STILL MORE GOOD NEWS No doubt about it, things are looking up around Twin Falls, with many of the benefits extending throughout Magic Valley.

First, in a special bond election, the voters of Twin Falls decided the city will have a permanent manager for the city.

Then Armour and company announced definite plans for a new meat processing plant near the U. S. highway 30 corridor east of Hansen.

The plant will buy and slaughter 1,000 to 1,300 cattle and 6,000 hogs weekly, in what promises to be a real boon to the livestock industry throughout Magic Valley.

When it goes into operation approximately a year hence, this new industry will employ around 100 people.

Now comes the announcement by the U. S. department of agriculture of a new \$500,000 water management laboratory to be constructed near Kimberly.

The construction of this laboratory will make Twin Falls and Magic Valley the center of water management research in Idaho, Oregon and Washington.

In addition to the \$650,000 appropriation for this laboratory facility, an act of congress has earmarked an annual budget of \$820,000 for research officials to carry out their work.

It is noted that the Magic Valley farmers and ranchers who will derive special benefit from these new laboratory facilities, in seeking solutions to their irrigation and water control problems.

The type of personnel heading up all this experimental work will be a valuable addition to our society in many respects, from both a social and economic standpoint.

As the Times-News has pointed out in reference to the success of the sewer bond election, the Armour company announcement, the Twin Falls Chamber of Commerce played a little part in these achievements.

It also should be brought out for everyone's enlightenment that the Chamber of Commerce and its industrial committee were quite active during all the negotiations leading up to the final selection of sites for the soil and water research management laboratory.

Inasmuch as this laboratory will serve the three states mentioned, it's easy to understand why Oregon and Washington made strong bids to have these special government facilities located in those states instead of Idaho.

It was nearly a year and a half ago that the Twin Falls Chamber of Commerce became aware that such a laboratory would eventually be located in one of these Pacific Northwest states.

All points had little or no part in the selection of a location, many contacts had to be made with our representatives in Washington to make sure that Twin Falls or Magic Valley was given proper consideration.

About a year ago, with all that in mind, the Twin Falls Chamber prevailed upon Carl D. Irwin, former senator from Twin Falls county, to volunteer his services in making such contacts with our representatives in congress and officials of the U. S. department of agriculture.

This combination offered very assistance possible in setting forth all the advantages this section of the state had to offer for the location of the laboratory.

It has taken a long time and a lot of hard work for our chamber's efforts to bear fruit, but at least this determination is being put to pay handsome dividends, for which we all should be grateful.

One particularly good thing to come at least, there is still a good possibility of other projects materializing before too long—projects on which the Chamber of Commerce also has been active at work.

Things are looking up, and that's good news for everyone living in south central Idaho.

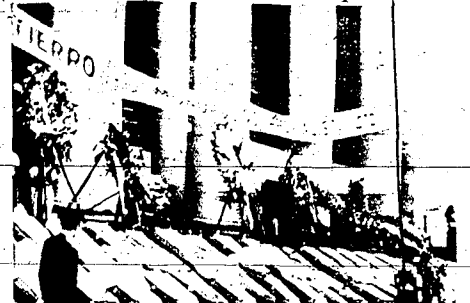

Perkins pointed out 50 per cent of the accidents resulting in highway deaths in 1956 have been due to human error.

"Of this 50 per cent," the police superintendent said, "60 per cent are the cause of human error, usually which can't be traced to the driver's error in the use of mechanical parts of the vehicle."
