Pay to Idaho People Noted

WASHINGTON, June 20—Approximately 45,200 older folks, disabled persons and children above 17 per cent of Idaho's 668,000 population—received \$10,881,000 in the fiscal year, an annual average of \$238 each, under the social security administration program financed by federal state and local taxes.

Adm. Canyon and Twin Falls counties claimed the highest number of recipients in the state, 14,200 and 13,700 respectively. Clark county was lowest.

During the past fiscal year the federal government contributed \$1,148,000 or 61 per cent of the \$1,881,000. The state contributed \$41,000 or 3.76 per cent, and local contributions amounted to \$41,000.

Castro Won't Try to Take Navy's Base

HAVANA, June 20 (AP)—Fidel Castro declared today Cuba will take no action against the U. S. Guantanamo naval base in eastern Cuba.

"Some day it will be returned to us," said Prime Minister Fidel Castro's younger brother in a post-press conference, "but I've made clear that aggression will not come from us."

Castro, who is minister of Cuba's armed forces, told a youth rally that the Guantanamo base is American imperialism. He said the base would serve no useful purpose in any future conflict.

Castro said the invulnerability of American imperialism is a myth, especially being destroyed by the Cuban revolution. "This imperialism," he said, was represented by a scabby, low-riden eagle, whose talons are worn by plunder committed against our people.

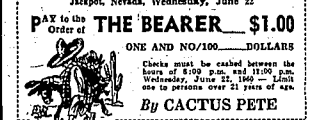

Buhl Vacancy Mystery of Business World Reported for Today Is Junior Executive

DITH, June 20 — Applicants to fill the vacancy of superintendent of Buhl schools are being accepted upon the resignation of Alva Borders, who has served here the past five years, reports Fred Bradford, chairman of the Buhl school board.

Borders has accepted a position with the Horace Mann Insurance firm, which recently signed a contract with the Idaho Education association for the sale of insurance to members in the education field. Borders' resignation becomes effective immediately.

Borders came to Buhl from Escalante where he had served as principal of the Washington elementary school.

During the past five years all schools in the district have been reorganized. During his first year of the reorganization of the Lacerus, Superior and Fairview school districts into the Buhl district was completed. Shortly thereafter Deep Creek was reorganized and joined the Buhl and Castleford districts, with Springs and Roosevelt districts voting reorganization only this week.

Adult education classes have been instituted which cover a process very popular, including classes in commercial subjects, physics, education, industrial arts, mathematics and home economics.

College extension classes have been brought to Buhl the past few years from Idaho State college, Fayetteville, University of Idaho, Moscow, and College of Idaho. Graduate work is available.

The excellent remedial reading-workshop program, Borders points out, has become widespread and stipends are expected this summer from a large area in Idaho. Registrations are ready for teachers from McCall, Boise and Arco as well as from many interested teachers in Magic Valley.

Dr. Harold Hammenberg, Buhl veterinarian, also was appointed by the school board as trustee of district number and is serving the unexpired term of Dr. E. W. McBratney who has resigned. Dr. Hammenberg has accepted a position with the 13th naval district at Bremerton, Wash., and will leave Buhl soon.

Fred Bradford also announces in addition to an opening for a superintendent of Buhl schools, other vacancies in the school staff for the coming year include one first grade teacher, Lincoln school principal, one junior high teacher, two English teachers as well as one physical education instructor for the high school.

A contract has been offered James L. Monroe, Zoni, Ore., to teach in the English department at the high school. Monroe is a graduate of the Twin Falls high school and has taught schools in Kimberly and in Oregon.

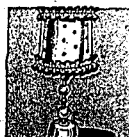

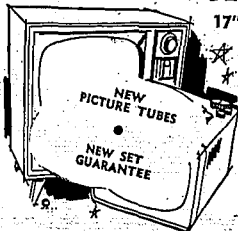

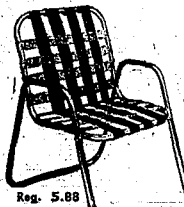
