Pilot's Body Turned Over To U. S. Men

MOHOCW, July 25. — The Soviet Union today turned over to U. S. officials the body of Capt. William A. Palmer, pilot of the RB47 shot down by the Russians July 1.

Seven Soviet infantry soldiers carried a wooden box containing Palmer's body to the airport. The Russians rejected a U. S. request to drive the casket with an American flag and refused to let Soviet military officials transport the body to the airport.

Transfer papers were signed by the U. S. and Russian officials inside the mosque.

A U. S. air force doctor, Maj. Don Meritt, said he had only the word of the Russians that it was the body of Palmer, Oak Ridge, Tenn.

Agreement Made by Nixon, Rockefeller Has Holes in It

CHICAGO, July 25. — Vice President Richard M. Nixon's audience and secret journey to New York City, Nixon A. Rockefeller — just three days before the Republican convention opened here today — was a mixed blessing.

The two men reached what they called an agreement but it turned out to be an agreement with big holes in it. It looked like a shrewd political maneuver at first. But it may prove to have a third hole.

It seemed at first that Rockefeller had put Nixon in his pocket but that Nixon had the governor in his pocket. But now that Nixon's hole is clear, Rockefeller is taking either a clear enough or strong enough stand on some issues.

Nixon therefore had had many ways to reach an understanding with Rockefeller.

Why he walked to do so until almost the last minute before the convention is still a mystery. The obvious answer seems to be he felt he badly needed Rockefeller's support or was afraid the governor's continued criticism might ruin him.

In the end Rockefeller issued what both men called an agreement on "basic positions." But as Nixon later disclosed in a news conference there were some major gaps in that agreement which didn't show up in the text.

They emphasize the agreement calls for strong defense efforts, Rockefeller feels the government should be spending immediately an additional \$1.2 million dollars. Nixon didn't agree on any money item. Neither does the defense plan approved yesterday by the party's national committee which has been working here a week.

Rockefeller thinks major strikes should be settled by compulsory arbitration. Nixon doesn't agree. Neither does the platform committee in the labor pact it signed and polished and presented to the public.

The sharp edge seemed to be removed from Rockefeller's attitude toward the platform — at least it appeared that way from his TV appearance yesterday — the Nixonites may feel the vice president captured the governor.

But the very fact Nixon made what his critics may call a pilgrimage to the New Yorker may be interpreted as meaning the governor captured him and made him bow to some extent to Rockefeller's party demands.

Sen. Barry Goldwater, Arizona, a friend of Nixon but also a representative of the Republican extreme right, called Nixon's trip "surrender" and a sellout to the "Republican-led" party.

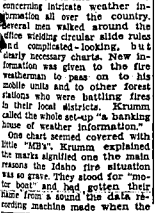

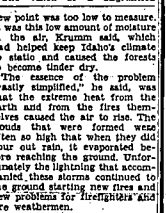

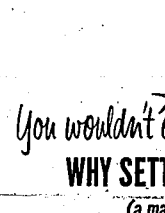

McGovern, 37, completing his first term in congress in the seat once held by Long's late brother, George S. Long, was equally confident of winning the runoff.

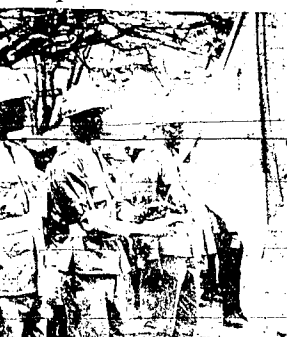

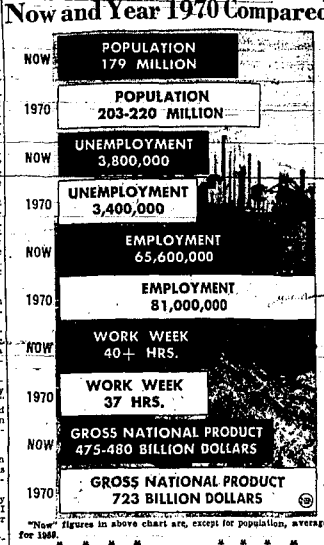

Experts' Study Paints Rosy Business Picture for '60's

WASHINGTON (NEA) — Worried about the next decade? Relax.

The nation's statisticians and economists have taken their charts, looked at their mathematical formulae, consulted with the census bureau, and come up with this cheering news:

So many young couples will be getting married and having babies in the 1960's that the nation's factories, stores, beauty parlors and filling stations, auto, home, furniture, doctor, lawyer and almost every one else will be busy just keeping up with the business.

Some 4,000 assorted economists and statisticians met here recently to try out some of their ideas and predictions on each other. These are not the views of all 4,000. Probably no two men seen agree, predicting an anything.

Rather, this is a sort of consensus of representative economists, reached by men who have been studying what's ahead.

Specifically—by 1970—

The U.S. will have a population of between 200 million and 220 million.

Employment will be up around \$1 billion to \$2 billion. Unemployment will be about 3.4 million.

The average work week will be only 37 hours.

The gross national product—the total production of goods and services—will be up about 50 per cent to 75 billion dollars.

New homes will be built at an average rate of one and a third million a year all during the 1960's, compared with only a million predicted for 1960.

16 in dollars, new homes will be built at the rate of almost 25 million dollars a year, compared with 18 million dollars expected for 1960. The average home will be a little bigger, and more expensive.

There'll still be recessions in the 60's—around every four years or so. But they'll be mild, more on the order of the 1958-59 recession—or a little more severe.

Don't expect any big booms like that of 1929 and the early 1930's.

Consumer inflation will continue. Even if successive administrations attempt more and more controls, these won't stop it.

Local facility will continue to expand. So will company pension plans—also unemployment compensation programs.

A surplus surplus of unskilled labor 1960's for the 60's. There will be more labor, unskilled, and labor turnover—due in part to the flooding of younger people into the labor market as a result of the baby boom that started two decades ago.

The average wage will be about \$4.00 a week. The average will hit close to 12 million a year in the

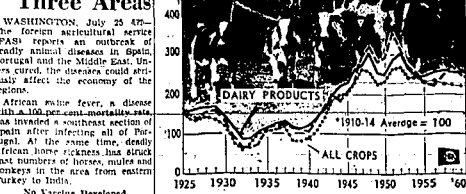

Care of Your Children

Parents and camp counselors, those who take children to the country's open fields and woods, who teach their children about some of the evils about some of the evils that are when they teach children to swim, color and coolness.

The first lesson should be the story of that poison that can do the unsavory. The next one, identifying the poisonous vine, so pretty, so much like the harmless ivy, is creper, the wondrous that that sends their bites if they do not touch it is the prescription for safety.

Poison oak and sumac are the most common. They are alike in the harm they can do, when they look like, where they are likely to be found and always the warning, "Don't touch!" is the prescription for safety.

It is very much easier not to get into the bushes, burn, red-top plants on it has taken hold. Because anyone who has ever been in charge of a group out for a picnic, you know that it is not safe to get himself infected, he should take along a supply of equipment—along with the picnic basket, a first aid kit, a brown soap, common hand soap.

Before turning his charges loose in field or forest, he should teach them to take his face and arms with his soap, his face, of course, are protected by their clothing. He had good stout shoes on his feet, no sneakers. Once the trip is over, he should take them back to the scrub with warm water, the hotter the better. This usually takes 20 to 30 minutes.

One thing more about this matter of safety. What about drinking water? Unless the water is known that there is pure water at that place, it is well to be carried along. It is unsafe to drink of "brooks," even some springs, unless their purity is well known.

Taking a group of children for an outing is no easy chore. All sorts of unexpected things can happen. A child can be hurt. Take along a first aid kit along. A first aid kit can be a lifesaver. Make certain his name, address and father's name, is saved into his pocket, not for getting his home telephone number. Lost children can forget their own names, much less can they remember such essential details as their home address.

After attending to such little items of safety, go ahead and have fun.
