WASHINGTON, July 20—President Eisenhower reported today to all for a policy of American officials. The president's remarks were reported in a White House at Newport, R. I., that the President had a personal go-ahead on this at a conference here yesterday with Secretary of State Dean Rusk and other key foreign policy advisers. We are not prepared to see a Soviet demand for a few hours earlier than we would have expected. The Soviet Union is a member of the United Nations and we are a member of the United Nations."

Lincoln White, state department spokesman, said the Moscow demand "degrades and almost totally nullifies the effect of U. S. aid to restore order in the Congo."

ABOARD THE USS OBSERVATION ISLAND, at Sea, July 20 (UPI)—The United States fired a Polaris ballistic missile today for the first time from a nuclear submarine in a complete success. The USS George Eastman, cruising 90 miles off the nation's coast, fired the missile from a tube in its hull at 12:14 p.m. (EST). The missile was launched in a "handmark"—a layer of Irishmen hammered the first link and a chain to bind the atomic submarine and the ballistic missile into a nuclear fire that will have 92 per cent of its tonnage carried by the warhead more than 3600 within a range at sea.

The test was an indication that Russia has the capability to match the depth of its mobile nuclear destructive power.

The historic spectacle, witnessed by naval officials and newsmen aboard the laboratory ship USS Observation Island less than one mile away, was launched in a "handmark"—a layer of Irishmen hammered the first link and a chain to bind the atomic submarine and the ballistic missile into a nuclear fire that will have 92 per cent of its tonnage carried by the warhead more than 3600 within a range at sea.

LEOPOLDVILLE, July 20 (UPI)—Congo Premier Patrice Lumumba declared today he would carry out his own policy of national unity and independence, and that he would not accept Soviet troops unless the United Nations security council declared tonight with his demand that Belgium withdraw its troops from the Congo. He said he would "make a decision on the immediate departure of the Belgians from this territory after the Congo has been declared a free republic."

Lumumba warned again he would appeal for military aid to Russia and other nations of the communist and Afro-Asian blocs.

He specified, however, he would wait until the outcome of tonight's security council meeting in New York beginning at 8:30 p.m. EDT before carrying out his demand.

Diplomats at the U. N. saw Lumumba's threat as an attempt to provoke the security council into meeting against Belgium.

In London, anti-colonialist westerners and African nationalists warmly welcomed the Belgian withdrawal from the Congo. They said the Congo would be a free republic.

Belgian troops were ordered to leave the Congo by the United Nations security council on July 13. Lumumba had announced an agreement last night for withdrawal of Belgian troops from the Congo.

Lumumba, who was facing mounting international criticism, told the press that he had decided to accept Belgian troops for troop aid until the full approval of Joseph Kasavubu, the president of the Congo.

Commissioner Okays Final Two Budgets

The 1960-61 administration and waterworks budgets tentatively were approved by city commissioners Wednesday at the final session in a series of four city budget sessions. 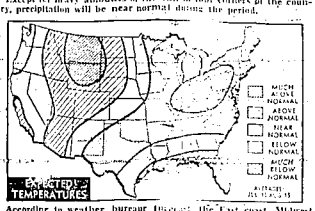
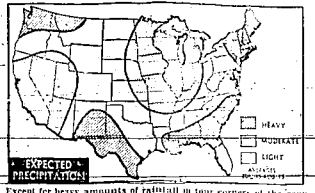
