Eric Kolmann, a quick sketch artist from Seattle, Wash., will be at the Twin Falls fair and rodeo Wednesday through Saturday, drawing architecture and sketches.

Kolmann's equipment consists of a few artist's pens, a stool, an overhead projector and a large screen. The projector allows the audience to watch the picture take shape as Kolmann sketches his subject.

Airliners to Be Grounded For Saturday

WASHINGTON, Sept. 6 (AP)—Six million airplanes in the United States and Canada will be grounded for 24 hours Saturday during a dress rehearsal of defenses against Russian bomber attack.

More than 300 strategic air command (SAC) B52 and B1H bombers and the fighter planes, missiles and sea-going forces of the U. S. Canadian North American Air Defense Command (NORAD) will participate in the "sky shield" war game.

All commercial airliners and private planes in the United States and Canada will be grounded from 2 to 4 a.m. Saturday to clear the stress for the military maneuvers.

During these hours, about 1,000 U. S. airline flights normally would carry some 25,000 passengers, 310 Canadian airliners would haul 3,000 passengers and 21 foreign airliners would enter or leave the two countries.

No missiles or live ammunition will be fired during the "sky shield" drill.

The SAC bombers—acting the part of attacking Russian planes—will fly pre-determined paths toward the defenders so that NORAD could tell friend from foe in case Russia launched a real war during the maneuvers.

The B52 and B1H planes will make simulated nuclear-bomb attacks on U. S. and Canadian cities using electronic counter-measure tricks they would employ to fool Soviet radar in wartime.

NORAD in turn will use its so-called "counter-counter" measures to try to overcome the bombers' evasive tactics and theoretically destroy the attackers.

An estimated 150,000 men from NORAD's army, navy and air forces will take part in the war game backed by another 50,000 in support roles. The SAC force probably will include about the same number of men.

Air force interceptors will fly 200 sorties. Army missiles will be at battle stations in Nike batteries. Navy picket ships, blimps and radar warning aircraft will be on the lookout for the bombers. Radar warning stations from the Arctic northward will participate.

WASHINGTON—Have the great American oil firms raised prices on domestic commodities? No, they have not. But they have raised prices on foreign commodities in order to compensate for losses suffered from Russia's stepped-up offensive in the political-economic-diplomatic field.

On the basis of recent summary increases, certain consumer organizations have been protesting that there is a "world all shut" rather than a "world all open" as the Humble refinery, Houston, and Gulf refinery, Houston, are producing by 10,000 barrels.

Some Congo Missionaries Start Return

WASHINGTON, Sept. 4 (AP) — American missionaries who were withdrawn from the Congo when fighting broke out in July are beginning to return to their posts.

The Disciples of Christ denomination, which evacuated 26 missionaries from the Congo, already has sent about a dozen to help in quieting the nation and returning it to normal. Four of the returning missionaries are women.

Denominational officials said it is expected that other missionaries will be going back to the Congo soon. Seven Disciples missionaries remained in the troubled region throughout the crisis.

The Methodist church said that five of its missionary families, including wives and children, have returned to the Congo from Southern Rhodesia, and that other denominations are also returning.

The Rev. John Wesley Shungu, a native African minister who is one of the leaders of the Congo Methodist conference, said in a message to U. S. Methodist officials:

"There was no time when missionaries were needed like this time." We need more and more missionaries to train Africans for leadership.

"I am sure that the Congo will be a better place than it is today if we have more missionaries to train Africans for leadership."

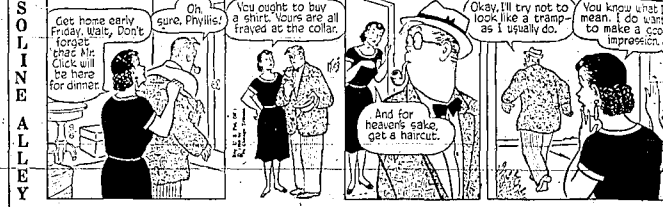

French Urge Extension of NATO Force

PARIS, Sept. 6 (AP)—A spokesman for the North Atlantic Treaty Organization (NATO) expressed surprise today at French President Charles de Gaulle's proposal to extend NATO into such strategic areas as the Middle East and Africa.

De Gaulle proposed this extension of the western alliance, and its revamping to give each member control of its own defense and nuclear stockpiles on its territory, at his first press conference of the year yesterday.

A NATO spokesman said that France had never proposed to the organization that it be modified along the lines suggested by De Gaulle.

The alliance which most closely approximates NATO in the Middle East is the Central Treaty Organization, or CENTO, which was the Baghdad pact until the withdrawal last year of Iran, Britain, Turkey, Iraq and Pakistan, the former two members also of NATO, make up this mutual defense alliance against communism.

De Gaulle also told members of the United Nations that France would not bow to any U. N. resolution urging her withdrawal.

French settlers and officers in Algeria generally applauded this and De Gaulle's assurance that a cease fire agreement with the Algerian rebels would be the prerequisite for further peace talks to end the five-year-long war.

The more I read books on child psychology and child training, the more I realize that it is only a matter of time until I am named "worst father of the year" by parents magazine or some similar publication.

A father (the books say) is a key figure in discipline. Just as a catcher backs up the first baseman, the father must back up the mother, but the child run wild and discipline the bases.

When sternness is called for, the father must be unyielding as a firing pin.

This lets me out. I have never hit my child, but I have never been a father.

What earthly satisfaction could I possibly derive from overprotecting a 9-year-old kid and making her, say, go to bed when she does not want to, or wrestling a lollipop from her tiny hands? The fact that it was her sixth lullaby in three hours adds no luster to my achievement.

A father, at certain times, is supposed to listen to a child who is crying as if her heart will break, and pay no more attention than if he were listening to a capricious child.

A father must be able to watch tears flow as calmly as he watches water flow from a tap.

He must be able to shut a door and keep it shut, though he can hear tiny fists beating on the door and hear a pleading voice call to him for help.

I can do none of these things. I tried leaving Megan alone in a room until she had finished a junior lantern, and managed to last until three wicks were snuffed.

It is of having rendered her unconscious? In her anger had she somehow managed to break through the screen, open the window and hurt herself to the ground? A thousand possibilities of disaster flashed through my mind.

So I ran to get her, and the closer I was to her healthy, and all smiles, to gladden my heart that I promised never to shut her out of my sight again.

I have been told that I should have become a father 10 or 15 years ago, when it was all the rage to allow children to do exactly as they pleased. It has been stated that I would have been a perfect father when it was considered desirable for a parent to thwart a child, no matter what he elected to do.

The more a child had his own way, the more "free" it was to develop into a happy, well-rounded adult.

How wise and what a pity that such a belief is not popular to do for one's children.

What a pleasure it must have been in those days when the mother a lullaby your baby was, the more you could back in public approval.

Honors rarely would have come to me in those days, I would have been asked to lecture on how to increase mischief patterns in a child, how to invade a child's control over his parents, and how to hurt jump through a hoop at a child's command.

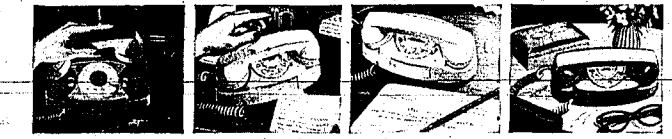
