Senator Kennedy's Demos State in East Backs Him

LOS ANGELES, July 11 (AP)—Sen. John F. Kennedy today practically clinched a first ballot victory in his surge toward the Democratic presidential nomination. The Massachusetts senator's drive got an all-powerful boost when Pennsylvania Gov. David L. Lawrence threw his support to Kennedy and announced that 61 of Pennsylvania's 81 electors have pledged to Kennedy. This bloc of votes gave Kennedy 238 1/2, fewer than the 271 needed for a majority. Lawrence's personal endorsement of Kennedy for the nomination crushed the hopes of Sen. Lyndon B. Johnson and Stuart Symington, Kennedy's chief rivals.
