

Powers Trial To Be Public, Russian Says

MOSCOW, July 5 (AP)—State Dept. officials here said today that the trial of Gen. Leonid Brezhnev will be held in public in a court rather than in a secret location.

Central Committee Secretary Kozlov said the trial would be held in public. He said the public would be admitted to the trial. He said the statements at the American embassy where he attended independence day celebrations.

Kozlov told newsmen he did not know how long the trial would go on for trial for espionage.

The announcement by the Soviet press came shortly after the arrival in Zurich, Switzerland, of a Soviet delegation led by Ambassador Anatoly Dobrynin. A court-appointed attorney for Rudolf Ivanov, a Soviet spy, was seen in a Zurich hotel.

Ivanov had indicated he would try to arrange a swap of POWs by meeting in Zurich with an East German official who has represented Albania. But he said yesterday that because of the tensions in the case he does not intend to arrange such a meeting since he believes it to be unnecessary for the being.

Powers was reported to be held in a Soviet prison. He was captured by Siberian agents after he was shot down near Vladivostok, Siberia, May 1.

New French, Algeria Talk Is Predicted

PARIS, July 5 (AP)—The French government expects to go through another round of preliminary dealings with Algerian rebel emissaries before Algerian talks to sound cease fire talks, authoritative sources reported today.

The sources said the French regard the rebel emissaries as more than a final rejection of French offers.

In the communique, the rebels demanded the French recognize their self-styled provisional government and convene a meeting between President De Gaulle and their Premier, Fernand Abbas on an equal basis.

The French already had rejected these terms in preliminary negotiations held in Melun.

However, the sources indicated they thought both sides might be in enough to permit the actual cease-fire talks to begin.

TUCKER'S NATIONAL WHIRLIGIG

WASHINGTON — The delay and possible defeat of several major measures in the house of representatives has started a serious movement for overhauling the legislative procedure in this dilatory branch of congress.

The demand for revision has reached unprecedented proportions because every blocked bill represents popular proposals favored by the Democratic leadership.

Small group of legislators will file the bill. — The measures in jeopardy through the hostility of only 12 of the 437 legislators proposed to be passed.

Although approved by the regular standing committees after months of wrangling, and also by a large majority of the members, they have been held up by a coalition of southern and Republican conservatives in the house.

This body is the traffic queue handling all legislation. Committee-approved measures may be rejected only by the whim of a reactionary majority on this all-powerful and tyrannical unit.

The seniority system — The chairman's rep. Howard Worth Smith and junior rep. Tom Sawyer, Democrat, are planning to hold committee meetings to act on legislation.

Another proposal that only 100 signatures be required for a petition and other committees to report measures to the floor for some kind of action.

Time for a change — The likelihood of revision increases because three presidential candidates have had personal and disillusioning experience with the house.

Finally, a presidential election generally means a change in the house personnel. It means a change in the leadership and a change in the attitude.

Consent is an issue — In proposing "no orderly program of amendment to keep up with the times," Portland's Mayor Terry Schiavone advised the city council.

It is also a serious question that if unincorporated areas lying in the upper portion of the city are to be annexed, the city will be compelled to seek the consent of property owners in the affected area.

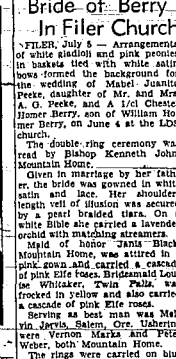
