GOP Outdoes Democrats in Fund Drives

WASHINGTON, Oct. 18 (AP)—Three leading Republican fundraising committees have collected over one million dollars more than similar Democratic groups did during the first eight months of 1950.

A study of financial reports filed by the fund raising committees of each party showed the three Republicans received \$1,794,817.70 up to Aug. 31 compared with \$1,327,450.80 by the Democrats.

Included in the comparison were contributions to the national, senatorial and congressional finance committees of both the Republican and Democratic parties.

Two funds led off.

Funds collected by the volunteers for Nixon, and the citizens for Kennedy and Johnson were excluded because the Democratic group went into Johnson several months later than the Republican.

Despite the overall GOP lead, collections by the Democratic national committee and the Republican national committee were close.

The Democratic group collected \$1,241,254.85 during the first eight months of the year, while the Republicans took in \$1,277,855.67.

Sharp contrast was found in the collections by the house and senate campaign committees of both parties.

In the house, the national Republican congressional committee brought in \$486,942.44, or almost five times as much as the \$101,423.21 reported by the Democratic congressional committee.

In the senate, the GOP campaign committee reported contributions of \$300,000 to the Democratic collection of \$113,333.74.

Khrushchev Sees Self as Peace Lover

NEW YORK, Oct. 10 (AP)—Nikita Khrushchev, the tough-tongued Soviet premier, has drawn this self-portrait: He is a peace-loving old grandfather who would never threaten war or grab an inch of anyone's territory.

Furthermore, he said he is convinced that the atom age will bring peace to the world. He said he will meet at the summit with his friendly foe.

This is the latest image Khrushchev has painted across American television screens and on radio last night during a two-hour question and answer session.

Except for a few brief blowups, Khrushchev, self-proclaimed the champion of peace and disarmament, has been warring since arriving three weeks ago in New York for his latest diplomatic assignment at the United Nations.

"Friendship sought"

Khrushchev pictured himself as the elected leader of a nation who wants nothing more than to help his people realize their dream of being friends with the American people.

Khrushchev played the role of a peace-loving grandfather, without backtracking from his latest demands. In other language, he still wanted the West to get out of Berlin, overhaul the U.S. according to Moscow's specifications, disarm now and talk about inspection later.

He said the Soviet Union would have no alternative but to shoot down further any planes.

Khrushchev was interviewed by television producer David Goodkin on the WNTA-TV program "Open End."

Khrushchev to Leave

The program was carried live

or on a delayed basis over more than 250 TV and radio stations.

Khrushchev appeared on the program after returning from his third, and final, week-end at the Soviet-owned mansion at Glen Cove, Long Island. He plans to fly back to Moscow by 10 planes Thursday night, ending an eventful 25-day stay.

Khrushchev seemed determined not to let any of his American guests win. He insisted for a few seconds when he was accused of "baying at the moon" by rebuking the U.S. case.

Politics Avoided

Khrushchev avoided any move to interfere in the American presidential elections.

Report Says Western Water Pollution Hazards Will Rise

WASHINGTON, Oct. 10 (AP)—Water pollution hazards will increase in the next half century, respectively in western states, the public health service cautions.

A report submitted by the service to a special committee on national water resources says the dangers will mount in the West partly because of population shifts in that direction.

"There is justifiable concern among planners," the report says, "that the large increase and shift of the total U. S. population in the next 20 to 40 years will result in a widespread and serious increase in water pollution problems."

"Extremely complex problems of waste treatment, stream sanitation and water use are being created by the current and anticipated growths in populations and industries."

"Conventional pollution control techniques are fast becoming outmoded. The major problem areas, present new challenges, and they in turn can only be met through continued and expanded research."

The report is one of many being considered by the committee in making recommendations for legislation for conservation and development of water resources. Proposals of the committee, which recently completed the broadest investigation of water problems ever made by a congressional committee, will be offered to congress next year.

One potential hazard, according to the report, is the use of poisonous chemical sprays for killing insects and fighting plant diseases on farms and in forests of the West.

"Evidences of these chemicals have been found in many of our streams and lakes. . . . With highly toxic materials being broadcast over the land it is inevitable that some of it will reach our water courses in concentrations which are toxic to aquatic life. . . . Numerous fish kills have been reported."

"Unless technical breakthroughs provide needed new methods," it continued, "it is possible that by the year 2000 the annual output of high-level or high-activity radioactive wastes from this (the uranium) industry can amount to a difficult and hazardous problem."

Other things described by the report as likely to increase pollution hazards in the West:

- "The pulp and paper industry produces a possible eight-fold increase in pollution."
- "The recent movement of pulp industry operations to the Rocky Mountain sections of Montana, Wyoming and Colorado may be expected."
- "The annual cost of collecting and treating municipal sewage is expected to increase greatly in the next 20 years."

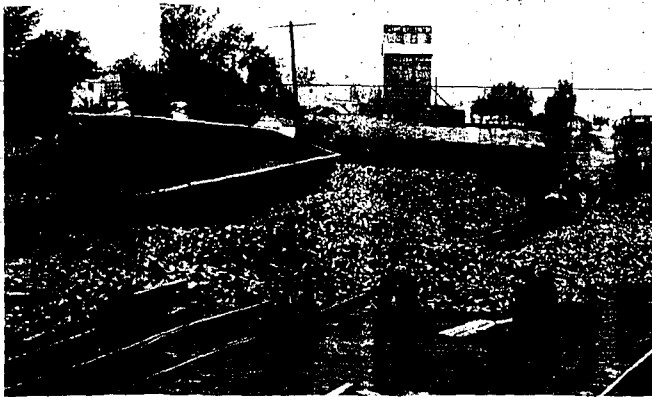

Many protesters had trouble registering their protests to the Newark office from the United Nations building here because the station's headquarters was jammed.

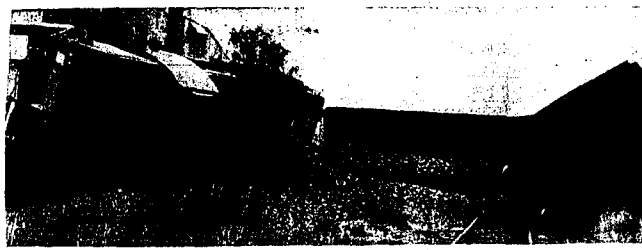
