Two Local Safes Broken Open to Steal \$500 Cash

At least \$500 in cash and an undetermined amount of food, cigarettes and drugs were taken from the Okay Food store, 142 South Park avenue, sometime between 3 p.m. Monday and 7:30 a.m. Tuesday, according to police. Also being investigated Tuesday by Twin Falls police were break-ins at two doctors' offices at 676 30th avenue west. The office of Dr. E. E. Covington, 302 S. Third, was entered from a window in the second floor of the building. This was the second major burglary in Twin Falls, with the last one being the break-in at the Youngs drug store, 113 Fourth avenue west, and stole about \$300 in cash. Both burglaries are under investigation.

Police officers entered the office of Dr. L. E. Mowman, 423 Second avenue north, by connecting with the office. Except for 10 stamps taken from the dispensing office, nothing was missing. The office was ransacked, and a safe in the doctor's office was broken open. The office break-ins were reported on July 13.

At Least 8 Men Killed In Foggy Collision of 2 Navy Ships; 7 Hurt

NEWPORT BEACH, Calif., July 19 (UPI)—Two U. S. navy destroyers collided today in a heavy fog off the southern California coast, killing at least eight men. At least seven others were injured, according to the official navy report released in Washington. The navy said that the destroyer Collett hit the port side of the destroyer Ammen at 9:41 a.m. (PDT), about eight miles off the coast of this summer resort town. Located some 45 miles southwest of Los Angeles, seven of the dead and five of the injured were aboard the Ammen, which was anchored after the crash off Huntington beach, 15 miles up the coast. The dead and two injured were aboard the Collett, according to the navy. The Collett was reported to be proceeding east and was powered to the Long Beach naval yards. Its damage was limited to the bow, but the Ammen was listing at right angles to the port after its engine and fire control were destroyed.

New Fees Set Up for Trash Hauling Here

The Twin Falls city commission met today to set up a schedule for commercial trash and garbage haulers at the commission meeting on Monday.

Annual license fees were reduced from \$10 to \$5. However, new trucks will pay a \$1 a load fee for each truckload of trash deposited at the city sanitary landfill under previous regulation, the \$10 fee allowed them to dump trash in the city fill at no cost.

Fees for non-commercial trash trucks will be \$10 per year, 25 cents and \$1, depending on the amount of trash dumped.

The commission discussed the change after discussing the cost of maintaining the sanitary landfill. Manager Joseph H. Leland reported that the fill costs the city about \$100 per ton. The city also has six commercial haulers accounted for 70 to 80 per cent of the trash.

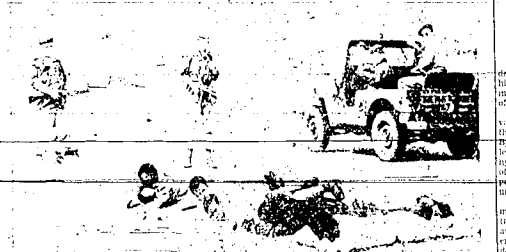

Report Shows Increases for T.F. Building

Total construction in Twin Falls for June was \$109,000, compared with \$102,495 last June for an 80 per cent increase from 1959, and \$117,520 in May of this year for a 63 per cent increase from May.

Building construction increased 14 per cent in total dollar volume of building permits in June according to the statistical department of the Building Savings and Loan Association.

Permitting for building permits in June totaled \$78 with 60 dollar volume reaching \$2,353,465, compared with \$2,256,400 recorded in May. This also was a one per cent increase over June, 1959.

Construction in June of this year amounted to \$244,800, compared with \$155,200 in June last year, for a 58 per cent increase over June, 1959, and \$176,700 in May of this year for a 37 per cent increase from May.

Total construction in Idaho was \$409,224 in June and \$413,485 for the same month last year, for a one per cent increase. Construction in Idaho for May this year was \$40,176,307 for a decrease from June this year of 12 per cent.

Twin Falls dwelling permits for June this year totaled \$639,000 compared to \$61,000 last year for a three per cent increase and \$77,000 in May this year for an 18 per cent decrease from May.

Permitting for building permits in June of this year totaled \$179,700 compared to \$90,700 this year for a 90 per cent increase, and \$9,200 in May this year for a 101 per cent increase from May.

Total dwelling permits in June of this year was \$10,285,200, compared with \$10,285,200 in May this year for a 20 per cent increase, and \$12,200 in May this year for a 32 per cent decrease from May.

Tests Set on New Device For Rescues

SOUTH WEYMOUTH, Mass., July 19—A Navy Neptune twin-engine bomber will take off in about a week for Point Barrow, Alaska—and a lonely ice island in the Arctic—test a new invention for rescuing men from mountain tops or floating ice packs.

The device, called a "air retriever," consists of a "Y"-shaped fork extension on the front of the plane, a helicopter balloon, and a length of nylon rope.

It is the invention of a Connecticut man, Robert Fulton, and is designed to make possible the retrieval of both men and equipment from areas otherwise inaccessible because of terrain or fog.

The procedure is for the party to be rescued to inflate the balloon. When the balloon has reached about 300 feet with its light, nylon rope attached, the plane will then catch a device which has been hooked up to the rope extending forward from the middle of the plane.

The man or the material attached to the line will be lowered to the ground. It is the invention of a Connecticut man, Robert Fulton, and is designed to make possible the retrieval of both men and equipment from areas otherwise inaccessible because of terrain or fog.
