# \$550 Missing in Fourth Safe Job For Last 9 Days

Burglars broke into the East Side Market, 561 Main avenue, on a hot, muggy Thursday night and forced open a safe, taking off with an estimated \$550. This is the fourth safe robbery in the Twin Falls area in the last nine days, and police say all apparently are the work of the same thieves. The safe robbery occurred in the store owned by Ralph Martin, shortly after 11 p.m. on Friday. The burglar went to the middle of the roof where he could not be observed from the street. He forced open the safe with a crowbar, taking \$550 in cash and jewelry. He dropped the tools through into the attic when he was finished.

Once in the attic, the burglar went north along the roof and entered the store through a trap door next to the meat counter.

Apparently an attempt to move the safe on a hand truck failed, and the thief of thieves moved a portable hook-and-ladder between the door and the safe. He then climbed the door back onto the roof and opened the safe, taking everything—except the money. Taken were \$300 in cash, a watch and a ring.

# He Hopes to Put Russians On Defensive

NEWPORT, R. I., July 22 (AP)—President Eisenhower's call for rearmament in the United States has been reported to be part of a U. S. strategy to put the Russians on the defensive.

The president announced last night that the United States was ready to meet any Soviet challenge for urgent discussion of a way out of the arms race.

In a statement issued at the summer White House, Eisenhower said he had instructed Ambassador Acheson to bring the Soviet proposal to the attention of the U. S. State Department, and to continue negotiations, if necessary, to a point where the United States is in a position to make a proposal.

"The United States is ready to return to the normal diplomatic relations through normal diplomatic channels," Acheson said.

He also said that the United States is ready to meet any Soviet challenge for urgent discussion of a way out of the arms race.

# Reds Gain... West's Fires Said 'Worst In 30 Years; Emergency Declared for Idaho Areas'

UNITED NATIONS, N. Y., July 22 (UPI)—Russia declared today that the "United States had been 'caught red-handed' in sending over Soviet territorial waters an RB17 reconnaissance plane shot down July 17 by Russian fighters," Soviet Deputy Foreign Minister Vyacheslav Molotov said in a dispatch to the Khabarovsk newspaper. He said the plane, downed near the Barents sea three weeks ago today, listened quietly in the public gallery of the U. S. security council.

Molotov said the plane, which the U. S. said was on an electronic survey mission, actually was sent into the air from the American base at Fairbanks, Alaska, to "detect the system of radar stations and other military installations in the Soviet territory." The Russian sought U. N. confirmation of "flag surveillance activity by the air force of the United States of America against the Soviet Union, creating a threat to international peace."

The United States insists that the RB17 was on a mission to collect intelligence on Soviet territorial waters.

# Removal of Belgian Troops Asked Again

UNITED NATIONS, N. Y., July 22 (AP)—The U. N. security council early today made its second demand in three days that Belgian troops get out of the Congo and Rwanda. The council, which had previously dropped an attempt to set a three-day deadline for withdrawal, Soviet Deputy Foreign Minister Vasily V. Kuznetsov joined in a unanimous vote for a Ceylonese resolution that called on Belgium to withdraw its forces within 48 hours from the two African republics. The resolution backed up the council resolution of July 13, which called for the withdrawal of Belgian troops from the Congo and Rwanda.

**TUCKER'S NATIONAL WHIRLIGIG**

WASHINGTON—The most clear-cut context between conservatism and liberalism, between the right and the left, was provided by the Nixon-Kennedy debate in the White House. The outcome may determine the course of the country for the next four years. This, of course, depends on Nixon's being elected, which is a foregone conclusion.

It may be assumed, is a foregone conclusion. It is generally believed that the Nixon platform will more aptly be the left of President Eisenhower's than the right of the Republican program, which he promised the country.

Under the pressure of the harsh realities, both foreign and domestic, inherent in the executive office, it is to be more precise, more realistic in the coming years of their term of office.

**ODD ALLIANCE ON DEMOCRATIC SIDE**—Raising the question of the Democratic Party's nomination, Vice President Johnson, Ambassador Johnson, and other Democrats, will take an entirely different view.

As an aside, this reporter is betting on the young John F. Kennedy, who has handled the Hunsens, well as the GOP's No. 2 man. Even though Senator Kennedy is the more prominent of the two, the Democrats can carry out their pledges because of the nomination of Johnson, who is being referred to in the old day State-Texas tieup. It may turn out that in selection of the liberal and able Senator Johnson, Sen. Kennedy may have indicated himself.

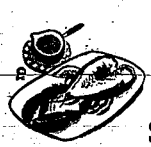

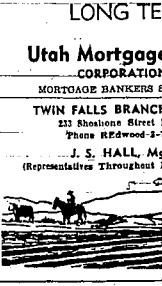

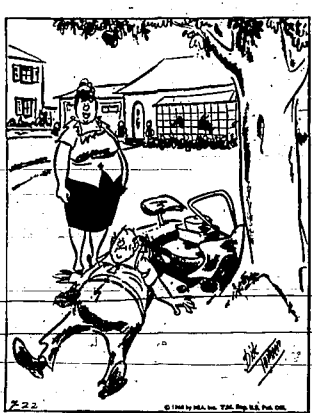
