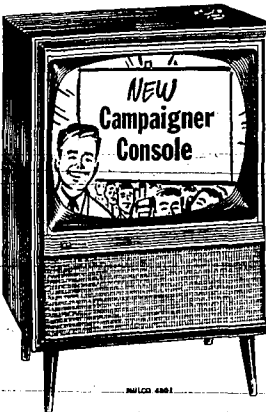

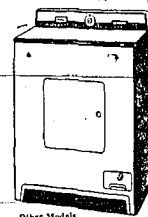

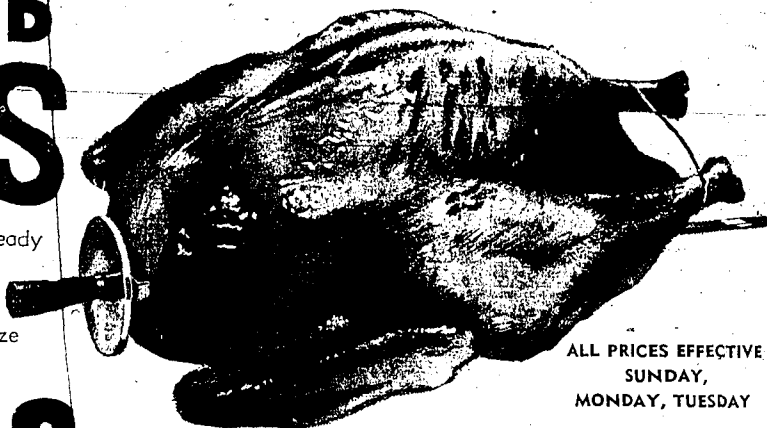

Editor, Times-News:—I am pleased to answer to Mr. Winniger's article of Oct. 2 on the explanation of Canal company water rights.

First we have one of the best water rights in the state limited by gates and with the building of pipelines dam, it was even more improved. No. 1—By a head-over-right in Jackson Lake. Hereafter if the water was not used in the reservoir it would drop down into the river. No. 2—A right in this company and become the property of others. No. 3—A right to use our winter flow or any amount necessary and receive credit for same in American Falls reservoir. No. 4—A right to place amount that exceed the surge as the total winter flow from Nov. 1 to April 1. This tract need never be shut of water by taking advantage of this opportunity in storing during dry years.

From 1925 to 1945 American Falls failed to fill seven years in succession, this tract was cut to 100 per cent delivery in 1938, 40 per cent less than is being de-livered now. This need not hap-pen again if proper provision is made. 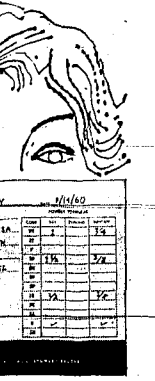

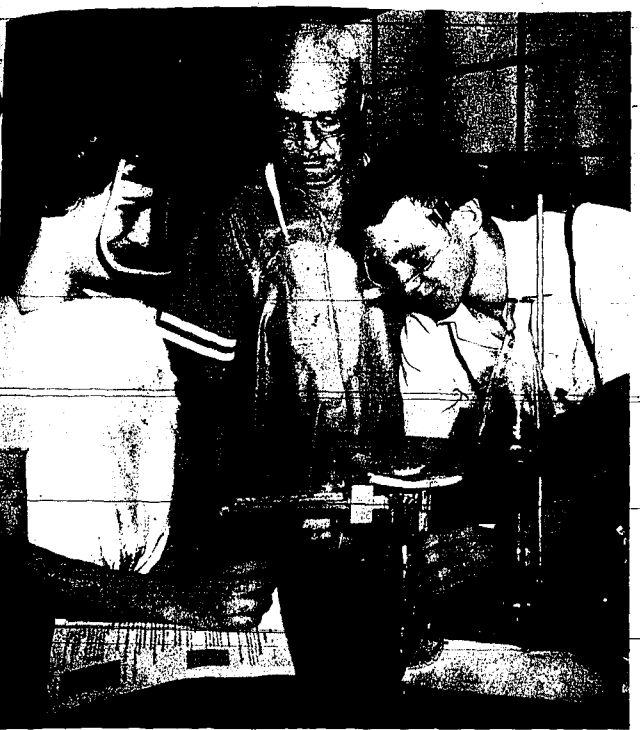

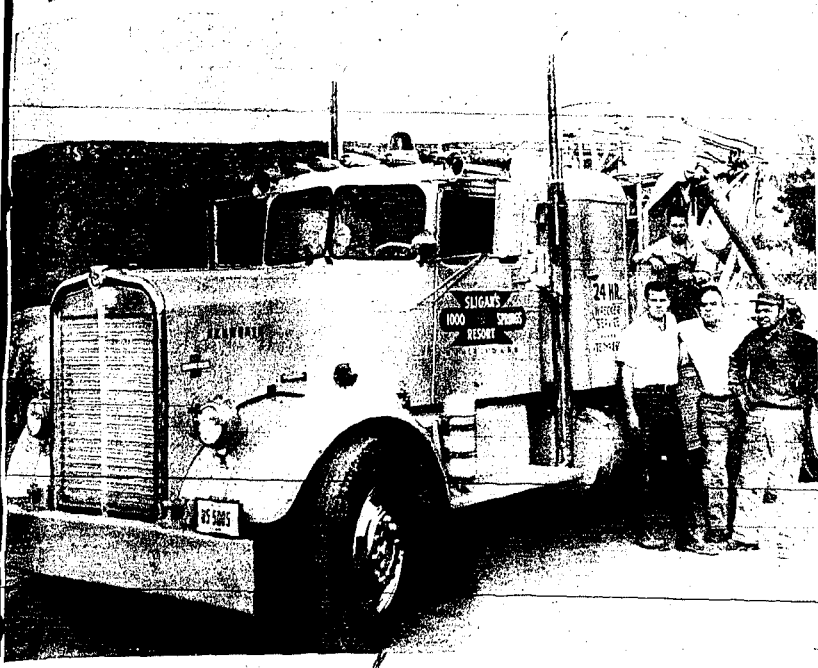

Giant Diesel Wrecker Constructed by Doyle Slinger and Sons in Five Months

THOUSAND SPRINGS, Oct. 8 — Doyle Slinger, a large man with close-cropped graying hair, has designed, mated, mated trucks and trailers for many years in the machine shop he operates at Thousand Springs resort. For a few months ago he and his sons, Keith and William Slinger, undertook something new. They began work on what has developed into one of the largest wreckers in the world. It's a specially built 350-horsepower diesel wrecker, a used Kenworth truck and a 220-horsepower diesel engine as basic units. The wrecker that Slinger declares will handle any size wreck anywhere. It's 27 feet, 9 inches long from bumper to bumper, the truck has 15 speeds forward and will go from a snail's pace up to 80 miles per hour, says Slinger. A regular boom extends 18 feet into the air. For jobs requiring double height a 45-foot optional derrick boom is available. The boom is 20 minutes to change heights. The cab instrument panel resembles the cockpit of an airplane bomber. Dials and switches stretch completely across the dashboard. "I don't know if it gives you a pressure dial, all tell their story," says Slinger, "and to the operator. The driver's seat is situated about five feet above ground level and provides a birdseye view of the roadway. The cab is equipped with a steering space for use on cross country jobs. The Slingers reupholstered the cab and installed foam rubber seats for driver and passenger. "It would take \$40,000 to duplicate the machine," says Slinger. "However, by machining many of the parts ourselves and using parts we had on hand the total cost to us was somewhat less. One of the problems they encountered was building hinges strong enough to deliver full payload potential of the wrecker without breaking down. Following specifications provided by the Holmes company, they solved the problem. After a trial road test Doyle Slinger proudly announced his giant wrecker was ready for anything.

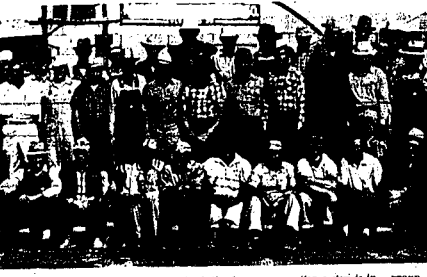

T.F. Canal Company Has Future Plans To Deliver More Water Around Tract

Though irrigation reservoirs in southern Idaho are declining down to pond sizes, nevertheless the Twin Falls Canal company has future plans to provide even more water to its shareholders than it does now, says Alfred Peters, company manager.

These plans, are based on the assumption the drought will end and reservoirs will fill again. The present allocation per acre of water is five-eighths of an inch delivered at the farmers' heads. However, the canal company has been delivering actually three-fourths of an inch, about 10 percent of the allocation.

Peters says the company has plans to deliver even more water to 3500 stockholders served by a canal system that embraces 400 square miles of farmland. This, will, will only allow more water than many farmers already know that the water rights on the Twin Falls tract are among the best in the world.

And it won't cost shareholders any more than it does now, says Alfred Peters, who is fully proud that the maintenance levy of 22 per share has been maintained for 13 years. Soviets Revive Plan to Reclaim Land; Attempt to Surpass U.S. in Production

WASHINGTON, Oct. 3 (AP)—The Soviet Union apparently has revived a land reclamation plan of the early 1950's in its effort to surpass the United States in agricultural production. The seven-year plan to outproduce the United States by 1960 was based primarily on an increase in yields. When Premier Nikita Khrushchev announced the plan in 1958, it was believed Russian farmers had about completed an earlier plan of setting more land into cultivation by plowing up virgin soils which had been used for centuries for grazing purposes. Apparently they had not, perhaps their political leaders deceived they had not.

The foreign agricultural service (FAS) says reports from the Soviet press has learned that reclamation is operating in a big way in the "new lands" area of Kazakhstan and Siberia, and also in the European section of the Soviet Union.

In Kazakhstan 3,088,750 acres of virgin land have been plowed this year and more acres were being plowed early in August. FAS said elsewhere in the Soviet area in the heart of the Soviet winter wheat belt, the area now to corn and small grains is to be expanded by plowing 494,200 acres of virgin-land plus 123,530 acres of reclaimed land in one region of the Ukraine 49,200 acres of land were to be drained and reclaimed by 1960. In this area soils are infertile, have poor moisture retention ability, and require heavy annual fertilization.

Six Per Cent Cut Urged In 1961 Spud Plantings

WASHINGTON, Oct. 3 (AP)—Agriculture department advisers today are urging a six per cent cut in potato acreage in 1961. 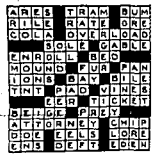

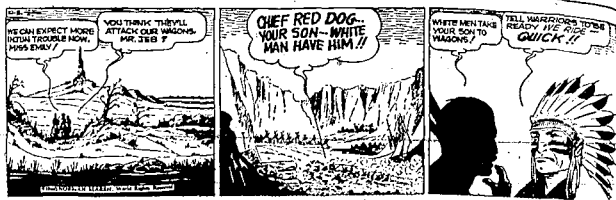
