The victim was driving a 1958 Buick for Magic Valley bound to 36, three less than last year. The seventh fatality occurred Thursday when Mrs. Emma Wagoner, 47, Buhl, was killed when she apparently lost control of her car on Highway 21.

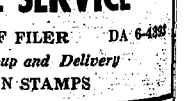

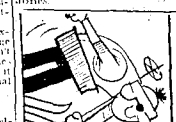

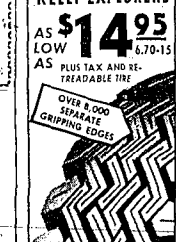

Qualified Teacher Shortage Hurting Small School Areas

BOISE, Oct. 21 (AP)—The smaller school districts in Idaho are suffering from a critical shortage of qualified teachers again this year.

Public Instruction Suppl. D. F. Eichelberg said today.

Nearly one-fourth of the teachers in the state's public schools are operating on provisional or "sub-standard" certificates. More than 20, he said, cannot even meet teaching qualifications under Idaho law.

Unless something is done to boost salary scales, he said, the situation is going to get worse and the children in Idaho are going to wind up with a sub-standard education.

At present, he said, there are about 6,000 teachers employed in Idaho's public elementary and secondary schools. More than 1,500 of these are operating on "sub-standard" certificates.

Last year, he added, there were about 70 teachers in the state who did not have any type of certification. Every indication points to the fact there will be that many and more this year, he said.

Of course, those hired by law but who did not have somebody in the classrooms," he said.

The average salary paid public school teachers in Idaho is \$4,200 a year, Eichelberg said. Paid out over a 12-month period this averages out to \$357.50 per month, he said.

NO CAUSE TO PANIC
The public shock that follows a serious plane crash is thoroughly understandable...

Yet while it is normal that emotion should run high, there is no reason it should run riot in response to a fatal accident...

Charges were hurled which appeared to add up almost to 'criminal irresponsibility' on the part of everyone from federal aviation inspectors to the airlines...

Mistaking statements and observations about the Electra did not help. Widely noted the fact that the Boston mishap was 'one of five' Electra accidents.

But what are the facts? The first Electra crash, in New York's East River, involved a faulty reading of the plane's altimeter and no warning whatsoever as to its structure or function...

Texas Voters Favor Nixon

PORT WORTH, Tex., Oct. 21.—The Post Worth Star-Telegram reported yesterday that Tarrant county, Fort Worth's city limits, was holding its absentee voting Nov. 8 in a general election, showed a 76-22 preference for the Republican party ticket of Richard M. Nixon and Henry Cabot Lodge.

That was the result of the Star-Telegram poll of the 136 voters who appeared at the county clerk's office to mark absentee ballots. The poll will be taken daily until Monday of absentee voting Nov. 8.

In nearby Dallas, the Dallas News interviewed 50 who voted absentee and showed the Democrats leading 31-9.

The absentee vote in 1956 in Tarrant county went Democratic 1,224; Republican 5,000; and others 21.

In 1952, Eisenhower carried 63,681 votes in the general election and Adlai E. Stevenson, the Democratic party presidential candidate, received 45,072 in Tarrant county.

Third Quarter Decline Noted For Gross National Product

WASHINGTON, Oct. 21.—(AP)—National economy was running a dip of two billion dollars in the third quarter, a decline from the annual rate of the nation's gross national product was reported yesterday.

There was a dip of 65 billion dollars in the gross economic rate for the April-June period, compared with the April-June period of 1949, largely attributed to the steel strike.

The joint congressional economic committee said the total of the nation's goods and services in the third quarter of this year ran at an annual rate of 303 billion dollars compared with 305 billion dollars in the second quarter.

Even so, the national income was estimated at a rate of 301 billion dollars, down slightly from the 303 billion dollars and consumer

dollars for the March-June period but net farm income was estimated at 11.9 billion dollars, up slightly from the 11.8 billion dollars for the second quarter. Corporate dividends were rated at 14 billion dollars for the quarter, up slightly from the 13.9 billion dollars for the March-June period.

The new estimates attracted wide attention because of charges and denials in the current national promotional campaign that the nation may be heading into a recession or "leveling-off" period.

Slight declines in consumer spending and private investment by business were mostly offset in the July-September period by increased government outlays.
