About the most to expect is that conditions disturbing the peace in the Caribbean area will be spotlighted and outside intervention in western hemisphere affairs will be condemned. This will, of course, mean Russian communist "interference" in Cuba, but it won't be mentioned that bluntly.

The hope is that the San Jose resolutions will still be strong enough to make the Cuban people realize that they are being isolated in the western hemisphere, and that this will cause them to take action to change their government.

Recent pronouncements of the Castro hierarchy in Cuba, warning the Castro government that it must reject communism, preserve

The fact of the matter is that it is only now becoming fully apparent to many Latin Americans that the Castro revolution is something of a fraud as a movement of liberation intended to raise the standards of living on a broad scale. The idea that it is a fraud did not really begin to dawn until Khrushchev made his July 9 pronouncement. He said then that the USSR would support the Castro regime with rockets. He declared that the Monroe doctrine was dead as a basis for U.S. domination of Latin America.

This really woke the Latin Americans. For if Cuba falls under communist domination, any other republic may be next. This is the underlying problem which the OAS foreign ministers conference must face up to, though it isn't stated that plainly in their agenda. So this is a supreme moment for the inter-American system, if it is to broaden its responsibilities under existing hemisphere political, economic and defense alliances.

But Latin American experts now feel that it will take other conferences and other actions, later, to achieve results.

POLITICAL ENIGMA
Sen. Ezra Kefauver, who has won his way back to the senate for another six years, is one of the country's most unusual political phenomena.

How he came to fame was in 1948 when he beat the well-known Crump machine in Tennessee to win elevation from the house to the senate.

Afterwards he built a national reputation with his celebrated crime hearings across the country. With the help of television he was, in 1952, virtually a household name.

Kefauver caught that year to convert his gains by entering a host of Democratic presidential primaries. At the time he defeated Sen. President Truman in New Hampshire and went on to sweep the field.

This brought him to Chicago with unprecedented votes, a good deal but far short of the number needed for nomination. He couldn't get the rest of the way.

Four years later he had enough residual strength to try again. He was defeated by Adlai Stevenson in Minnesota. But in three subsequent tests—in Florida, Oregon and California—Stevenson turned the tables. He defeated Kefauver in each of the states for vice president in 1956.

When the Stevenson-Kefauver ticket was crushed, the general feeling was that Kefauver's liberal attitude was a political defect. Yet even into 1960 his holdover strength showed up in opinion polls, often placing him higher than several newer and younger candidates.

Probably his day in the presidential limelight has indeed passed. He could never surmount his big hurdle: The party professionals of both North and South generally wanted no part of him.

In 1959 they felt he had earned the running mate's spot and would help the ticket. But that was the extent of their interest in him.

His third term triumph in Tennessee assures him a place in the picture until 1963. But it will never gain the same exposure. Since he is a moderate in many ways, Tennessee's resounding support of him most likely amounts to re-affirmation that he is still one of the country's many faces, including civil rights.

He will be extremely risky to conclude this result, however, that he can control South trends to similar endorsement to the Democratic national ticket in November. That story is yet to be told.

AGING, REFOULING LIBERALS—Ranged against the party leadership is a powerful group of national leaders, headed by Sen. Charles McNair, ex-Gov. Herbert H. Lehman and ex-Air Force Secretary Thomas K. Pinchett. They have been in the prime mover in the state to Adlai Stevenson in Los Angeles.

But the feeling, Rubin and fighting is much older than that. The four-year Democratic party and organization they have rebuilt the political machine. They have been in the prime mover in the state to Adlai Stevenson in Los Angeles.

With this political situation within the Democratic party, Mayor Wagner and ex-Governor Hartman have had the Democratic party of Oregon to which Wagner has been the disgraced job of trying to push through his legislative program, his broken trail of party unity.

MAJOR WAGNER WAITS—The mayor, whose previous endorsement of Senator Kennedy was far from enthusiastic, has adopted a sort of "wait and see" attitude. He will forcefully announce that he is the real leader of the state and that he will not be moved by the McGovern-Hartman gesture of offering him the job of treasurer of Oregon and walk thus far. He has mostly just waited.

To compound this political neutralization, the Kennedy forces, who fear both twisting the McGovern-Hartman ticket, and thus run the risk of losing the state, have hit upon an ideal political citizen for Kennedy committee. This will prove as hard as the McGovern-Hartman who are actually personally with Stevenson and historically back in the new deal. But it may give the state to Nixon.

MESSHIAH VERSUS PROFESSIONALISM—The committee, headed by the three-defeated Anthony Aker, the Jim (Bill Stocking) congressional district, has a Hercules task before it. A brief analysis will be given.

To the reformer, with its heavy preponderance of liberal intellectuals, Stevenson had an almost Messianic appeal. The messiah "professionalism" of Tammany was anathema. The doing of the favor, the getting of the job and the maintenance of a political powerhouse can be contrasted with the national purpose, the philosophical meanings and the exhortation of the reformers. Since Governor Stevenson is no longer the Messiah, he has settled for the role of precursor—hoping to make straight the crooked paths of interest, greed, selfishness, and so partly to keep this element loyal, and that is more important, willing to live in November.

Senator Kennedy hints, though he does not say that, that Adlai would be a fine secretary of state. He would have to have his immediate drawers inspected, has used his followers to help. If these liberal Stevenson supporters and reform elements stay away from the polls on election day, the McGovern-Hartman will be the balance of power in New York City.
