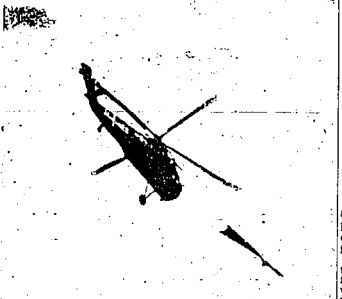

Economic Might of America Cannot Be Beat, Nixon Sates

ST. LOUIS, Mo., June 21 (AP)—Vice President Richard M. Nixon scored “growthmanship” demands for an all-out government economic program today on grounds that U. S. economic might cannot be surpassed in this century. Nixon outlined the economic policies on which he hopes to run for president in a keynote speech before the 40th annual convention of the U. S. Junior Chamber of Commerce. His St. Louis appearance wound up a campaign swing which has taken Nixon into four states in four days.

Japanese Say Nation Is Not Anti-American

TOKYO, June 21 (AP)—The Japanese people want to make it clear to the world that the bloody days of the past month were not anti-American nor anti-American.

One of the biggest fears in Japan in the aftermath of the cancellation of President Eisenhower's visit is that the world may misinterpret what has really happened.

They have seen the headlines in newspapers from New York, London, Paris—and they read these headlines correctly, explain the whole picture.

Black Eyes Received

They know Japan has received a black eye because of the rough treatment accorded Press Secretary James Hagerly upon his arrival here, and because Japan could not guarantee the president's safety for a two-and-a-half-day visit.

But this is the way one of Japan's largest national newspapers said it editorially:

"It is hoped that the people of the United States will understand the situation in Japan. A deep concern for worsening economic relations between the two nations exists, with many Americans apparently taking recent developments as indicating anti-Americanism on the part of Japan."

"The nation-wide demand for the withdrawal of Prince Mikasa Nobuneko Kishi and the dissolution of the diet (parliament) does not indicate anti-American feeling. If the American people believe the anti-Kishi feeling represents anti-American feeling, they grossly misunderstand the real situation in Japan."

Kishi Is Unpopular

Kishi is personally unpopular and the demand for his resignation continues unabated. He is blamed for ramming the defense treaty through parliament without the consent of approval of the opposition.

The Japanese claim this is a threat to democracy, even though Kishi's Liberal-Democratic party has a majority in parliament and a mandate from the people in all recent elections.

Important politicians such as former Premier George Bidault and former Cabinet Minister Jacques Soustelle kicked off the campaign last night with a meeting at suburban Vincennes.

They charged that De Gaulle's blueprint for Algeria would lead to a "détachement de territoire" by the Algerian rebel leaders.

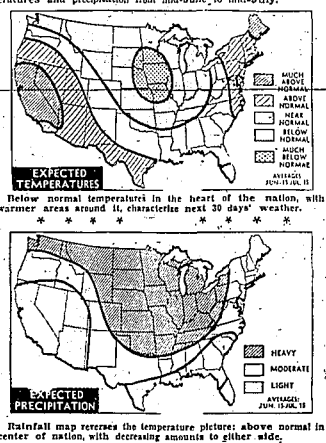

The emissary was expected to arrive by tomorrow.

The rebel strategy accepted De Gaulle's latest offer of five-year-old Algerian war and preparation, for a referendum by which Algerians could choose their own destiny.

Agency Doubts Russia Can Beat U.S. Meat Output

WASHINGTON, June 21 (AP)—The foreign agricultural service today expressed doubt that Soviet Russia could surpass or even equal U.S. meat production by 1955.

"The PAB said in a survey of the Soviet meat situation that the outlook for maintaining an upward trend and achieving goals 'is considerably less than impressive.'"

The survey was compiled by Eugene T. Olson of the agriculture department's foreign agricultural analysis division. Olson has traveled extensively in Russia, and is an expert on Soviet agriculture. He speaks Russian fluently.

The Soviet Union has steadily increased its meat and livestock production, especially in the last decade. It is now second only to the United States in that output at a current output about half that of the United States.

One of Premier Nikita S. Khrushchev's goals of his seven-year plan for Soviet agriculture is to surpass the United States in meat production by 1965 or earlier. This campaign has been under way since 1953.

Floyd Asserts He's 'Real Champ' Now

NEW YORK, June 21 (AP)—For the first time I feel I'm a real champion. I think the public will agree with me at least, I hope so.

Floyd Patterson spoke these words to a horde of newsmen Monday night as he tried to explain how he feels to become the first man in the history of boxing ever to retain the heavyweight championship of the world.

"I think it was the hardest blow I ever hit anyone," he said quizzically. "It had to be. I put everything behind it and I wanted to win that night that I never did for any other reason."

"The hardest blow" was a leaping left hook that landed through Johansson's chin and sent him flying in the fifth round and dropped the Swede as if he were a rag doll. The referee, Arthur Mercante, counted 100 over the bell, but Patterson refused to let him count. He took some 10 minutes to revive Johansson.

"It was worth losing the title for," Patterson said happily. "It's really the most gratifying moment of my life. I never for a moment thought I could win to win it this way—it's just happy. I can't tell you how happy."

"I'm going to be a real champion," he kept repeating. The beaten, chastised ex-heavyweight champion of the world stumbled his dressing room after an hour's silence and said "I'm going to be a real champion." Ed-Edwin Angilau, manager of the Swede, declared the fight was a "draw."

"I'd like to talk to you tomorrow. He's shocked. This is the first time in his life he's been knocked out. He's been knocked out four times before, but I thought the fight was a good one. He really shook Floyd Patterson out of his mind."

Examination of U. S. Policy To Be Part of '60 Campaign

WASHINGTON, June 21 (AP)—The first time in eight years the nation will undertake a searching self-examination to see where it is going, a full self-examination will become part of the presidential campaign.

The personal and national history outlined on President Eisenhower — at the summit, in Japan, on Okinawa — plus the anti-administration demonstrated in Cuba and other Latin American countries bear testimony to this:

1. In eight years the country has increased enormously in power, self-confidence, and influence.
2. American prestige and influence have suffered damage.
3. One of the cornerstones of the American defense system — Japan — may be in jeopardy. If the communist, neutralist, and anti-American sentiment continues to build over there, Japan can be lost to the defense system.

In the 1952 presidential campaign the country was unhappy over the Korean war and split down the middle by McCarthyism which had made Americans suspicious even of one another. It was a time of deep trouble.

Eisenhower promised peace in Korea. A home he looked like the man who could restore quiet and harmony. He was elected. He did get peace in Korea; he gave the nation a sense of stability, and McCarthyism died.

But he took one new direction in foreign policy. He took over and extended the basic foreign policy established by President Truman and Secretary of State Dean Acheson.

Five Anti-Castro Units Organized

MEXICO CITY, June 21 (AP) — Jose I. Razo, president-in-exile of Cuba's predominantly Roman Catholic-MDQ party, says the first task of the five anti-Castro groups will be to "explain the fraud" of Premier Fidel Castro's revolution to the Cuban people.

Razo told a press conference yesterday a recent survey showed Castro is supported by only 40 per cent of the Cuban people. The five anti-Castro groups will work the support of the other 60 per cent.
