Nkanyu said the increase of joblessness in the nation of more than 13 million is catastrophic. Many factories and business establishments are closed for lack of competent supervision.

Missionary Certain 1960 Pennies Are Worth Much

WASHINGTON, July 25—Are you taking a close look at your pennies? They may be worth their weight in gold.

Eagle-eyed coin experts have put a value of 45 or more on a million of 1960 pennies because of a flaw in the metal.

Ben Douglas, a leading numismatist here, told UPI the irregular shape of the new pennies is the most item in the coin business.

The pennies are valuable because in the 1960's under Abraham Lincoln's wharves, the "50" is smaller than the "100" is.

Eagle-eyed coin experts have put a value of 45 or more on a million of 1960 pennies because of a flaw in the metal.

Dr. John A. Mather, chief of the preventive medicine section, said this disease results to the gastro enteric disease brought about by the growth of disease organisms in food that is not properly prepared or stored correctly after preparation.

Especially during warm weather, he said, food that is to be used either at home or on a picnic should be kept under refrigeration. Contaminated food left at room temperature or above provides a very good incubating place for disease organisms. Ham, potato salad and cream pie are especially susceptible, he said.
