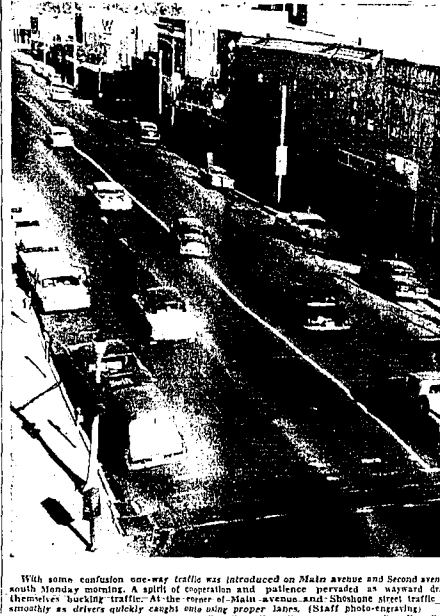

UNITED NATIONS, N. Y., Oct. 3 (UPI)—Secretary-General Hammarskjöld Tuesday rejected Soviet Premier Nikita Khrushchev's demand that he resign or face a boycott by the communist bloc. Earlier India's Prime Minister Nehru had also rejected the Russian leader's move to change the structure of the U. N. Thunders of opposition erupted at the secretary-general when he fired back at that rejection of Khrushchev's ultimatum barely five hours after the Soviet premier launched a new assault in the general assembly.

Khrushchev pounded his fist on the podium in a dramatic gesture of defiance of the demand to go.

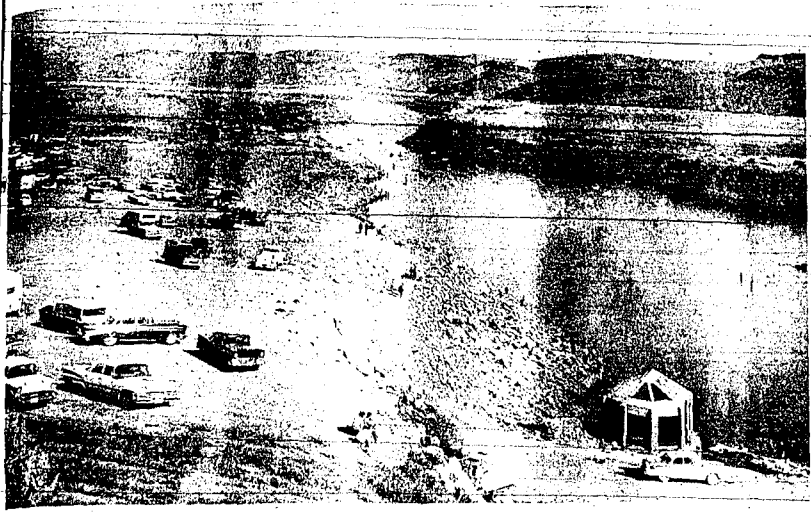
