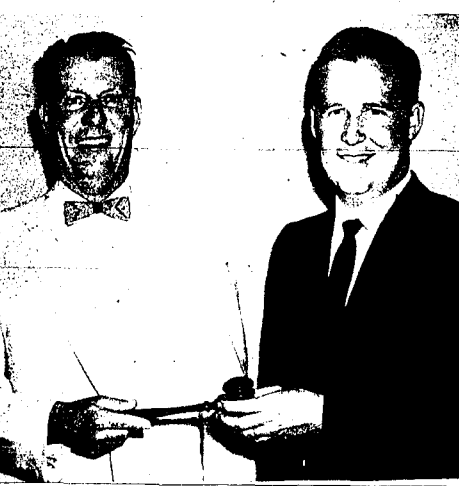
The jury of six men and six women, seven smokers and five non-smokers—deliberated an hour and a half before returning its verdict to Federal Judge Herbert Wechsberg.

Birth Control Pills Popular And Effective

SAN FRANCISCO, Oct. 12 (AP)—Pills have become the most popular and most effective way of preventing unwanted pregnancies.

A large group of women participating in birth control studies, the Harvard College of Gynecology has been told.

Among 60 women, representing 134 months of pill use, there were only six pregnancies, and these few failures probably were due to lapses in taking the pills, said Dr. Edward T. Tyler, Los Angeles.

Dr. C. Robinson Garcia of the Harvard university medical school in Puerto Rico resulted in a much lower conception rate than any other means, even when there were irregularities in treatment, he said.

Tyler reported on the use of two slightly different kinds of pills, one called norgestrel and the other norethindrone. The federal food and drug administration has approved the use of norethindrone, which Tyler said produces virtually no side effects at presently prescribed doses.

The other drug, still under experimentation but not yet approved for general use, produces some unfavorable reactions at the originally prescribed dose level, but these undesirable effects are being reduced by giving smaller doses, he said.

The unfavorable reactions among the 60 women were nausea and gastro-intestinal disturbances in 56, headaches in 15 others. Both drugs are the same as far as effectively preventing pregnancy, he said.

The present pills are not the final answer to the birth control problem. Better pills probably will be made, Tyler said.

Bankruptcy Debts Total Two Million

SPRINGFIELD, Wash., Oct. 12 (UP)—A study of liabilities released yesterday shows debts of more than two million dollars in the bankruptcy action against Edward Lawrence McDonnell, Inc., and its subsidiaries.

McDonnell as an individual was listed as \$1,002,000 on the basis of \$22,000 and \$978,000 claimed exempt assets. Debt of the E. L. McDonnell Corp. was listed as \$1,192,000 with assets of \$153,000. The balance of \$1,039,000 was listed as liabilities.

Bankruptcy trustees filed in July against McDonnell and his Elmer Mustard partnership, a Montana corporation, for a total of \$548,000. At that time the firm did much of its business in Montana and Idaho and operated in various states and provinces in Canada.

The largest single debt listed was \$534,825 to Elmer Mustard, Spokane, as assignee of the Washington Trust bank. The E. L. McDonnell Corp. had a debt of \$173,892.25.

Other debts listed were \$200,000 for the bank and a debt of \$708,894.25 against the corporation. The French company claimed \$173,892.25, the Montana excavator company, \$207,013.81 and the Montana, Legend, Atlanta, Ga. company, \$200,000.

A portion of involuntary bankruptcy has been filed in Boise, Idaho, against the Washington Trust bank, which is controlled by the McDonnell Corp. company, Spokane, a Montana corporation.

The majority of the stock in the bank was listed as owned by Leo McDonnell, a brother of Edward, but lawyers said there was no connection there between the operations of the two brothers.

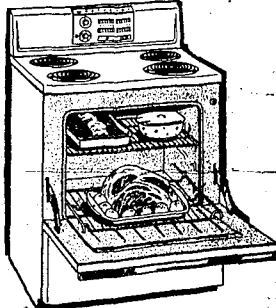

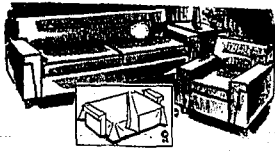

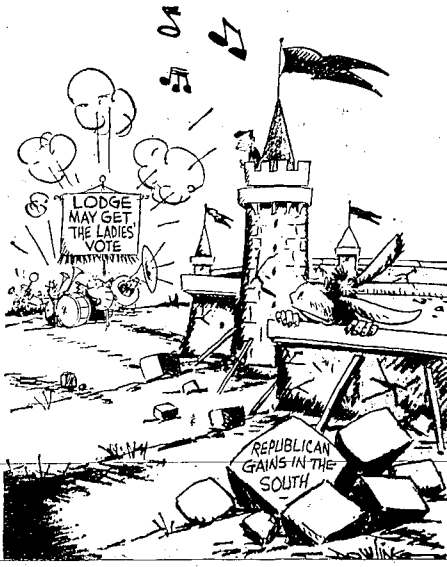

No Fast Cure Found Yet for Cold or Hangover, Hal Says

BY HAL ROYLE
NEW YORK, Oct. 12 (AP)—The common cold and the uncommon hangover have one thing in common—science has found no sure zipping pains, chills, shakiness and quick cure for either.

So for the only real relief available to the victim of either ailment is the realization that if he makes the best of his ordeal it will finally go away.

No one knows when the first human being caught the first common cold, or when the first man came down with an uncommon hangover. But both afflictions have been known throughout recorded history.

"These are men who wouldn't give a dime to discover a cure for the common cold who would gladly—at least on some memorable mornings—pay a million dollars for a genuine and immediate hangover cure."

In the folklore of drinking there have been as many cures for hangovers as there have been for hiccups. Everybody has a cure or has heard of a cure—but none of them really works.

One recommends a copious intake of ice cream the morning after a hangover. Another suggests a glass of milk, Turkish baths, pea soup, or long solitary walks.

In Colonial days a more rugged society prescribed a treatment that was also a punishment—flagellation and bleeding.

But Leon D. Adams, author, says all these ways have one thing in common—they don't work.

An executive secretary of the Society of Medical Friends of Wine, Adams has gone into this subject extensively, indeed exhaustively.

First, Adams defines what a hangover is. He says it is an upset of the body's chemical balance masterfestered by "splitting headache, searing thirst, fiery tongue, pounding heart, fluttering stomach, tearing pains, chills, shakiness and a screaming jitter."

Second, Adams explains what a hangover is caused by. Some imbibers believe it is the result of drinking too much, eating the wrong thing, or because of the hangover liquor in the sin of the four-o'clock whiskey.

As a result of his researches, Adams is convinced the only real cause of most real hangovers is too much alcohol.

Thirdly, he denies the possibility—held strongly by some drinkers—that a hangover can be prevented by taking vitamin pills daily—at least on some memorable mornings—pay a million dollars for a genuine and immediate hangover cure.

Other students of this vital topic, however, advise such remedies as tomato juice, orange juice and honey, and going to bed early by far the best thing to do, he says.

"There is no cure for it except time. Its only preventive is not to drink excessively."

Non-Contagious Rous Cancer Virus Discovered Contagious

NEW YORK, Oct. 11—After 43 years of intensive investigation, the Rous virus was subjected to what seemed an acid test for contagiousness. It was found to be contagious.

This is the celebrated Rous virus which was one of the first to be identified as a cancer-causer. It is a virus, and the reason for its being so is because of this change in its structure.

But the change brings a little more light to the study of viruses and cancers, and it is a subject newly pertinent to people. Only this year, viruses have been directly implicated in human cancer.

Obviously cancer viruses don't get around like ordinary viruses. If they did, scientists now would know much more about them than they do. In 1912, soon after its discovery,

was the proof which had been sought as final ever since.

It now has been accepted by Drs. R. B. Burrmeister, A. K. Pontre, and W. G. Waller of the U. S. department of agriculture's poultry research laboratory at Fort Lansing, Mich. They worked with a highly bred line of white leghorns known to be most susceptible to the virus.

They inoculated 404 nine-day old chicks of this line with the virus, and they were reared in the same pens with approximately the same number of chicks who at the start had no viruses in them.

In 14 to 100 days, 54 to 94 per cent of the inoculated chickens were dead of cancer. The time looked for the viruses to kill varied depended upon how much virus had been put into them and whether it was injected in veins or under the skin.

Of their uninoculated partners, five to 78 per cent were dead of cancer within 37 to 163 days. The scientists said the viruses evidently had to build up to a critical but unknown number in their original hosts before they could be transmitted.

They were sure the transmission was by contact because they constructed a two-compartment

pen divided by double chicken-wire three-quarters of an inch apart. This prevented physical contact between chickens in the two compartments but did not prevent close proximity.

Fifty chicks inoculated with virus were put in one compartment. Within 25 days 47 of the 50 were dead of cancer. Fifty uninoculated chicks were put in the other compartment. Not one came down with cancer, and this seemed to show that the virus could not be airborne.

In reporting their results to the National Cancer Institute, Baltimore, Md., the scientists said frankly they did not understand why they were the first to prove the Rous cancer can be contagious by contact. Of course, they added, "the biological characteristics of the Rous virus 'can and do change.'"

But "the apparent acquisition of contagiousness may be due simply to an increase in the concentration of the virus," they added.
