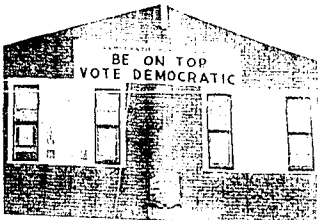

Service Held For Students In Air Crash

SEAN LUIS OBISPO, Calif., Oct. 31.—Thousands of Californians bowed their heads at memorial services today for 16 members of a private football team who died in a crashing Olympic plane crash.

The solemn memorial services were held at the strikingly modern gymnasium.

The crash Saturday night killed 22 and injured 26. All but five of the dead were from the California state football team who died in a crashing Olympic plane crash.

There were eight married students on the trip. Five of them were killed, including a father of four and star basketball Garry Van Housen, whose wife is expecting her second child.

Most of the dead perished in the twisted burned wreckage of the chartered aircraft which was scattered over the roof of a runway at the Toledo airport. The team was returning to California after losing 69 to 6 to Bowling Green.

Meteor Bits May Be Left? In Sawtooths

RENO, Ore., Oct. 31.—A meteorite that crashed across Oregon and was visible in Washington on its westward journey Oct. 29, may have left bits of itself in Idaho's Sawtooth mountains or nearby Big Losty, Phil F. Boston said today.

Boston, Pacific Northwest director for the American Meteor Society, said scores of observers in the three states have reported that made it possible to chart the fireball's course.

He said it rained through the night because a shower of sparks that became a distinct trail led to a place to check an estimated distance of 60 miles, Boston said.

Reports on the fireball came from Portland and Roshar in western Oregon. From several points in central Oregon, from northern forest-covered lookouts and from air force fighter pilots flying at 20,000 feet over Moses Lake, Wash.

Bomarc Builder Is Success at Losing Weight and Guiding Missile Program

OGDEN, Oct. 31.—One of the most successful industrial programs in the world is being run by a man who is losing weight and guiding a missile program.

It was an obvious decision: He weighed 200 pounds, was known to the most prestigious national his production and a most unlikely-looking producer of the Meteor-quester stock market.

With the same zeal that made him a leader in an export promotion, Tom Tasker tackled the problem of his monumental weight.

In 14 months he shed an incredible 112 pounds and today stands at 82 lbs. of 6 feet 2 inches, a figure far in excess of most men and women already aware by his mental dimensions.

But while the diet reduced the burden on his feet, it did nothing for the weight he shouldered as manager of a \$20-million defense plant.

The Bomarc, named for the designer, the name of the missile, and the name of the company, which makes the frame, and the Michigan area research center, an early launch designer, is intended to do only one thing—shoot down manned enemy bombers.

To some planners, the manned bomber is a passe threat. There were fears at Ogdén last spring that Congress would approve the \$44 million dollars required for Bomarc, that the program would go the way of the money whip.

To combat the gloom invading his plant, Tom Tasker ordered frequent rallies and predicted Bomarc would stay "when the truth is known."

For him, the truth came from Louis G. Thomas White, assistant chief of staff, who told the senate "in my opinion, the manned bomber will never threat for another decade."

Enough money has been allocated to keep the program going through the third quarter of 1962. After that, Marquardt and Tasker will have to explore other things to produce eventually, perhaps launch systems for 2,000-mile-per-hour jetters or nuclear ramjets for hypersonic vehicles capable of circling the earth indefinitely.

Marquardt is already working on both.

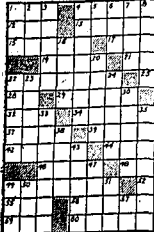

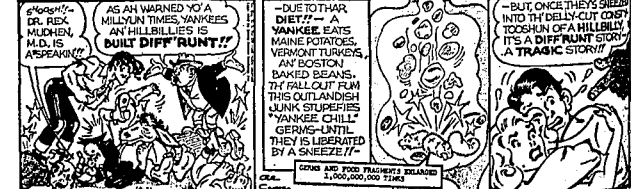
