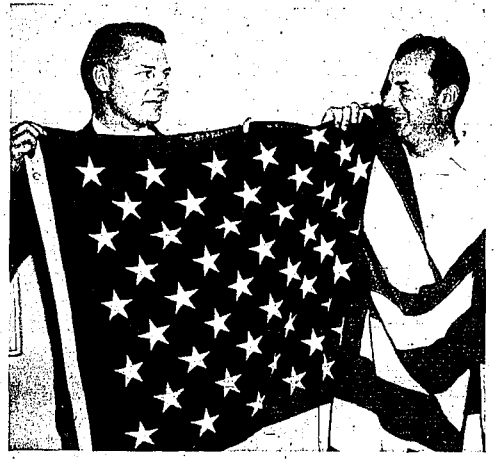

Japanese Police Use Tear Gas To Break Violent, Bloody Riots Against Premier Kishi

TOKYO, June 16 (Thursday) (AP)—Police fired tear gas today in attempts to disperse left-wing mobs in the most violent and bloodiest outbreak so far against Prime Minister Naoto Kishi's pro-western government. Thousands of howling students stormed parliament grounds Wednesday, overpowered police and occupied buildings in a savage near-insurrection that ran on through the night. At least one person, and perhaps five, died and 47 were injured. Kishi's cabinet met in an emergency session to deal with the uprising, which broke only four days before President Eisenhower is due to reach Tokyo on his first mission to the Far East. The cabinet branded the outbreak as a communist attempt to overthrow the government by revolution and warned that it would not be intimidated.

MANILA, June 15 (AP)—President Eisenhower, campaigning for world peace to defeat the "evil objectives" of world communism, was reported tonight to be determined to carry out his visit to Tokyo where bloody new left-wing rioting aroused fears for his safety. American security officials here and Tokyo were deeply concerned over the latest riots by fanatical students who demanded that his visit be canceled. The officials were apprehensive about the ability of Tokyo police to handle a possible large-scale demonstration when the President arrives there Sunday.

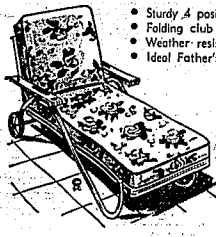

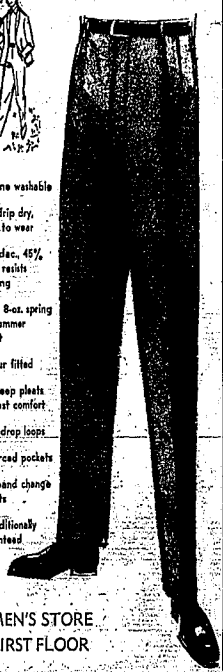

Study Shows U. S. Schools Are Crowded

WASHINGTON, June 15 (AP)—Nearly one-third of a million pupils in public elementary schools were on half-day sessions during the 1959-60 school year, the National Education Association reported today.

More than two million others were victims of overcrowding in classrooms of more than 25 pupils each, the NEA said. There were 290 classrooms with 26 or more pupils.

In a survey of urban school districts nationwide, the NEA found the average classroom size was 27 pupils. The larger the school district, the more likely there is to be overcrowding and half-day sessions.

Educators have long urged a maximum of 25 pupils per classroom in the elementary grades, to provide the children with more individual attention. This, however, is an ideal figure not often reached in city school, and a more practical goal is 30 pupils to a class.

The NEA survey showed more than 12 million children in urban elementary schools. Of these, almost 10 million are in classes of more than 25, about 6½ million in classes of more than 30, more than two million in classes of more than 35, about 380,000 in classes of more than 40, and more than 71,000 in classes of more than 45.

Fish Grow on Body Wastes

ROOSENE, Ore., June 15 (AP)—A research team has found that it would be possible to raise food fish aboard space ships, feeding them on materials produced from body wastes.

The fish would grow in water already being used to take sludge or seaweed and no great increase in volume or weight would be involved.

The experiment was reported to the Biological Society of America by Dr. Frieda E. Traub of the University of Washington.

Dr. Traub and her associates began more than a year ago to raise a species of African moustard breeder in a tank already producing chlorine, a type of algae which produces large quantities of oxygen as well as a type of protein which can be used as human or animal food. Light provides the energy for making the algae grow.

Stories Claimed Help for Reds

WASHINGTON, June 15 (AP)—Rep. Francis E. Walter, D., Pa., says newspaper stories on congressional expense accounts indirectly played into the communist hands by smearing the committee as un-American activities.

Walter, who is chairman of the committee, referred to a series of copyright stories published by the Knight newspapers.

Two of the series discussed expense accounts and sections of Walter's committee.

Walter called the stories scurrilous and a "concoction of half truths, untruths, smear and innuendo adorned with adjectives used in lieu of facts."

Johnson, Nixon Get-Texas Votes

AUSTIN, Tex., June 15 (AP)—Sen. Lyndon B. Johnson, D., Tex., and Vice President Richard M. Nixon won overwhelming support as president at their party's state convention yesterday.

Democrats meeting in Austin gave the senate majority leader complete control of Texas' 36 electoral votes at their national convention in Los Angeles July 13-15, Johnson won his 1960 convention vote to Johnson P. Kennedy's bid.

The Texas Republicans met in San Antonio pledged their 51 votes to Nixon for president and Sen. Barry Goldwater, Arizona, for vice president at the GOP convention in Chicago July 24-27.

Watch out for Massachusetts, Johnson warned his delegation to the convention. He did not mention Kennedy but delegates pledged to back him to the hilt, they said Johnson meant.

Some Crops Behind Two Full Weeks

BOISE, June 15 (AP)—Several Idaho crops are a full two weeks behind a normal state of development because of abnormally cool spring weather, the U. S. agriculture department said today.

"The department said frost-free periods were shorter than normal in fruit crops and considerable damage to other Idaho crops over the state.

Small Crops Explored
As of June 1, the average yield of small crops are in prospect for peaches, pears, sweet cherries and apricots because of the damaging frosts.

Sweet cherry production this year in Idaho is about 100,000 tons—the second lowest of record. Estimated total cherry acreage of 200,000 tons will be the smallest crop of record for Idaho and compares with 200,000 tons in 1959 and 200,000 tons for the 10-year average.

The USDA said Idaho's peach crop is estimated at 20,000 bushels, eight per cent less than produced in 1959 and 10 per cent below the 1949-58 average. It said peaches appear to have survived the frost damage this year better than any other Idaho fruit crop.

Pear Crop is Smallest
The indicated 1959 production of pears at 55,000 bushels is the smallest crop since 1950.

Apricots winter wheat crop is placed at 20,000 bushels, which would be five per cent under last year's production but 10 per cent more than the 1949-58 average, according to the report which amounts to 18,233,000 bushels—about an eighth less than average.

WASHINGTON, June 15 (AP)—The house yesterday approved with only minor opposition a constitutional amendment that would let residents of the nation's capital vote for the first time in presidential elections.

The amendment now goes to the senate which passed a three-part version earlier this year which also would outlaw the poll tax in federal elections and the government to appoint house members in case of atomic attack.

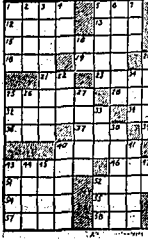

New Pension Law Nearing

The new pension law for veterans and their dependents becomes effective July 1 and all pensioners being placed on the rolls from that date will be governed entirely by its provisions, says Arnold Helms, head representative of the veteran administration.

However, those veterans or dependents already receiving pensions may stay under the old law or elect to come under the new. The choice is solely that of the pensioner, he said.

Once a pension recipient elects the new law he or she can never return to the old law, but the pension recipient can elect a suspension of the new law for as long as he wishes.

An instruction pamphlet and an election card has been sent to each pensioner. If, after careful study of the pamphlet, the pensioner decides to remain under the old law the card should not be returned.

If the VA does not receive the card, payments will automatically continue under the old law.

However, should a pensioner prefer the new law and want the advantage of higher payments from the effective date of the law (July 1) he or she should send the completed card as soon as possible. Helms said.

The new facility will be one of the largest cold storage warehouses in southern Idaho and will contain many outstanding design features and provide efficient warehouse

handling and storage. Initial plans will allow eventual duplication of the facility to allow a total of 20 million pound warehouse storage.

Bahannon states that the new warehouse will allow expanded service to its individual customers throughout the country by centralization of TPT's facilities and Idaho-Pak labels and have many
