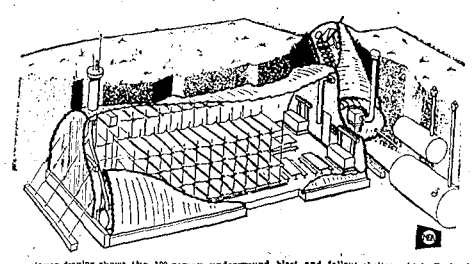

You and Community Can Find Practical Way of Saving Life During H-Bombing

WASHINGTON (AP)—You and your community or your company can save one or a potential way to save your lives in an H-bomb raid. Some businesses already have made these plans. One is the Blantyre Recreation Institute, Palo Alto, Calif.

The institute and its 4,000 employees are in the San Francisco Bay area. The overall area is by all odds, a major U.S. city. If the situation attacked in force, it is estimated that without protection a fourth of the institute's women and their families would be killed by blast, virtually all the rest by fallout. This assumes five million ton H-bomb strikes and a total fallout of 50 to 70 times more than needed to kill a man. To meet this threat, institute men have converted the basement of building No. 1 into a 30,000 square foot shelter for 1,000 women and children. Building plans include a basement to shelter 200 more. These basements can take blasts of the pounds per square inch. They would give blast protection from a five million ton H-bomb strike miles away. The shelter 25,000 shelterers fallout would be cut to a mere 10.

Blaine Levy Will Remain Same as '59

HAILEY, Sept. 15—Blaine County commissioners set the tax levy for the year beginning 1959 real and personal property taxes at their regular meeting Tuesday. The levy will remain the same as that of 1959.

For every \$100 worth of assessed valuation, the state levy will be 40 cents with 27 cents on voters, three cents for the 1959 state building fund and 10 cents for teachers retirement.

The county levy will be \$274, the same as last year with the teachers retirement taken from this fund and placed in the state fund. The levy for class "A" school district remains at \$3.

The city of Hailey levy remains at \$250 for the general fund, 10 cents sanitary construction, 85 cents bonds and interest, 5 cents fire equipment and maintenance, 10 cents library and 10 cents recreation.

The village of Ketchikan's levy remains at \$250, with the entire amount shown into the general fund. Bellevue's levy remains at \$230 with \$150 in the general fund, 20 cents water works and 20 cents library.

The village of Sun Valley levy remains at \$2 with \$1 for the general fund and for bonds and interest.

The Ketchikan, Hailey, Bellevue and Carey sanitary district levies are again each 20 cents. The Carey fire protection levy is again 60 cents and that of Ketchikan, 80 cents. The Carey flood control levy remains at 20 cents.

Special levies imposed by the state are \$4 sheep commission, 50 cents livestock disease and tuberculosis indemnity, 50 cents brand inspection, 100 cents honey and waxing and three cents bee inspection.

The basic levy, which includes state, county and school to be paid by all, comes to \$674 on every \$100 worth of assessed valuation.

JEROME, Sept. 15—Tom Prescott, Jerome, chairman of the volunteers for Nixon-Lodge, suggested today that the head of the Kennedy forces in Idaho brush up on his arithmetic.
