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Khrushchev Plans to Bring Russia's Delegates to U.N.

MOSCOW, Sept. 1 (UPI)—Premier Nikita Khrushchev will lead the Soviet delegation to the United Nations general assembly session in New York today. The next session of the general assembly meets in New York starting Sept. 20. It was not immediately announced whether Khrushchev would arrive at U.N. headquarters, Khrushchev's traveling party to New York will include Foreign Minister Andrei Gromyko, Deputy Premier Valerian Zorin, the Soviet ambassador to Britain and the Soviet ambassador to France, plus a large group of experts.

Khrushchev expressed concern over the possibility of a summit conference between the two superpowers. He said in connection with the general assembly that the western powers have not agreed to send their heads of government with their delegations to the United Nations. But President Eisenhower announced he will attend the assembly.

The Soviet government has requested permission to discuss disarmament by the U.N. committee. The Soviets also want the problem of disarmament directly in the general assembly.

The importance of the U.N. assembly is indicated by Khrushchev's statement that the general assembly will lead their delegations. The announcement of Khrushchev's scheduled trip to New York came only half an hour after the scheduled departure of the plane to Moscow, Monday.

He returned to Moscow, Monday from a trip to New York and other cities in the United States. He is expected to leave for New York on Sept. 20.

Reports from the state department indicate that Khrushchev's trip to the United States is possible. It is possible that Khrushchev will visit the United States in the near future. It is not clear if there is any chance of a summit conference between the two superpowers.

Idaho Relies Upon Income Tax Revenue

BOISE, Sept. 1 (UPI)—Idaho relies more heavily upon the income tax for state revenue than any other western state except Oregon. The Associated Taxpayers of Idaho reported yesterday that the state collects 30 percent of its total revenue by a similar levy.

The income tax law brings in 12.79 percent of Idaho's total state revenue and 14.09 percent comes from the state's income tax. The property tax produces 2.3 percent of the total. Only four states—Wyoming, Alaska, Montana and Missouri—rely more heavily upon the federal government, the report said.

"Idaho's income tax rate on individual incomes, from 3 to 9.2 percent, is among the highest in the West but still below the first 48 states which range from 4.25 to 9.2 percent in New Hampshire. The report said total state tax receipts for 1959 were \$100,000,000, a 160 percent increase during the fiscal year, ended June 30, 1959.

"Lower rates, the report added, would result in a loss of \$100 million a year from the state's income tax revenue.

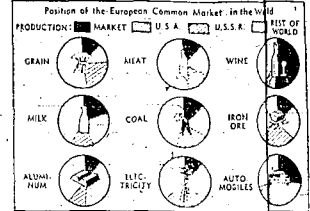

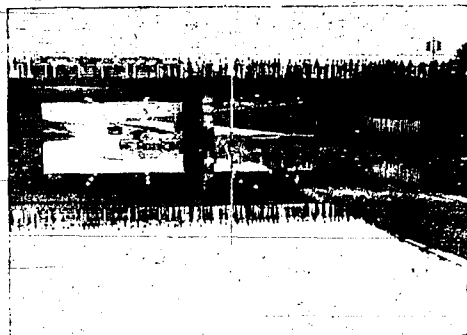

Blood Chairman Announces Plans

Medical Care Plan Designed To Aid 12.4 Million Citizens

By JOE HALL
WASHINGTON, Sept. 1 (AP)—The medical care plan for needy persons over 65 which now has cleared congress is designed to aid 12.4 million Americans with their health costs.
That is 70 per cent of the 17.5 million persons over 65 in the nation. Sponsors concede, however, that the degree of help may vary widely, and there's no way of knowing how many actually will be helped.
That is because, while the federal government stands ready to put up hundreds of millions of dollars for the program, it is entirely up to the states, up or not.
Thus an elderly individual would like to know how he might benefit from the program. He must look to his statehouse for the answers—particularly to the state administrator of the public assistance welfare programs in his state.
The plan is contained in a compromise social security bill sent to President Eisenhower by congress Monday. He is considered sure to sign it.
The medical care provisions could take effect Oct. 1 under the act, but this will depend on how the states must obtain the general approval of the secretary of health, education and welfare.

to keep them off the assistance rolls, the bill authorizes unlimited federal funds—amounting to 20 per cent—matching formula.
Social security administration, experts estimated that the federal agency would be 200 million the first year, with the states putting up 100 million.
However, the plan would work out to that many states would not have to pay out anything to get the extra aid and assistance from the federal fund, at least at the outset.
That is because they now are paying medical bills for the aged more recipients in excess of federal matching grants. Thus these states can—and government experts think they will—continue their present level of payments but cut down their share of the cost as the new federal money takes over a bigger portion.
As to the new program, for the 10 million persons, the social security program of providing medical bills of an estimated 10 million persons who are not on a "very-modest" scale in many states, but whose incomes are inadequate to take care of all of their health expenses.
For the first part, the federal government will participate in an additional amount, equal to 42 per cent, with the largest share going to states with lowest per capita income. The federal matching on this sum would be 50 to 40 per cent, with the largest share going to states with lowest per capita income.

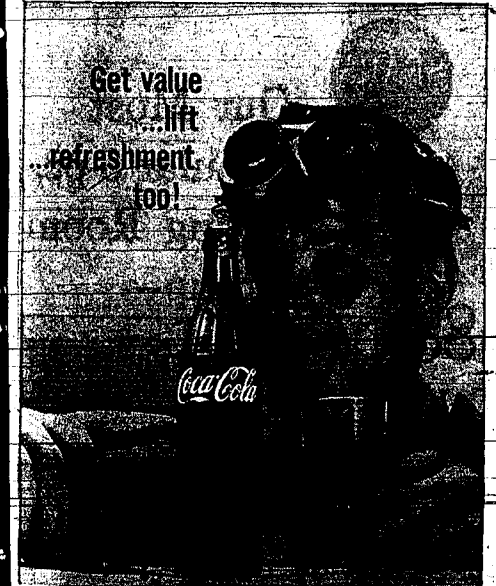

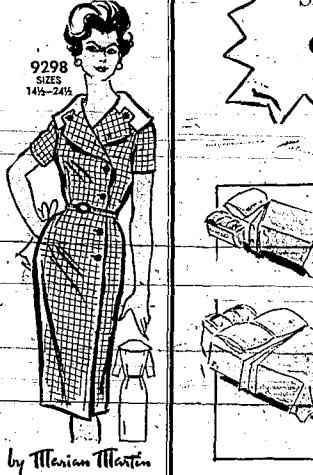

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Owens Doesn't Mind Seeing Marks Broken

ROME, Sept. 1 (AP)—The rise of a new and phenomenal generation of record-making track champions has left no part of the heart of Jesse Owens, the six-time great of America's Olympians.

"I feel like a father who has seen his children succeed in school," the brilliant Ohio State athlete of the 1930s said today.

"It gives me a wonderful sensation to watch them win and to know up new records. I feel that I have had a part of it."

It was Owens who on an unforgettable afternoon, May 25, 1935, at Ann Arbor, Mich., set four records within the space of an hour. One of them—the broad jump record—endured until Ralph Boston bettered it a couple of weeks before the opening of these 1938 Olympic games.

In 1936 games at Berlin, with Hitler goose-stepping toward a world war II, the little Negro from Cleveland won four gold medals in an amazing one-man show. He won the 100 and 200 meter races, the broad jump and shared in the sprint relay.

His records in the 100 (10.3 seconds) and the broad jump (6 feet, 5 inches) still are the targets of the world's present stars during the next ten days.

"As my records fell, one by one, I found myself with mixed emotions," Owens said.

"At first, I was resentful it was being beaten by a boy and a younger man. For many years—then having it suddenly snatched away."

Woodling's honor in the fourth inning was the second of his four in the first eight scoreless relief innings. He also extended his streak of hitting 10 straight games.
