### Firefighters Are Getting Best Of Major Forest Fires in West

Firefighters were getting the best of the West's major blazes today. In California and western Nevada, rangers expressed hope of containing two huge blazes along the Sierrita Nevada. In the Black Hills of South Dakota, three forest fires were contained late Tuesday by 500 men using borate bombers and bulldozers. In the north-west corner of Nebraska, 100 firefighters controlled a 1,000-acre blaze that had been raging since Sunday.

The worst of the fires were along the eastern slope of the Sierrita Nevada in California, where more than 70,000 acres of timber and brush were burned. More than 100 million bushels of lumber—enough to build 5,000 average-sized houses—were lost.

The best news from the Sierra was reduced winds and increased humidity. Flames broke out in a canyon for a while Tuesday but were contained quickly.

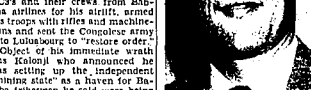

### Idaho Forest Condition Is Claimed OK

BOISE, Aug. 24 (AP)—Millions of acres of Idaho forests remain in good condition even after this summer's fire outbreaks.

Idaho state forest officials indicated that neither the lumber supply nor wood reserves have been severely affected by this year's rash of forest blazes. No reductions in cutting have been ordered despite the more than 100,000 acres of timberland destroyed this summer.

As State Forester Bruce Guernsey put it: "I don't look to minimize the situation but our losses of timber are not as great as Guernsey explained Idaho had been fortunate in some respects. Of all the fires in the Green state this year, only the Minnera creek-Triana creek blazes near Idaho City in July caused most of its destruction in valuable timber.

Because the Boise national forest is an example, it turned out that the fire, which burned in the area surrounding Boise for a full year.

### Ship May Be Armed With New Missile

WASHINGTON, Aug. 24 (AP)—Development of the first U. S. nuclear-powered cruiser is 18 months behind schedule. But the navy hopes to meet its embarrassment by substituting its embankment with a solid gain by testing the design for the ship with Polaris in the water.

It was learned yesterday that the submarine Long Beach, once scheduled to join the fleet in the middle of this year, now is slated to be commissioned in June, 1962. The estimated cost of the ship, which has a nuclear reactor, anti-aircraft and anti-submarine missiles, has increased from 200 million dollars to 300 million dollars.

A proposal is now under consideration in the Pentagon to delay completion of the ship somewhat longer and so the Polaris missile program. If this is approved, the Long Beach would become the first surface missile cruiser at strategic enemy bases. Construction at Bethlehem Steel's Newport, Mass., plant is under way. The ship is the most expensive U. S. ship. Adapting it to handle the Polaris missile will cost an estimated \$100 million more, making it considerably more expensive than a conventional missile-powered aircraft carrier.

The Polaris missile was designed for launching from submarines and the first two missile subs, George Easton and Francis B. Ford, will go to sea late this year.

But the navy has made no secret of its wish that the Long Beach could be converted to a missile cruiser. The department wanted to see the Polaris work in submarines first.

### Western Electric Hookup Opposed

SACRAMENTO, Calif., Aug. 24 (AP)—A proposal for an early start on a high-capacity power line to serve California and the Pacific Northwest ran into stiff opposition at a hearing on the subject today. The state senate fact-finding committee on water heard opposition from:

1. Spokesmen for Oregon and Washington, who said the plan for a California canal and the whole idea of an inter-idee need be studied. They also said they guarantee that the Northwest will receive adequate power to meet its own needs.

2. The Pacific Gas and Electric company, which wants to build its own inter-idee line, and other private power companies, which said tapping power will slow development of local power sources.

3. California legislators and local agencies who fear the impact of power might take the market to over the state needs.

### Range Reduction To Be Discussed

CALDWELL, Aug. 24 (AP)—The Idaho Game and Fish Commission will discuss the future of the livestock industry as a result of grazing cuts by the bureau of land management and the U.S. forest service when the group meets here tomorrow night.

Association President Martin Green, Caldwell, said the organization "is providing an opportunity for the cattle producer to explain his problems resulting from reduction of available range."

He added that "the impact of grazing cuts on the future supply of Idaho feeder cattle and the effect on economy of the communities concerned also would be discussed."

### Philippine Flood Relief Is Started

MANILA, Aug. 24 (AP)—The biggest disaster relief program in the Philippines since World War II was to be fully swung today as American troops left most of their equipment in provinces at the mercy of flood waters, breaking a dam in the province, destroying other rivers and causing a major epidemic and thousands of villages are being hit by last week's monsoon.

About 80 towns were reported flooded.

### New Process Makes Fresh Water Better

LOS ANGELES, Aug. 24 (AP)—Two university engineers have developed a new desalting filter which they say can produce drinkable water from brackish water at a rate of eight gallons a day for each square foot of membrane area.

Sidney Lorb and Dr. Srinitava Sourinjan of the University of California, Los Angeles, say their synthetic film yields consumable water at the rate of eight gallons a day for each square foot of membrane area.

Membranes have been used before to desalt water, but the engineers say that so far such filters are too slow for commercial purposes.

Their membrane is produced by making cellulose acetate with a water solution of ammonium perchlorate and acetone. This sticky mixture is spread on a glass plate and, when dry, is stripped away in a film less one-thousandths of an inch thick.

It is cheap, durable and can be used 24 hours a day without maintenance or power, the engineers said. They say they have made potable water from brackish water containing 5/25 per cent salt concentration, which is much saltier than ordinary ocean water.

The 72-year-old millionaire hotel man from Chicago drew a four-year extension of the office he has held eight years. An anticipated battle for the IOC's top job failed to materialize. Thus, the games should open Thursday with their usual pomp and circumstance, without a major background of political bickering.

### Official Asks Farm Labor Issues Study

BOISE, Aug. 24 (AP)—The chief of Idaho's employment service urged residents of the state yesterday to seek a better understanding of the problems of the migrant workers, described as a necessary part of the state's largest industry.

"Were it not for the temporary labor the state receives at the proper time to care for and harvest the crop," said H. Fred Garrett, executive director of the employment security agency, "our agricultural economy would be confined to a limited variety of crops with resultant loss in farm income and subsequent loss in the channels of trade."

**Brochure Prepared**

Garrett made the statement in a 20-page brochure prepared for distribution to libraries, schools, civic and farm groups.

"He said the brochure was prepared by the lack of understanding on the part of so many people of the necessity of bringing in the migrant farm workers."

In addition, he said, there is a widespread misunderstanding of the nationality of the workers. Most are of Mexican descent although they are citizens of the United States. Many can speak only Spanish.

**Error Pointed Out**

"Many people," Garrett said, "think these are Mexican citizens, but they are not. It is important that we realize that they are American citizens, just as we are."

Garrett said he hoped the brochure would be effective in promoting that understanding. He said it is intended, too, to acquaint farmers with the steps necessary to obtain a supply of migrant workers.

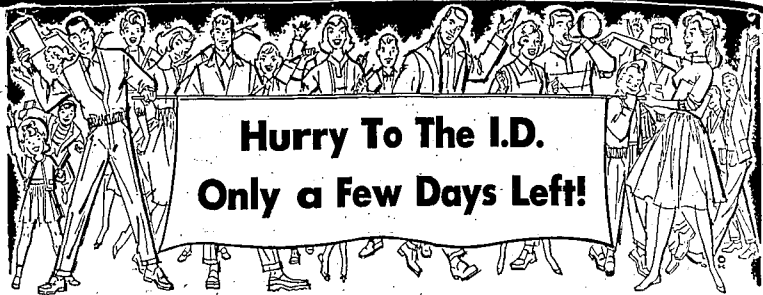

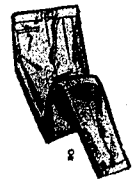

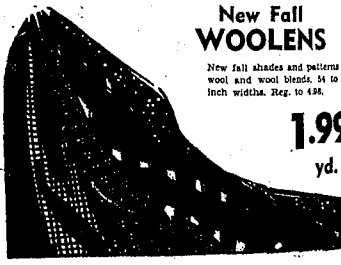
