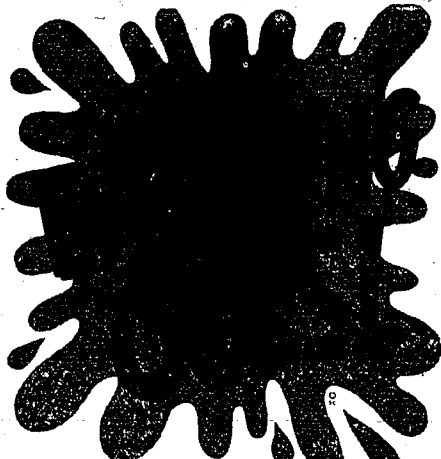

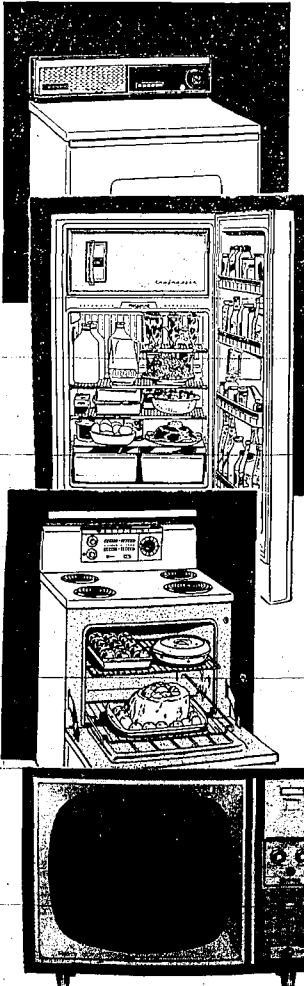

BURLEY, Sept. 21 — Cmdr. Charles Brendler will conduct the United States Navy Band when they present a student concert at 1:30 p.m. and an outdoor performance at 8 p.m. Friday, Sept. 23, at Minnie high school. These concerts are being sponsored by the Burley and Rupert Kiwanis clubs, states Fred Lundon, publicity chairman.

Brendler became conductor of this well-known band in 1944 when he was a lieutenant.

He began his naval career as a youth of 15. He spent almost a year at sea with a chinnet as a "Landman" for "Missie" in a "Turquoise" leader of musical fame, a former soloist, conductor and instructor of the band. By a special act of congress in 1953 Brendler became a full commander, the first musician to be honored.

The history of the United States Navy Band is synonymous with the career of its commander. In the 10 years since he became conductor, he has made it a tradition of the extraordinary instrument it is today.

Commander Brendler was elected vice president (1953-54) and president (1954-55) of the American Bandmasters Association. He is the only honorary member of the exclusive White House Correspondents' club. Commander Brendler has received many commendations from the various secretaries of the navy. In addition, he holds the rank of "Admiral" in the Texas Navy.

For his notable contributions, to his art and profession, an honorary degree of doctor of music became one of his most prized possessions.

The "Hall Lot," naval weapons museum, is the home base of the commander since 1947.

He is a member of the National Press club with yearly assignment to the entertainment, committee and the Variety club of Washington.

He is a very strict musician and strives for perfection. He conducts the greatest classical compositions, but insists that the concert presentations of the band appeal to all walks of life. The band can change color like a chameleon, he a symphony orchestra, dance band, adjusting itself with lightning-like rapidity.

Commander Brendler conducts all concerts of the band without the use of a written score.

WASHINGTON, Sept. 21 — Stanley William Fitzgerald, who likes to sing sentimental Irish lullabies in bars, has been placed on the FBI's list of 10 most wanted criminals. He is sought for the ruthless murder and robbery of a drinking companion.

The 29-year-old California fugitive was known to police as a con man and a bad crew artist before the Aug. 2 incident in which one man was slain and another wounded near Truckee, Calif.

Companion shot

According to police, Fitzgerald pumped four bullets into one of his victims, then fired a deadly shot into his head as they helped on the ground. The other erstwhile drinking buddy was shot in the arm and leg.

The wanted man is reported to have fled to Reno, Nev., after robbing his victim of several hundred dollars and several psychotropic drugs.

Fitzgerald should be "considered extremely dangerous," the FBI warns.

He Likes Gambling

The wanted man is an avid gambler and on occasion a heavy drinker. When drinking, Fitzgerald believes himself to be an accomplished Irish leaver and frequently slips into rambles of Irish lullabies.

Fitzgerald is of dark build, 5 feet 10 inches tall, and weighs between 150 and 210 pounds. He has a fringe of reddish blond hair but is quite bald on top. He is clean-shaven, has a fair complexion and blue-gray eyes.
