Message Via Moon Is Sent Across U. S.

HOLMDELL, N. J., Aug. 4 (AP)—"It's well, you can hear me?" "Yes, you're coming in fine." These words, beamed back and forth last night over the 480,000 miles of space between a New Jersey hilltop, the moon and the California desert.

Somehow carried on a two-way radio-television conversation between New Jersey and California by way of the moon to demonstrate how easy Earth communication can be used for easy Earth communication.

Satellite Plan Supported

It was not the first time they had performed the feat. But it backed up recent plans filed by the Bell Telephone system with the federal communications commission asking for 50 space satellites circling the Earth to provide quick world wide communications.

After the contact had been tried by voice, the scientists beamed to California the recorded strains of America the Beautiful.

Experiment Takes Hour

The entire conversation took more than an hour. The first signal got through soon after the moon rose in a line of sight of both stations.

It took three seconds for the radio waves, traveling at the speed of light—186,000 miles a second—to travel from James to the moon and bounce back to the gigantic 60-foot radio ears at the California Institute of Technology's jet propulsion laboratory station at Goldstone.

The same was true of the reply from Walter K. Victor at the laboratory. So, was six seconds to return James's question and his hearing the reply.

45 Counties Gain 100 Per Cent or More

WASHINGTON, Aug. 4 (AP)—The census bureau has reported that 45 of the 48 counties in Idaho gained population increases of 100 per cent or more since 1920. Elmore county, 192, was sixth in the nation with a gain of 118 per cent. Its population is 15,777.

The bureau's report, based on 1947 statistics, also shows that 19 of the nation's 3,072 counties have populations of less than 100 persons each.

Low county on the list is Hinsdale county, Colo. Its population has shrunk from 1,629 in 1920 to 218 this year. Camas and Clark counties, Ore., have lost 98 and 91 per cent, respectively.

Four Murder Cases Puzzle Officials Yet

An end may be near in the search for a solution to the murder of a Portland, Ore., doctor in southern Idaho last summer, but four other Gem state murders still puzzle officials.

Chooching county officials went to California with a murder warrant for Roger J. Hall, 22, in connection with the death of Dr. John Hunt's body was found last Aug. 23, near Miles, Ore. He had been robbed and shot to death.

4 Murders Unsolved
Still no news a murder was the murders-of-three men and a woman in southern Idaho this past year.

Latest of the mysteries was the death of Kenneth R. Roberts, 22, Friday Harbor, Wash., whose body was found near Montpelier last Thursday. His car was later found abandoned at Logan, Utah.

Roberts' body was found about 10 miles from a town near Montpelier where the body of marine Pfc. Wayne Siegel was found Sept. 2, 1959. Siegel's blood-spattered car had been found about a month earlier near Florence in the Snake area.

No Breaks
So far, officers said there have been no breaks in the Siegel case. The third male victim, Mr. Alfio C. Darnon, a highway construction worker who was found dead in his car Sept. 21, 1959, south of Blackfoot.

The fourth victim, and the only woman among those killed, was Mrs. A. Estel. She was shot to death Oct. 19, 1959, in a store operated by she and her husband at Idaho City.

Mrs. Estel was slain while her husband went to their near-by home to answer the telephone. When he returned, he found her slumped across the chest and the cash register rifled.

Ocean Is Still Mystery; Attack Is Possible

Lack of Knowledge About Sea Leaves U.S. Open to Sub Attack, Experts Say

NEW YORK (NEA) — In the wake of the successful launching of Polaris missiles from a submerged U. S. submarine, some experts warn of dangers from ocean study.

No one else apparently has explored this submerged-thing problem yet. But it is just a matter of time until a potential enemy has it.

Meanwhile our lack of knowledge about the sea leaves us prey to this kind of attack. We are still largely in the dark overall and submarine warfare—especially in detection and hunting of undersea craft.

Lack of understanding of the ocean makes beyond our shores is still forcing us to spend too much money and energy to go too far distances deep under water.

We are not tied to large nuclear-carrying powered craft which cost upward of 100 million dollars.

And, should we survive to live in peace, plenty and one-population, we are still unable to harvest the vast material and food resources of the ocean and its floor.

These are the points made by spokesmen at the Trident corporation, a leader in the handling of engineering firms now working under government programs of these problems.

Top priority on the list obviously goes to anti-submarine warfare—the ability to hunt, spot and kill enemy boats. But in the words of one department expert: "Today we are still like a blind man with a seeing eye dog, a canard at a dinghoo in unknown waters where defense and law because nobody else appears to be any farther ahead. It is no reason to take conceit."

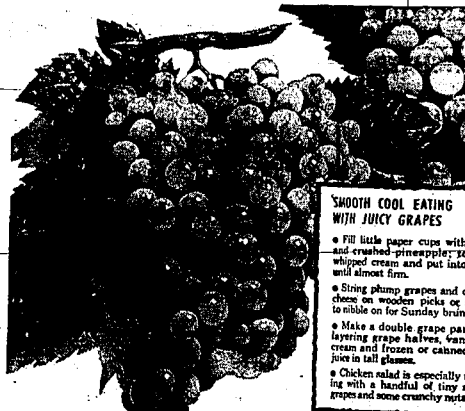

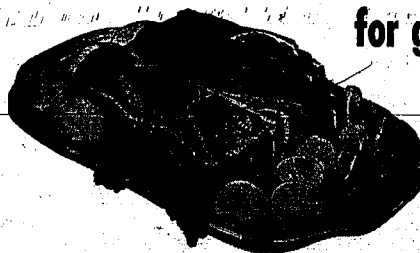
