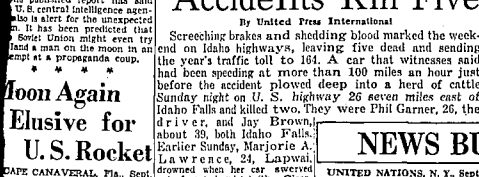

# Like to Make 9-Day Jaunt, Visit Mexico

WASHINGTON, Sept. 25 (AP)—President Eisenhower will make a nine-day jaunt to Mexico to deliver five speeches and confer in Mexico with the president of that country.

The President's schedule was announced by James H. Doolittle, White House press secretary, who said the trip will cover an estimated 6,000 miles and take Eisenhower into six states. He said, "This is not a campaign trip and none of the speeches will be political."

**Up to Start Oct. 17**

The President will leave Washington Oct. 17 and will address the annual banquet of the National Automobile show in Detroit that night.

On Thursday, Oct. 18, he will fly to the Miami-Ft. Lauderdale area to participate in dedication of the new interstate bridge across the Mississippi river. The President then goes to Atlanta, Ga., to inspect the Eisenhower museum. From Atlanta he will fly to Denver, Colo., remaining there all day Oct. 19.

**Other Talks Scheduled**

From Denver, the President flies to Salt Lake City to address the commonwealth club on Oct. 20. The following day he will address the press to speak at a luncheon meeting of the Pan-American League having delegates from 25 nations.

On the evening of Oct. 21 the President will fly to Palm Springs where he will remain Saturday and Sunday.

**Mexican Visit Set**

On Monday morning, Oct. 24, Eisenhower will fly to Toluca in air force base near Mexico City where he will cross the border to meet with President Adolfo Lopez Mateos. Mexican officials said the meeting will be at Ciudad Guzman and will be the first in a series aimed at encouraging friendly relations between the United States and Mexico.

After the meeting in Mexico, the President will fly to Houston on Oct. 25 to address a special convocation at Rice university. He then spends the night in Houston and returns to Washington on Tuesday, Oct. 25.

# New Foreign Policy Urged By Utah Man

**LEWISTON, Sept. 25 (AP)**—Sen. Frank E. Moss, D. Utah, told a Democratic dinner here Saturday night that the nation hasn't had a really good idea in foreign affairs — a new approach — since the Democrats left office.

"We got along from 1913 to 1933, but we've got to get serious, and we've got to get serious in our prepared address. The Soviets have seized the initiative, and all of us the psychological advantage this gives them. Their propaganda efforts should make our most astute advertising men green with envy. The Soviet move — and we try to pick up the pieces."

**New Plan Urged**

"What we must have is a foreign policy which can create world conditions and climates of opinion which will make it possible not only to prevent the destruction of our country and our civilization by a nuclear war, but will encourage and assist the struggling underprivileged of the earth to live in dignity, productivity, peace and above all — freedom."

Moss asserted that Vice President Richard M. Nixon, the Republican presidential nominee, has "reversed his own stand on many issues on which he has voted or spoken in the past."

Example Cited

He said a "perfect example" is a statement made by Nixon during his campaign visit to Boise earlier this month. Nixon referred to water project development, Moss said, adding:

"You know that he said we must 'step up development' and 'push ahead on all feasible starts.' You also know only too well what the policy of the administration has been for the past several years — 'no new starts.' Mr. Nixon is reversing the administration — for election year purposes."

"One cannot help but wonder about the sincerity and, yet, the morality of a candidate who, as vice president of his administration, helped formulate and eloquently supported the policies of the administration and now, when the issue is unpopular, completely reverses himself."

## Improving of Safety Rules To Be Asked

BOISE, Sept. 26 (AP) — Idaho's next state legislature will be asked to give serious consideration to streamlining traffic safety laws to make them state roads safer, Robert B. McCall said today. McCall, traffic safety director for Idaho's law enforcement department, outlined his "streamlined program" for an Idaho Safety Council meeting over the weekend at Burley. Taking note that the code has not been brought up to date since 1953, McCall said today that the laws should keep pace with today's modern travel. Classes urged "I feel I have come up with recommendations that will improve state highway rules and will make Idaho a safer place in which to live," he said. McCall recommended that the legislature "give serious consideration" to require driver's education classes in the state's high schools. He feels that this is the best way in getting young drivers off to a right start. The safety director also recommended that the lawmakers place

drivers' examinations on a state level and create a drivers' examination bureau. He suggested that this bureau be under the department of law enforcement, but not connected with the state police. "Safety education classes would be drivers' education," McCall explained. "This way, through bus bureau and high school driving programs, both adults and youths would learn the proper procedures of traffic safety."

Speaking of youth, McCall said the legislature convening at Boise in January would be asked to amend the law passed in the last session concerning traffic violations by minors.

The main purpose of the bureau would be to deal with the law enforcement. He feels the law enforcement commissioner should not be required to be licensed with traffic violators who have been convicted of this offense.
