

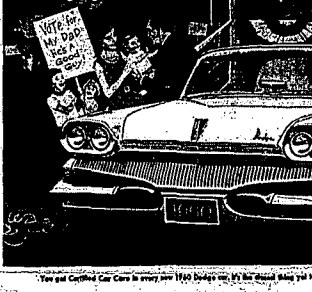

Farmers will receive notice of their 1961 farm wheat allotment well in advance of the July 21 marketing quota referendum. Earl Boyd, chairman of the Twin Falls county agricultural public relations and conservation committee, announced Friday. The overall wheat allotment for Twin Falls county for 1961 is 33,480 acres, about one percent more than the 1960 allotment.

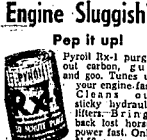

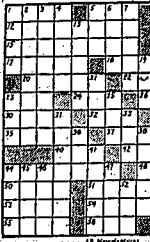

Closser expects about 70 soil scientists and range conservationists from throughout Idaho will attend the conference. These men will study various types of soils, climate, and technique so that they, working as technicians, will be better able to cope with range conservation problems and will be able to advise the farmer on his potential production.

Forty-four sites on ranches in the Twin Falls conservation district have been chosen for the conservationist to visit. At each site, they will identify and describe the soil and climate characteristics and identify the range sites and specific soils which characterize them.

Closser commented that soil conservationists have been studying ways to the range vegetation to soil types for three or four years and now they are ready to put the procedures into effect for all ranchers.

### Farmers Are Told Of Sales Records

With the beginning of the new marketing year and changing prices, growers are reminded to have complete sales records if they intend to file for wool incentive payments under the national wool program. Marketing prices March 31 will be eligible for payments under the 1959 program.

Carl Boyd, chairman of the Twin Falls county agricultural stabilization and conservation committee, says that such sales records should be kept by the producer until an application is filed at the county office. Payments under the 1960 program will not be made until summer of 1961. Payments under the 1959 wool program will be made this summer.

Growers also are reminded that the grower who receives the set price for his wool also receives the largest payments under the wool incentive program. Payment rate is the percentage necessary to bring the national average price received by growers during the marketing year up to the incentive level of 62 cents a pound.

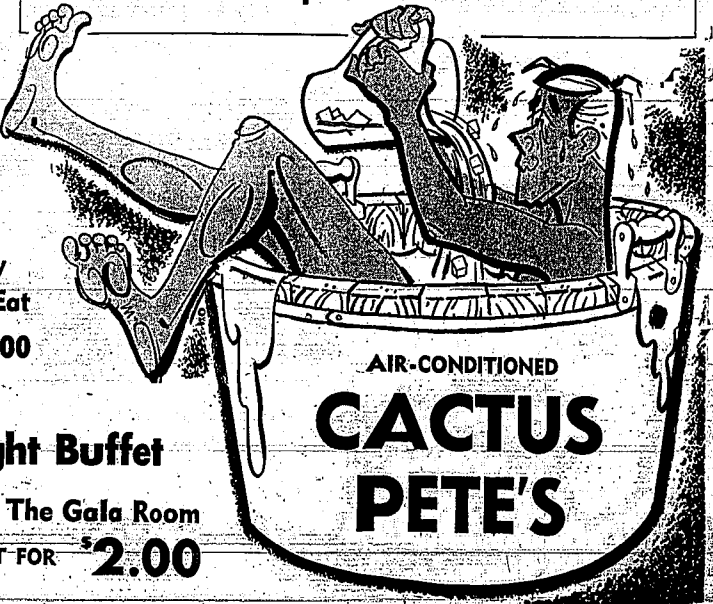
