### Group Hears Adviser for Foreign Girl

BURLEY, Sept. 15.—Walter Blauer, adviser for the exchange program in county agents' office, advised the girls' club at Burley high school of the details of the program for the year, and Principal Carlson was present.

The club has six applications for girls from the Burley school to be abroad for six weeks next summer and live with a family and learn of their way of life. She stated that the girls could not have all of these girls since there are not enough homes available for them.

The girls who will be selected will have to pay for their own way in the club dues and have enough funds. It will cost the girls' parents \$50.

Mrs. Blauer, adviser for the 12-year club, mentioned some of the new experiences her "new daughters" was having. The day she arrived in Salt Lake City they had not eaten for breakfast and she had to go to bed.

She explained the reason she was talking the group of girls' parents was because the students are not allowed to speak publicly before a group until they are 16 years old and she still thinks in terms of German language, Mrs. Blauer noted.

She spoke of the thrill the girls experience by seeing their "mother" on the wide screen in Salt Lake City. She was eager to see the girls and stated that the Blauer home was like the week-end home of rich people in Germany. Western castles and motor cars are new, too.

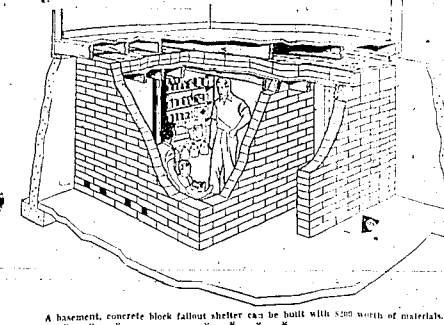

If you want to really prepare your family for the possibility of an H-bomb attack, you'll do these things now:

- 1. Make a plan. Build a shelter. Store in a two-week supply of canned or bottled food. One can can give you a meal. Add vitamins, pills and water and you're set.
- 2. Kit needed. Assemble a first aid kit. Have someone in your family trained in first aid. Remember, you probably won't be able to go out for a doctor.
- 3. Add tools, eating and sleeping equipment, something to read, a battery-powered radio, refuse and soiled pants, a battery-powered radio.
- 4. Do not buy a children's television set for monitoring radio.
- 5. If a bomb warning comes—maybe a bomb without warning—get in your shelter. Stay there for two weeks.
- 6. After the last week, you should be able to move to come out of your shelter for a few minutes to a few hours a day for emergencies.
- 7. Time Is Short. Suppose you are a procrastinator. If you haven't built a shelter or stored up food, or packed your car with a first-aid kit, or organized your family, do it now.
- 8. Remember you might have 30 minutes or maybe several hours. You could start Jerry-flixing your basement. Put a heavy table in a basement corner. Cover it with "H-bomb" magazines. Buy books around the table. Or pile anything that's heavy and dense on and around the table. Get your food for one person for two or three days. Get a can of milk and a can of fruit. 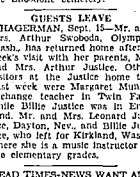

### Expert on Heart Surgery Speaks for Regional Heart Association Meeting

"A little more than a quick snip often means the difference between death and life when dealing with heart defects," says Dr. J. D. Mortenson, director of research in the experimental surgical laboratory in the Salt Lake City LDS hospital.

"To attain the heart needs to be still, however, before the surgeon can make that snip, or stitch or suture," he said. "This is where the heart lung bypass machine comes in."

Dr. Mortenson explained the machine and its functions in a color slide-lecture at the annual regional meeting of the Idaho Heart Association Wednesday afternoon in Twin Falls.

The machine is a complex instrument and a team of about 10 persons is required for its operation.

Dr. Mortenson said the average operation using the machine takes about four hours. During this time the patient's heart is "shut down" from 35 to 40 minutes. The longest the machine has had to serve as a patient's heart and lungs in Dr. Mortenson's experience has been 2 1/2 hours, at the University of Minnesota.

In all but about 10 per cent of the operations, the patient's heart continues to beat, its function is merely stopped. In the 10 per cent which must be stopped completely an electrical shock or drug is introduced to create complete lack of motion.

The machine consists of 250 pieces, all duplicated, which must be made absolutely clean after each operation. It takes a team of technicians eight hours to accomplish this.

Dr. Mortenson reports that the mortality rate varies widely with the defect and condition of the patient, but about one in three dies. He hastened to add that some defects have a mortality rate as low as three per cent.

The machine used at Salt Lake City was developed by Dr. Mortenson and his staff. It has been in use for two years during which time 150 open heart operations have been performed.

The first successful operation employing a heart-lung bypass patient's heart and lungs in Dr. Mortenson's experience has been 2 1/2 hours, at the University of Minnesota.

### Law to Change Tax Plan OK'd

### Data Urged for Sheep Producers

COOCHING, Sept. 15 — Sheep producers who market unshorn lambs this fall should maintain full records on their operations to make proper applications for payment of their unshorn lamb program, James P. Gunning, chairman of Gooding county agricultural stabilization and conservation committee, said today.

Failure to keep full records in the past has prompted difficulties in the system in obtaining unshorn lamb payments under the sales records for lambs sold must include the name of the buyer, his signature, and the number and liveweight of lambs sold plus the description.

### President Is Not Giving in To Red Chief

President Eisenhower, by going to the United Nations to speak ahead of Soviet Premier NIKITA KHRUSHCHEV at the opening of this year's general assembly, is by no means according to the Khrushchev line for an 82-nation summit conference.

He isn't even expected to meet the Soviet premier.

Meet for Discussion

Secretary of State Christian A. Herter repeated the country's view, to which the major non-Communist nations adhere, that nothing could be accomplished in such an unstable group. "The big event is the discussion and expression of world desires, not for negotiations."

The President will merely be making the opening speech for the country, a job usually leaves to someone else, traditionally the secretary of state.

For the moment he will be heading the U.S. delegation, as Khrushchev will, for a few days, head the delegation from the USSR.

Speaking Order Tradition

The so-called "certainty" that the President will speak ahead of Khrushchev reals on tradition, not on any unbreakable regulations. Herter has always asked and received permission to open the annual meeting and the United States has always asked and received permission to be second.

If Khrushchev wanted to start a fight about it, he could do so, and then the order of appearance would have to be decided upon in the floor.

Press Secretary James C. Hasty says the President would have specific proposals to make. There has been no indication in Washington, however, that there is really anything new on the fire.

### Protest Made On Bus Route Curtailments

BURLEY, Sept. 15 — About 150 citizens from the Burley area picketed the Cassia county school board meeting Friday night protesting the curtailment of school bus transportation in the area.

This action was taken by the school board at the beginning of the year since only three students remained on the route. A transportation allowance of \$10 per student per month was given.

The bus system temporarily was reinstated after a demonstration led the school board Aug. 29, after the students had increased to nine. The bus travels 40 miles a day for this number of students.

The board advised the delegation that the transportation program of the district is being reviewed and it is hoped that this study would be complete by the Oct. 10 meeting.

Announcement was made that an additional bus had been added to the Miller area because of an overload problem.

Contract for the sidewalk, curbing and gutters for the new Durston school was awarded to Jensen Construction company, Burley. These will be installed on the west and north sides of the building on Overland avenue and 18th street.

Several proposals have been made concerning this work and definite plans are not yet made. Bid on the sidewalk per square foot is 42 cents, \$1.22 per linear foot for the curbing and gutters, and 87 cents per square foot for reinforced driveways. There will be approximately 1,270 feet of sidewalk and about 625 feet of curbing. Reynolds Construction company, Twin Falls, also submitted a bid.
