Khrushchev and British Prime Minister Harold Macmillan will meet tomorrow. The two statesmen will meet at 6:30 p.m. (EDT) at the Soviet mission on Park avenue. There still was no indication of a possible meeting between President Eisenhower and the Soviet leader, however. Khrushchev apparently stuck to his statement that the initiative would have to be taken by the President, and the White House said Khrushchev had no plans to bring up the subject.

KHRUSHCHEV'S INTENTIONS

The big question here the world today
is whether NIKHITA KHRUSHCHEV is
truly bent, as he seems to be, on a
policy toward the embattled United
Nations.

He has now been even bolder in his
protestive U.N. speech and liberal
disparagement of the U.S. in
accord with Soviet purposes.

What he appears to be doing is that
there can be no disarrangement in
the post of secretary general is
three-man executive board established
in its place.

Obviously this proposal is intended to
allow Khrushchev to bow the will of the U.N.
majority whenever he chooses by
opposition to Soviet objectives. Certainly
Khrushchev would insist on the Committee
member of such a board having to vote
over the execution of policy.

If the U.N. were to accept this plan, it
would most likely mean the end of effective
action by that body.

Khrushchev's goal, plainly, is to gain
this kind of veto for his interests of
winning a U.N. majority by forcing the new
African states to his side since deemed to
culture. This can be seen in spite of the
fact that China and Indonesia are somewhat
sympathetic to Soviet viewpoints.

What will happen if the U.N. declines to
amend its structure to suit Khrushchev's
plans?

As far as the United States is concerned
is concerned, the Soviet threat of non-co-
operation is not of great moment. Nothing
in the Kremlin's anyway record suggests
any intention to permit effective dis-
armament anyway.

Russia's hostility toward the post of
secretary general, and particularly toward the
present incumbent, Dag Hammarskjold, is
another matter.

The U.N.'s recent 10-6 endorsement
indicates he has complete non-Communist
backing. But, in theory at least, he is sup-
posed to satisfy all U.N. elements, including
Communists.

Questionably, he cannot, can any single
man be found who would fill the bill?

There must be grave doubt on this score.
And, if any other man is named,
Hammarskjold, have to be replaced? In the
Congo he has acted in the right.

The U.N. as now organized makes a
poor choice of secretary general. But it
is not designed to accommodate both rich
and wrong.

When it is reorganized to allow the tri-
umph of wrong over right, it will die.

HOPE AND SHIELD

Though President Eisenhower's propo-
sals ranged from disarmament to a "open
skies" surveillance, they were drawn up by
one stout, binding thread—heavy rely-
ance upon the United Nations.

The President's talks have urged he
renewed his call for U.N. discussions. In re-
newing his call for an "open skies" plan, he
suggested a U.N. surveillance body.

Offering to produce and transfer the
materials for armaments and to transfer
them to stockpiles for peaceful purposes, he
proposed that those stockpiles be under
international — preferably U.N. — control.

His five-point plan of aid to Africa in-
cluded U.N. — support for education there,
international assistance in shaping Africa's
foreign development, and U.N. — control.

His suggestion for noninterference in
African internal affairs is in direct line with
the newly approved U.N. resolution to that
effect.

Except for the African plan, the Presi-
dent's proposals were not fundamentally
new. But in the context of these times, they
are nonetheless of major importance.

They constituted recognition of the increas-
ingly evident fact that the U.N. is of in-
creasing importance in the world of 1961.

Since its birth it has been the arena
forum in which could be heard the voices
of large and small nations alike. From time
to time it also managed to do so, remark-
ably in view of its limited powers, as a
genial peace agency.

Now, however, it is not just forin but
shield for many of the new nations of
Asia and Africa. It is their great hope
Eisenhower's proposals feed that hope and
give them confidence in their shield.

It could not have chosen a more critical
moment. For Khrushchev and the Soviet
Union, emboldened as seldom before by
provocative incursions into new territory,
have pursued a relentless course at the
expense of the U.N.

The U.N. is a big thing today in the
minds of many men around the globe. But
Eisenhower's little-known, non-Communist
message.

to aid in resisting that pressure. Whatever
the fate of his individual proposals, the
