Cuban Threatens Death for Spies, Saboteurs of U.S.

HAVANA, Sept. 30 (UPI)—Cuban Premier Fidel Castro warned today that he will execute any "American spies or saboteurs" caught in Cuba. He made the threat against the "imperialist bourgeoisie" in a speech in which he alleged the American embassy in Havana is honeycombed with "conspirators and spies," Americans in Cuba who want to "leave are welcome to do so but Cuban courts will find a fitting punishment," he warned.

U. S. Closes Nickel Plant On Cuba Isle

WASHINGTON, Sept. 30 (UPI)—The United States closed a nickel plant on Cuba today, the first of a series of moves to curtail Cuba's nickel exports. The closure was announced by the U.S. State Department. The plant, operated by the Cuban government, was producing nickel for the U.S. market. The closure was effective immediately.

China, Russia Set up Court Over Conflict

LONDON, Sept. 30 (AP)—Communist nations have set up a high court of inquiry to examine the dispute over the border between China and Russia. The court is to be held in Moscow and will hear testimony from both sides. The dispute is over the border area of the Khabarovsk Territory.

Delay in Pay For Military Aids Surplus

WASHINGTON, Sept. 30 (AP)—The Eisenhower administration is delaying the payment of \$1.5 billion in military aid surplus to the United States. The delay is due to a shortage of funds. The aid was provided to the United States under the Mutual Defense Assistance Act.

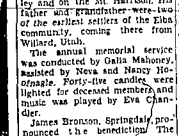

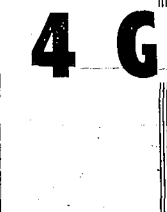

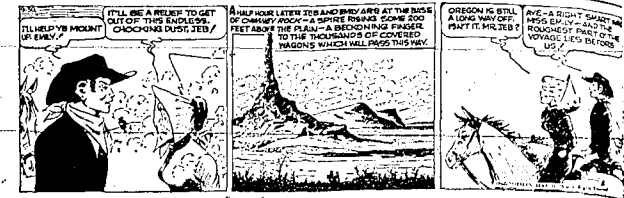
