MIAMI BEACH, Fla., Oct. 20 (AP)—Secretary Robert C. Hill said today that the United States presidential election, such as a move toward the Caribbean Bay naval base, will not be the U. S. ambassador in Havana, the American Legion president would be surprised if Castro, on instruction from Moscow or Peking, attempted to "pose" his nation as a "democratic" nation as elected in the United States.

"This could be a move on Guantanamo," Hill said.

He said the United States must defend the base with all its strength. "I think we should show the world that we are not going to let anyone get together efforts to our country in Cuba or anywhere else in the Caribbean."

The Cuban problem has developed into a serious and immediate threat to the peace, stability and security of the entire hemisphere, Hill said.

Tax Booklet Is 'Misleading' in Medical Section

WASHINGTON, Oct. 20.—The internal revenue service says the 1950 medical deduction booklet is misleading in one section, medical expense deductions.

Under the law, if either a husband or wife is 65 or over, the medical expenses of both may be deducted in full with no limitation. In other words, taxpayers in this category do not have to show the actual amount of deducting only those medical expenses which exceed three percent of their taxable income.

In discussing these cases, and those of people with dependent children 65 or older, the IRS in its booklet says: "In these cases, the amount which is attributable to the 65-over individuals is not reduced by three percent of your adjusted gross income."

IRS officials conceded that this was a mistake. The three percent rule still applies to the medical expenses of that particular individual. Actually, the rule does not apply.

They also wrote the booklet's authors to emphasize that if a person under 65 supports a parent 65 or over, the three percent rule is waived only for the expense of the parent.

Home Building Supposed to Jump; It's Sagging Instead

NEW YORK, Oct. 20 (AP)—An offer by the Federal Reserve to buy government securities is expected to help the economy in the coming year, but home building has been expected to pick up under the stimulus of the credit expansion. Instead, it is sagging sharply.

Picking up housing was supposed to be the economy's main job in the coming year, but a dollar and a half increase in the price of lumber has proved a hindrance to the industry.

Builders say the slowdown actually reported is a 17 per cent slump in September from August—in contrast to the month's 10 per cent increase in August.

Other business activities also have proved blighted of late.

They announce good sales of their houses and say it's because they're giving the public the volume it craves. Defining what the public wants is hard. Each builder usually says it's what is offering.

Announcement of the housing decline—this September was off 28 per cent from a year ago and the total started so far this year is 19 per cent below the first nine months of 1937—covers an unfortunate time psychologically.

It coincides with, and adds to, uneasiness due to reports that the food dollar volume of output of goods and services in the nation has dropped below the record \$10 billion dollar annual peak set in the April-June quarter.

It casts doubt that this granddaddy of the statistics can climb enough in the final three months of the year to make the \$10 billion dollar total which Washington officials were still hoping for only a few weeks ago.

Housing's failure to give the economy the expected push follows hard on reports that industrial output in September was at a 10-month low, that retail sales slipped that month instead of rising on a seasonal pattern; that a hard core of jobless persons in the manufacturing industries; that wages and salary payments have fallen although total personal income has hit a high; that profits continue to slip for many companies; that American exports haven't risen enough to offset a drain on our gold and dollars; that businessmen are cutting back a bit on spending for plants and equipment, and particularly on inventories.

Against these unfavorable aspects of the economy the administration has moved on several fronts.

The money managers have made credit more available and interest rates lower. So far this has had little effect on either home buying or business borrowing.

Consumer credit has slowed its long, steep climb.

The federal government has stepped up slightly its ordering for defense and release of funds for highway building.

It has taken general steps to encourage a greater flow of exports and urged other lands to lower further their postwar barriers against American goods.

In the expensive category are basic cucumbers, green peas and western russet potatoes.
Among fruits the best bargains are California McIntosh apples, bananas and Tokyo grapes.

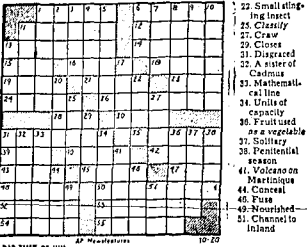

"Spacearium" Is Planned at Seattle Event

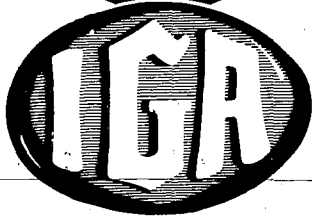

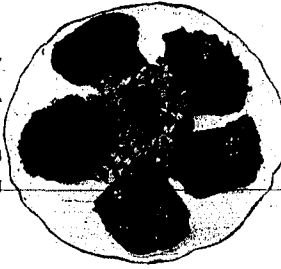

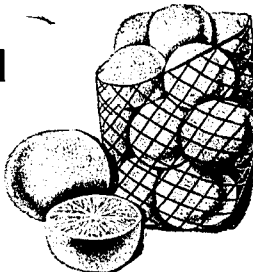
