Castro Accepts Russian Invitation to Lead Cuban Group to U.N. Session

NEW YORK, Sept. 13 (UPI)— Fidel Castro today accepted Soviet Premier Nikita Khrushchev's invitation to lead the United Nations, virtually all anti-American "rump summit" at next week's U. N. general assembly session. For Khrushchev it was another step forward in his most hated enemies in the United States by assembling his own major security headhunts in a city populated by hundreds of anti-Castro and anti-communist refugees.

Limit Is Not Reasonable, Leader Says

MOSCOW, Sept. 13 (UPI)— Premier Nikita S. Khrushchev today said he would not accept any U. N. government restriction on the number of nations attending the annual session. He said the U. N. generally cannot be justified by either ideological or political considerations. The Soviet news agency quoted the premier as telling the Daily News that the U. N. decision "is not a reasonable one."

Khrushchev did not specifically state whether he would seek any special status for the number of his movements. The premier's remarks came in response to three questions by the Daily Express radioed to Moscow by the Soviet news agency. He said Khrushchev to the Sept. 20 U. N. meeting.

Both President Eisenhower and Secretary of State Christian A. Herter said they would support the general assembly. One plan was for Herter to designate a special committee to approach before Khrushchev takes the floor and for Eisenhower to support the Soviet position. Herter said he would not sympathize with the Soviet position on the matter.

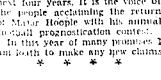

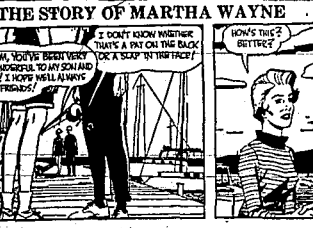

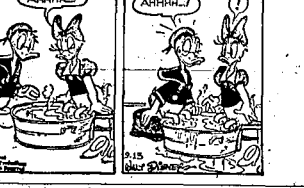
