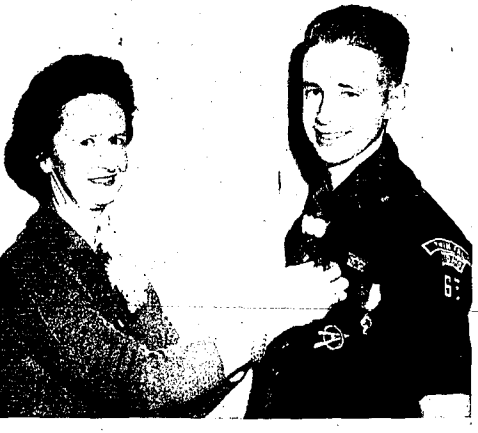

**CITY OF ACUNA, Mexico, Oct. 24**—President Eisenhower and Lopez Mateos met yesterday afternoon here for a friendly exchange of views on the impact of their meeting on the U. S. side.

### Japanese Set Nov. 20 Date For Election

TOKYO, Oct. 23 (AP)—The Japanese will vote for a new house of representatives on Nov. 20 in an election which their conservative government considers a referendum on neutrality and U. S.-Japan relations. The old house was dissolved yesterday.

A receipt from Emperor Hirohito disbanded the 445-seat chamber while the opposition Socialist party and other left-wing elements pushed efforts to move Japan closer to the communist camp and break ties with the western democracies.

Prime Minister Hatake Ickeda said he is confident the people will return his conservative Liberal-Democratic party to power. The party held 233 seats in the old house and hopes to expand its majority.

Items appeared before a national television audience with a 20-minute broadcast. Leaders of the two major opposition parties, to discuss issues that will be debated in the campaign officially opening next Sunday.

The election will be Japan's eighth since World War II and the first since the tough but self-spoken Ickeda, 63, was named prime minister last July. The last previous house election was held May 22, 1948.
