Stivers, not aware that he was a partisan Republican, countered with a blast which questioned Rubcock's capabilities as prosecuting attorney, which elicited vehemently that there is any provision in the Idaho code which would make such actions illegal.

KILLING FOLK... It's easy to understand why feeling is running high against the three Sacramento youths for the joy ride shooting of an Idaho truck driver on highway 50 between Vinemount and Lovelock, Nev.

Approximately 450 truck drivers already have contributed to the fund in the total amount of \$20,000... Many of these truck drivers have expressed the fear that ever more serious controls...

They are afraid that youths shooting at motorists is a growing crime which is becoming a fad, like highway drug racing which also imperils human lives.

It is interesting to learn what action is being taken by the three Sacramento youths for their joyride shooting episode. He indicated it will largely be up to the jury to decide on punishment...

The press services quoted the district attorney as saying that the youths admitted drinking and exchanging a 30-30 rifle for shots at other vehicles. None of the youths, he said, could give any reason for the shootings and they appeared to be remorseful.

The seriousness of such explanation is self-evident. With very few exceptions, youths involved in serious violations of the law always "appear remorseful." But that by no means excuses actual killings and endangering lives of others.

There is a tendency nowadays to minimize youthful transgressions with some such generality as "you can't deny youngsters are fun." There is a measure of truth in such an observation so long as the fun is wholesome and harmless and in no way constitutes a public menace. But when the fun leads to the destruction of property, endangering human lives and actual killings, that an entirely different story.

It is interesting to note that youths cannot control such acts in all instances, it's no excuse for juvenile law enforcement authorities, juvenile officials and the courts to pamper these youths who persist in being a menace to society.
