Denver Water Supply Tunnel Pierces Continental Divide

DILLON, Colo., July 29.—With a crew of 40 men and a 500-ton tunneling machine, the Continental Divide was pierced today by the Denver water supply tunnel. Khrushchev Tells Austrians Another War Is Unthinkable

VIENNA, Austria, July 7.—Soviet Premier Nikita Khrushchev declared tonight another war would be unthinkable because it would destroy a world made small and vulnerable by nuclear weapons and rockets.

In a speech before the Austrian Soviet society, Khrushchev disavowed the Leninist theory that the triumph of communism could be achieved through conflict with capitalism.

"We don't want to talk about the question of capitalism versus communism through a war because all would be lost," he said. "What would we mean at the present time now that we have atomic bombs and rockets?"

"Everything would be destroyed. The few people who would survive would perish because of horrible radiation."

The Kremlin leader departed from his prepared text to say that another war would "destroy" the world.

In his speech he charged that American planes remain deployed and ready to resume spy missions over the Soviet Union—despite the U2 incident.

"The Kremlin leader congratulated Austria for following a neutral foreign policy and thereby keeping its towns and villages free from the 'hounding noise of military planes.' Austria would have been in 'deadly danger' if the United States had allowed the United States to use Austrian territory for spyplane flights."

The Soviet society is a private body which includes Communist Party members and other members of the party. Khrushchev's denunciation of American defense policies came while an American search was in progress for a missing U-2 spy plane reconnaissance bomber.

Khrushchev repeated his contention the U2 incident had made it impossible for him to negotiate with the Americans at the Paris summit conference in May since the Soviet Union has never agreed before anybody and never intends to do so.

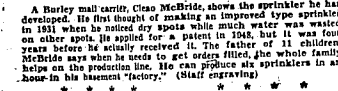

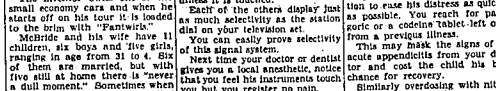


A Barley mail carrier, Cleo McBride, shows the sprinkler he has developed. He first thought of making an improved type sprayer...

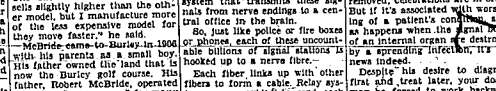

Chamber Unit Hears Public Grazing Talk

The Twin Falls Chamber of Commerce heard talks on U. S. National Forest grazing policy and procedures and the program of the Bureau of Land Management range program in Idaho at noon Friday at their weekly meeting in the Board room at the Regency hotel.

Jay Gray, supervisor of the Sawtooth National Forest, spoke on procedures used by his agency in establishing range and watershed conditions on the forest, grazing allotments and how it is determined that grazing should be allowed. He said that areas suitable for grazing are classified by conditions of soil suitability and vegetation conditions and then mapped.

Joseph Fialini, speaking for the BLM land reclamation project, said that land available for public grazing is decreasing, yet there are still about 12 million acres of public land, about 23 per cent of the entire state, under BLM administration. He described to the chamber board the conditions of the land still available for grazing range and to improve and increase its productivity to its maximum potential.

"It is a new area to a ripe old age," he said, "and it will be more a result of luck and good management than genes," says Prof. R. W. Gooding, Cornell University.

Eight-Speaker, Stereophonic Record Player Given Cerebral Palsy School

A recent gift to the Twin Falls Cerebral Palsy school will add much to the present school curriculum. It is a \$600, eight-speaker, 30-watt, stereophonic high fidelity record player donated to the school by the staff of the Idaho wing of the civil air patrol.

This solves an economic problem facing the school. Mrs. Charles Hattiffe, principal, says the machine will be of great value in future years. The school's present record player faced replacement this fall and promised to be a strain on the budget. Now Mrs. Hattiffe says the money saved for the player can be used for records for the new machine.

The machine was presented to the school by Dwight Shaw, deputy commander of the Idaho wing division of the CAP, and was accepted on behalf of the school by David Fox, president of the cerebral palsy school parent's council.

Shaw says, "We tried to pick a worthwhile organization to which we could donate the machine and the unanimous choice of the staff was the cerebral palsy school." There are about 25 persons on the staff of the Idaho wing.

Mrs. Hattiffe says there are many uses to which a record player can be put in the school curriculum. It will provide background music for the school's rhythm band and music appreciation classes. Music plays an important role in the school's daily schedule. Providing music for physical education exercises and relaxation.

Mrs. Hattiffe says the machine probably will be used about 30 minutes a day. Students must be given the machine and used to provide oral lessons for students who have trouble reading, or have a slight problem. 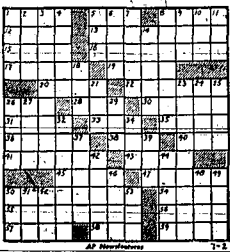
