TUCKER'S NATIONAL WHIRLIGIG POT SHOTS

WASHINGTON—An excessively strong civil rights stand by the Democratic party may backfire against them and their nominee in many sections of the country. It is the opinion of the author of this column that the same predicament will confront the Republicans.

Kennedy Will Delay Choice Of His Mate

LOS ANGELES, July 13 (AP)—The vice presidential hopes of three midwestern governors and a western senator all focus today on the choice of Kennedy's running mate.

Confidently, Kennedy also was considering Sen. Stuart Symington, Missouri Democrat, reported on the ticket. Symington has said he would accept the nomination if he was interested only in the presidential nomination.

The acknowledged candidates were Gov. Orville L. Freeman, Minnesota; Sen. George McGovern, Kansas; and Sen. Henry M. Jackson, Washington.

Kennedy indicated yesterday that he might put the choice of his running mate off until he had decided on his own nomination.

It was noted by political reporters that it is better strategy for a presidential candidate to have several names, thinking they might be tapped to run with him, than to let one know he cut it made, and disappointing all the rest.

Although a presidential nominee cannot write his own ticket, Kennedy is under a variety of pressures in making his selection.

The time-honored tradition of "ticket-balancing" dictated that Kennedy, a Catholic from New England, choose a running mate who is a Protestant from some other section of the country.

It also has long been considered desirable to have a running mate with a governor, but Kennedy was reported to feel that it would be a mistake to pick a governor.

Support Thrown

The three governors on Kennedy's list had working for them the fact that they had all won large parts of their state delegations to him early in the convention.

Each of the governors had to create a handwagon psychology in their own states. Kennedy's residence in the midwestern farm belt, which Kennedy is anxious to visit, was another factor.

Against them was the well-organized opposition of the other state delegations that their names would contribute little to the pull of Kennedy in the popular vote.

As one New York leader put it: "There's all the talk about their home states, but who ever heard of them in the East?"

Award Given To Man; His Work Lauded

LOS ANGELES July 13 (AP)—A brilliant scientist today received the nation's highest honor for an anticancer invention on which he is still classified as a top secret.

Rear Adm. Walter F. Rodeo, commander of 11th naval district headquarters at San Diego, was awarded the department's highest honor as the University of California at Los Angeles.

The 48-year-old scientist had fought for 18 years for his claim to the honor as of no significance to him today.

"I wouldn't be untruthful of me to say I was in an office yesterday," when the department was notified of the award, he said.

A year ago Dr. Halpern was in a hospital in a settlement of his injuries from a Latin American war as a result of a material that he used as a pilot and ships evade enemy attacks in World War II and the Korean conflict.

His Navy title is Work.

A theoretical physicist he developed his idea while working at the Massachusetts Institute of Technology in 1941 and it was put into use by the navy.

When he tried to patent his idea, a patenting official ruled that getting a patent would make his secret process public.

Khrushchev Seeks South America Trip

HAVANA, July 13 (AP)—Soviet Premier Nikita Khrushchev is planning for an unofficial visit to Latin America before he sets a definite date to visit Havana, Cuban officials said today.

Cuban officials recently returned from touring the Soviet Union. They have been saying Khrushchev would take up Premier Fidel Castro's invitation to visit Havana soon, possibly during the July 25 celebrations of the revolution's second anniversary.

However, the sources thought it likely the Russian leader wanted to have at least one more Latin American capital on his itinerary before undertaking such a long tour. It is indicated he himself recently by selling western newspapers in Moscow that he himself intended to visit the South American continent some day, but had not yet decided when.

In the past few days, government-controlled newspapers, labor union and other organizations have been abuzzing Khrushchev with letters of thanks for his promise to visit Cuba in the future with the United States.

The government failed to issue any such communique yesterday or Castro's progress in recovering from a milk case of pneumonia, it is believed, he still was operating at his home in suburban Ojnyan.

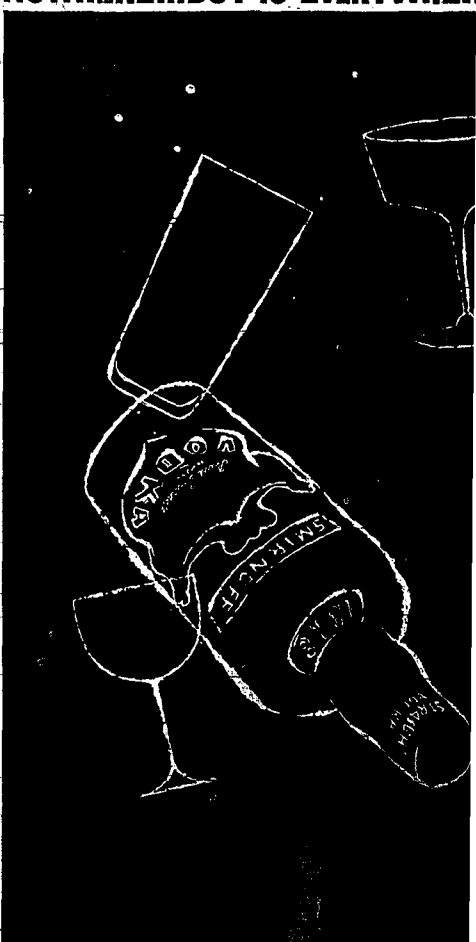

The day started with a debate between candidate Lyndon B. Johnson and John F. Kennedy. They met in a rooming house for their moral combat. The day ended at a convention hall with Democratic delegates fighting over civil rights. It was almost like old times.

Johnson, the gray fox of Texas, invited Kennedy to debate the issues. It proved to be a heart-warming meeting. There they were, Johnson and Kennedy, sitting each other, what, great, friends. They were, two old senate buddies, full of mutual admiration.

It was so moving you almost could see them huddle each other. But they did.

Both John and Lyndon Kennedy wondered out loud about candidates who don't enter politics. Johnson innocently remarked the importance of good senate attendance record, which Kennedy hadn't had lately.

Johnson made it his convention hall, the second session moved along with all the alacrity of a dog. Speakers got the same top attention Americans usually reserve for TV commercials.

Delegates Mill About The delegates milled in the aisles. They clustered around TV men clustering around cameras. They took pictures of each other posing with Franklin D. Roosevelt, Jr., and other celebrities to impress the folks back home. They called Frank Sinatra and Peter Lawford, who wandered around wearing buttons which said, "Buck-Roosevelts."

Temporary Chairman Frank Church, the boy senator from Idaho, booted the delegates to clear the aisles. They didn't. He got mad and threatened to call the cops. But the aisles remained clogged as if it were dollar-day at the circus.

Collins Has Hard Time But it was *Only* Lewis Collins, Florida, the permanent chairman, who had the toughest time holding off his audience. He stopped himself, pounded the gavel and begged the delegates to alight somewhere.

Then he was upstaged by Eleanor Roosevelt. Her husband brought a big roar while delegates turned their backs on Collins and away. 20-minute ovation.

Adlai is off the track at the convention so far. After getting in and out of the crowd at the convention headquarters, he said, "I know who will be nominated. It will be the last survivor."
